ecent years have been dynamic ones for Yaddo and 2010 was certainly no exception, but, as the above sentiments express, there is continuity in the timeless and uniquely supportive nature of the artists' relation to Yaddo.

A year of challenges and changes, 2010 began with a daunting fundraising climate in the midst of a sputtering economy. This led the Board to adopt something of an austerity budget. Austere, that is, in all respects except the steady funding of our direct program expenses in support of the artists' residence experience. The year ended as we crossed the finish line in meeting our fundraising goals thanks in no small part to a set of extraordinary challenge grants supported by certain members of the Board. In addition, our endowment has begun to rebound with the improving investment environment.

The year itself saw us fully settling into newly refurbished offices both in Saratoga and in New York City, the latter office being under the leadership of Steve Dennin, who now has a year under his belt as our Director of Development.

There are also a number of changes in our Director ranks and in committee responsibilities. Member Patty Volk stepped up to the Board of Directors after Yaddo Vice-Chair and Director Pat Towers, honoring her commitment to term limits, relinquished her Board positions and was replaced as Vice-Chair by Director Peter Kayafas. I am pleased to report, however, that Pat is continuing as Chair of our all important Membership and Nominations Committee. The Board's Executive Committee added Jaime Wolf, in Pat's stead, as well as A.M. Homes.

Other important committee chair appointments consisted of James Siena (Admissions) replacing Peter Cameron and Mary-Beth Hughes joined Dick Howe as Co-Chair of the Development Committee, replacing Jonathan Santlofer, who is stepping down after nearly 10 years as a Development Committee leader. A hearty and sincere thank you to all these Yaddo stalwarts for past service and herewith an expression of the certain knowledge that with our new

appointments Yaddo will continue to be in talented, dedicated and loving hands.

I would be remiss should I not note the recent passing of renowned Yaddo Members Louise Bourgeois and, even more recently, Romulus Linney, and we express our appreciation to them for giving their support and energy to Yaddo. Yet we are sustained by recognition of newly-appointed Lifetime Members, Nancy Lampton, Gardner McFall, Geoffrey Movius and Jill Viney.

As you can see, we have had many "sunrise, sunset" moments in Yaddo's storied history but that, of course, is because not only have we had the good fortune in fact to enjoy many sunrises and sunsets over the last century in Yaddo's efforts to provide the opportunity for creativity to artist residents, but we have also been blessed with stewards - such as our extraordinarily talented President, Elaina Richardson, and her most able staff, who bring that opportunity to dramatic fruition each and every day. Long may it be so!

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



As Yaddo's Chairman, Peter Gould, points out in his companion Report, we accomplished much in 2010, but all of it against a backdrop of concern about the financial markets and the significant drop we had seen in our endowment. We held the number of artists and writers we welcomed to be

in residence steady at 224, we spent hours each day thinking about what was best and what was necessary for Yaddo to thrive, and we continued the practices of good governance as we thanked Pat Towers, who is so central to Yaddo, for her years of service as Vice-Chair. We realized that Yaddo remains, as it has been in the past, "lucky" in its leaders: certainly fortunate to have photographer and publisher Peter Kayafas in our ranks and willing to take on the responsibilities of Vice-Chair. The smooth and celebratory transition from Pat to Peter came to represent for me a sort of symbolic touchstone for 2010: in the midst of unsought for change, there was a silver lining. In the larger context of Yaddo's present and future, the silver lining of forced re-evaluation lay in the opportunity to put everything on the table, to rethink long-established practices, to re-imagine future goals, and to recommit ourselves to the simplicity and strength of Yaddo's core mission of support for individual artists. We decided, consciously and with an upbeat pace, to think harder about Yaddo's role in the 21st century, and our articulation of that role. We set out, as Peter Kayafas put it, "to take our own temperature."

As we all know, figuring out how an eco-system is faring requires as a first step the establishment of some baseline readings. As we also know, it can be really difficult to assess the health of the pond you're furiously paddling in. A recent analysis from Americans for the Arts provides some context: its 2010 National Arts Index showed a fall since the onset of the recession of 6.2 points, reaching a 12-year low, which has consequences, of course, for the vitality of the arts sector, as confirmed by the fact that some 41 percent of non-profit arts groups failed to achieve a balanced budget. Happily, Yaddo, despite the dip in endowment, remains fiscally strong and we have consistently balanced our budget in each and every year. Nonetheless, we felt the chill in the air. And so Yaddo engaged the services of AEA Associates, a leading arts consulting firm, to work with us - starting in 2010 and continuing through 2011 - on a Strategic Plan, the first in the institution's history. The plan requires us to drill down into several key areas: our mission and program; governance; stewardship of our assets and generous supporters; and our public persona (okay, let's go ahead and just say it, our "brand"). As someone who can resist the necessity of self-reflection, I am happy to report that the process of working with Adrian and Libby Ellis has been energizing and fruitful. More importantly, we seem on course to move into 2011 and beyond with a steadiness and certainty of tread.

