Living in a Facility



Can I receive AISH while residing in a facility?

Yes, AISH provides a monthly modified living allowance consisting of a maximum personal allowance of \$315, plus an accommodation rate, to assist clients living in a facility.

What type of accommodation is considered a facility?

- Nursing homes as defined in the Nursing Homes Act.
- Hospitals or auxiliary hospitals as defined in the *Hospitals Act* and not designated as a facility under the *Mental Health Regulation*.
- A facility or part of facilities approved by AISH as a designated assisted living unit (DAL).
- Residential facilities that are approved by AISH in exceptional circumstances when an applicant or client has unique care needs.

How does AISH determine the amount for accommodation?

AISH uses the rates outlined in the *Nursing Home Operation Regulation* of the *Nursing Homes Act* to set the amounts that can be provided as an accommodation rate.

There are two types of accommodation rates provided based on what type of facility the client lives in: a private rate or a standard rate.

Private Rate

Monthly rate of \$1,700 (daily rate of \$55.90) effective February 1, 2011. The private room rate is issued to clients who reside in:

- Nursing homes;
- Auxiliary or active treatment hospitals (when a daily rate is charged); or
- · Approved DAL facilities.

Standard Rate

Monthly rate of \$1,395 (daily rate of \$45.85) effective February 1, 2011. The standard room rate is issued to clients who reside in approved DAL spaces in lodges that receive funding from the Lodge Assistance Program.
