

LONG SLEEVED BABY JACKET

IN THREE SIZES



This tiny jacket is an interpretation of an original Elizabeth Zimmerman design. It is knitted in one piece, in garter stitch and only has two seams, each running from the cuff along the top of the sleeve to the shoulder-neck point.

The shape you end up with looks very odd before stitching, so have faith and enjoy.

sizes

the smallest jacket (**blue numbers**) will fit a baby doll 4 cms (1 5/8") long,
the medium jacket (**pink numbers**) will fit the Heidi Ott baby 5 cms (2") long,
the large size jacket (**green numbers**) will fit a toddler doll 8 cms (3") tall,

materials

middle and **small** sizes:

a pair of size 21 (0.8 mm) needles,
and a small amount of DMC special dentelles, cotton 80's

larger size:

a pair of size 18, (1.25 mm, 4/0) needles,
and a small amount of Madeira 'Lana' wool/acrylic mix

tension

using size 21 needles and cotton 80's over g.st
9sts and 18 rows measure 1 cm (3/8ins)

using size 18 needles and Lana over g. st.
7sts and 14 rows measure 1cm (3/8ins)

abbreviations

sl2tog-k1-p2sso: insert the needle point into 2sts as if to k them tog, but instead slip them both onto the RH needle, k the next st, and pass the 2 slipped sts over and off.

m1: pick up the running thread from previous row and knit into the back of it, to make one new stitch

Cast on (50, 58, 60) sts.

1 st row: k(10, 11 , 11), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(24 , 30 ,32), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(10, 11 , 11)

2 nd , 4 th , rows: k to end,

3 rd row: k(9 , 10 , 10), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(22 , 28 , 30), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(9 , 10 , 10),

5 th row: k(8 , 9 , 9), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(20 , k26 , 28), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(8 , 9 , 9),

inc for cuff as folls,

6 th row: k(2 , 3 , 3), [m1, k2] 3 times, k(24 , 30 , 32), [m1, k2] twice, m1, k(2 , 3 , 3),

7 th row: k(10 , 11 , 11), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(18 , 24 ,26), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(10 , 11 , 11),

8 th row: k to end,

9 th row: k(9 , 10 , 10), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(16 , 22 , 24), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(9 , 10 , 10),

10 th row: k to end

11 th row: k(8 , 9 , 9), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(14 , 20 , 22), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(8 , 9 , 9),

12 th row: k to end

13 th row: k(7 , 8 , 8), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(12 , 18 , 20), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(7 , 8 , 8),

k(5, 1 , 1) rows straight

* * the two largest sizes only

next row: k(7 , 7), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(16 , 18), sl2tog-k1-p2sso, k(7 , 7),

next 3 rows: k to end,

next row: k(7 , 7), m1, k1, m1, k(16 , 18), m1, k1, m1, k(7 , 7),

next row: k to end,

* * * all sizes

next row: k(7 , 8 , 8), m1, k1, m1, k(12 , 18 , 20), m1, k1, m1, k(7 , 8 , 8)

next row: k to end

next row: k(8 , 9 , 9), m1, k1, m1, k(14 , 20 , 22), m1, k1, m1, k(8 , 9 , 9)

inc across centre back as folls

next row: k(10 , 16 , 13), m1, [k4, m1] (4 , 3 , 5) times, k(10 , 16 , 13),

next row: k(9 , 10 , 10), m1, k1, m1, k(21 , 26 , 30), m1, k1, m1, k(9 , 10 , 10),

* * the 2 larger sizes only

next row: k to end

next row: k(11 , 11), m1, k1, m1, k(28 , 32) m1, k1, m1, k(11 , 11)

* * * all sizes

next row: cast off (2 , 3 , 3) sts, then k to end,

next row: cast off (2 , 3 , 3) sts, k the next (8 , 8 , 8), m1, k1, m1, k(21 , 30 , 34), m1, k1, m1, k(9 , 9 , 9),

next row: k(35 , 44 , 48), turn, leave rem sts in hold,

next row: k(25 , 34 , 38), turn,

k(2 , 2 , 4) rows without shaping across the (25 , 34 , 38), central sts only, then turn,

next row: k the (25 , 34 , 38) sts, then pick up and k(2 , 2 , 3) sts along the side edge of the piece just knitted, then k the rem 10sts,

next row: k(12 , 12 , 13), m1, k1, m1,

k(23 , 32 , 36), m1, k1, m1, pick up an k(2 , 2 , 3) sts from the edge of the central section, then k to end, you should now have (53 , 62 , 68) sts

next row: k to end,

next row: k(13 , 13 , 14), m1, k1, m1,

k(25 , 34 , 38), m1, k1, m1, k(13 , 13 , 14),

next row: k to end

work buttonholes for a boy

next row: k2, [yfwd, k2tog, k2] twice, k(4 , 4 , 7), m1, k1, m1, k(27 , 36 , 40), m1, k1, m1, k(14 , 14 , 15),

cast off purlwise

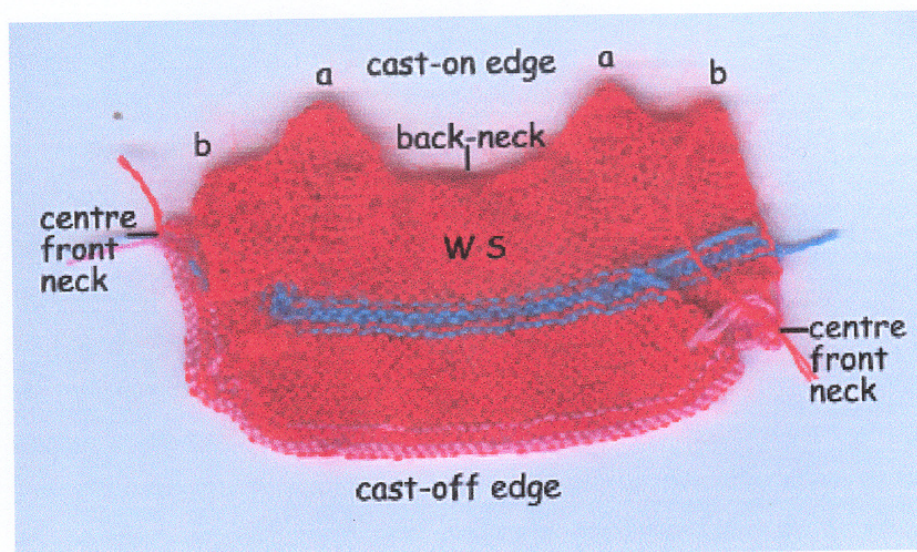
work buttonholes for a girl

next row: k(14 , 14 , 15), m1, k1, m1,

k(27 , 36 , 40), m1, k1, m1, k(6 , 6 , 7), k2tog, yfwd, k2, k2tog, yfwd, k2,

cast off purlwise

TO MAKE UP



- Place the finished knitting wrong side, up, with the cast-on edge at the top.
- The section between point 'a' and point 'b' will be the sleeve cuff.
- Travel down the edge from point b, and find the 2 or 3 cast-off sts.
- These stitches will be the side edge of the front neck.

- Go back to point b.
- Fold up point b to meet point a, so that the side edge lies along the cast-on edge to form the shoulder.
- Pin along the shoulder.
- The cut-out bit will become the L front neck.
- The cast-off edge will go down the centre front.
- Repeat for the other shoulder.
- Make sure that you have left enough room for the centre back neck, before stitching the shoulder seams.