Along the way, there were several standout moments in 2010. We quite literally "turned the lights on" at Yaddo, completing the first phase of an outdoor lighting project (generously supported, in part, by NYSCA and several of our artists) which increases the safety and maneuverability of our resident guest artists, especially in the long winter months, when the sun rises late and sets early. We successfully hosted our usual annual benefits, one in New York City (brilliantly chaired by Patricia Volk with an astounding performance by the multi-talented Jonathan Ames)

and one in Saratoga (steered superbly, with virtually no overhead, by Tamie Ehinger, Claudia Olsen, and Anne Palamountain, with Rick Moody as the immensely popular guest of honor). Each evening was terrifically enjoyable - as you can see from the photo-roundups that appear later in this report-- and more than held its own given the realities of the economy. At the September Annual Meeting, here in Saratoga Springs, we dedicated the weekend to an exploration of areas that we knew would be of importance to our strategic planning. The sessions were engaging and useful resulting in a series of recommendations that our committees are working to implement - and I am thankful to all of the Members and staff who participated for their inspired thinking and long hours on Yaddo's behalf. The September meeting also saw the election of a roster of extremely talented new committee chairs and I am delighted to add my welcome to all of them and to join Peter in saluting the exceptionally able and devoted Members who were just elected to Lifetime status. Given the tightly-knit nature of our community and the many ties that we share, it is always difficult to say goodbye to any of our Members, and last year saw the passing of two of our brightest luminaries - Louise Bourgeois and Romulus Linney. I share Peter's sense of gratitude to Romulus and Louise, and sorrow at their deaths.

It was certainly true that, on the program side, Yaddo shone brightly in 2010.

As reported above, we welcomed 224 guest artists. They came to Yaddo from 25 states and the District of Columbia, in addition to several foreign countries, including Canada, France, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Iran, Italy, Norway, Switzerland, Tanzania, Tunisia, and the United Kingdom. We received a total of 1,126 applications

from choreographers, composers, filmmakers, painters, performance artists, photographers, printmakers, sculptors, video artists, and writers, working both alone and collaboratively in teams of up to three. Nearly half were guests at Yaddo for the first time and the artists ranged in age from early-20s to late-80s. On the advice of our Admissions Committee, we implemented various new policies, including a move to an online-only application process, allowing applicants to submit their work samples via a site called SlideRoom. With the shrewd guidance of our Adhoc Committee on Diversity, we also renewed our commitment to outreach to guarantee the vitality of our admissions process. These efforts paid off handsomely in a lively and talented group of artists in residence throughout the year. Our five Admissions Panels once again did an outstanding job reviewing applicants, and I am indebted to the Chair of each and to the artists who generously agreed to help us with this essential task. Despite a noticeable spike in applications and the gradual increase in guests over the decades, we are still, as the Trasks mandated, "few in number," and the Yaddo magic continues to have a transforming impact, as was evident from the large number of artists who last year testified in letters, dedications, and interviews to the staggering impact time at Yaddo had on their output and creativity.

As always, the residency program was first and foremost in our thoughts, and we did all that we could to minimize interruptions caused by necessary construction and to ensure that we accepted the same number of artists on an annual basis – I thank all of my colleagues for their assistance throughout the year. Clearly, little of this activity would be possible without the support of a talented and engaged board, and it is one

of Yaddo's great blessings to have in its Members and Directors such a staunch group of committed, intelligent, and passionate folks. As we move steadily into the future, it's fitting to take a moment to acknowledge the strong base we build upon, and so I thank our remarkable Chair, Peter Gould, our inspiring outgoing Vice-Chair, Pat Towers (who is the reason, incidentally, that I came to Yaddo), and our thoughtful, eloquent new Vice-Chair, Peter Kayafas for their support and commitment to this place we all care for so deeply. And I also thank the dedicated Members and Directors of the Corporation and Yaddo's generous community of supporters for once more promoting a deeper understanding of the value of solitude and



community, of time and space, and – most important of all – the value of supporting the work of individual artists if we are to have a vibrant and engaged cultural life.

YADDO ARTISTS

Yaddo welcomed 224 talented individuals in 2010 for stays ranging from two weeks to two months. The guest list included 115 writers, 55 visual artists, 22 composers, 15 performance and media artists, and 17 artists working in film and video. They came to Yaddo from 25 states and the District of Columbia, as well as Canada, France, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Iran, Italy, Norway, Switzerland, Tanzania, Tunisia, and the United Kingdom. In 2010, Yaddo received a total of 1,126 applications from an international pool of choreographers, composers, filmmakers, painters, performance artists, photographers, printmakers, sculptors, video artists, and writers, working both alone and collaboratively.



YADDO 2010 CONTRIBUTORS

In early fall, several of the Directors of The Corporation of Yaddo issued a challenge to encourage individual donors, including many artists who are former residents, to renew and increase their annual contribution. As a result, Yaddo exceeded its financial goals and ended 2010 well positioned to build on this success in the new year. Yaddo is pleased to recognize all of the individuals, foundations, corporations, and government agencies that helped to make this achievement possible. We wish to acknowledge the Board of Directors, and in particular those who participated in the challenge, and the Members for their continued generosity and leadership. Gratitude is also extended to our friends and neighbors in the Saratoga Springs-Albany community, which remains an important source of support and encouragement.

Yaddo raised over \$956,000 in 2010 to help underwrite operating expenses, including restricted grants to support individual residencies. These funds are supplemented by a withdrawal of no more than 5 percent per annum (based on a three-year rolling average) from the endowment, which happily closed the year at \$26 million, up from \$24 million the previous December.

Through their work, individual artists help us see the world more clearly. Yaddo salutes and thanks all of those who share our belief in the power and importance of the creative process and its capacity to entertain, inspire and enlighten millions through the written word, the visual arts, dance, music and performance.


