**I. CHRONOLOGY:**

**24 September 2011** - The Tropical Storm (TS) located 1,030km East Northeast of Virac, Catanduanes entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "PEDRING"

**25 September 2011** - TS "Pedring" intensified further; moved slightly faster to the West as it continued to move towards Isabela-Aurora area

**26 September 2011** - Maintained its course and strength as it moved closer to the Isabela-Aurora area; intensified into a Typhoon; and continued to threaten Isabela-Aurora area

**27 September 2011** - Typhoon "PEDRING" made landfall over the boundary of Aurora and Isabela and weakened as it crossed the rugged terrain of the Sierra Madre Mountain Range

**28 September 2011** - Moved West Northwest affecting Western Luzon and moved out from the country

**II. EFFECTS OF TROPICAL STORM PEDRING:**

**A. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB A)**

Total number of population affected in **1,567 barangays / 202 municipalities / 35 cities** in the **33** provinces of Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, CAR and NCR is: **205,885 families / 986,417 persons.**

Total number of population currently served inside and outside evacuation centers is **44,139 families / 204,376 persons.**

### E. STATUS OF LIFELINES:

#### 1. ROADS AND BRIDGES CONDITION (TAB E)

A total of **52 bridge/road sections** were reported impassable in Regions II (**20**), Region III (**14**), Region IV-B (**2**) and CAR (16)

#### 2. POWER INTERRUPTIONS

##### National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP)

**As of 29 September 2011 5:00 PM, a small NGCP line segment that remains de-energized is the Solano-Lagawe 69-KV portion of the Bayombong-Lagawe 69-KV Line. The affected customers/areas are IFELCO/Ifugao and the restoration is ongoing.**

**The Bongabon Substation connected to Cabanatuan – Talavera – Munoz - Pantabangan 69-KV line is also isolated. The affected customers/areas are NEECO 2-Area 2 and AURELCO/Nueva Ecija and the restoration works will continue as soon as the flooding in the area has subsided.**

##### MERALCO Power Situation Update

As of **29 September 2011**, all Meralco Distribution Circuits have been restored. Of the 4.9 million customers served, **51,500** customers remain without power due to isolated segments and lateral portion of the lines.

### F. STATUS OF DAMS (As of 10:00 PM, 29 September 2011)

The following dams opened their respective gates as the water levels have reached their spilling levels: **Ipo (3 Gates / 3.8 m); Angat (3 gates / 3 m); Ambuklao (2 Gates / 2 m); Binga (5 Gates / 3 m); Magat (7 Gates / 7 m); and San Roque (1 Gate / 0.5 m).**

## II. EMERGENCY RESPONSE MANAGEMENT

### NDRRMC Response Efforts

The NDRRMC convened at around 10:00 AM of 27 September 2011 that was presided over by the SND and Chairperson, NDRRMC attended by all Member-agencies. The Executive Secretary instructed the NDRRMC member agencies to expedite relief and recovery efforts as well as the rehabilitation of the damages to properties incurred from Typhoon "Pedring".

Another NDRRMC Meeting was held at 4:00 PM (27 September 2011) to further discuss the effects of Typhoon "Pedring" and the appropriate actions to be undertaken by each member agencies.

The following agencies initiated the following relief and rescue responses:

- a. **Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)** through DSWD-FO II prepositioned food and non-food items (NFIs) for allocation in five (5) provinces namely, Cagayan, Quirino, Nueva Vizcaya, Batanes, Isabela. Breakdown is as follows:

**DSWD Central Office** released on Sept 28,2011 an additional PHP 2,000,000.00 to FO III and PHP 500,000.00 to FO I for purchase of relief commodities for augmentation assistance to flood affected families by Typhoon “Pedring”.

**DSWD IV-B** prepositioned 1,110 family packs amounting to PhP275,000.00 (300 packs for Oriental Mindoro, 300 packs for Marinduque and 500 packs for Occidental Mindoro).

**DSWD V** prepositioned standby funds worth PhP500,000.00 for the purchase of canned goods; prepositioned relief goods in Camarines Norte; facilitated the release of 2,000 sacks of rice to PDRRMC Camarines Sur; released 500 boxes of sardines to PDRRMC Albay; maintained standard volume of stockpile ready to augment the needs of LGUs; SWAD team continued to coordinate with P/C/MDRRMCs for the conduct of rapid damage and needs assessment.

**PSWDO Albay** provided 2 days supply of rice to the displaced families at 10kgs / family.

**DSWD CAR** provides funds for the affected families for the purchase of emergency relief goods in the form of family packs, electric generator and water jugs which will be transported to Ifugao.

- b. **Department of Health (DOH)** released logistics (drugs and medicines) worth **PhP1,614,331.29** as augmentation support to the CHDs in Regions I, II, III, V, CAR and MM and were distributed in respective provinces; placed on standby medical teams in all CHDs concerned; CHDs Metro Manila, V and IV-A activated their Surveillance in Post Extreme Emergency and Disaster (SPEED) program; and continuously coordinates with Provincial Health Office and RDRRMCs concerned.
- c. **Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP)** dispatched SAR assets to the flooded areas in Metro Manila: 341 manpower (30 Officers and 311 enlisted personnel); vehicles (2 vans, 5 M35 trucks and 1KM4500); equipment (6 rubber boats, communication equipment, 3 assorted DRO equipment, 4 water Limbouy, 40 life jackets, 4 life rafts, 72 life vests, 20 life bouys and 3 assorted DRO equipment; and 1 Fiberglass boat. Six hundred (600) residents were evacuated /rescued from 5 barangays in Marikina City and Tondo Manila and were evacuated to 4 evacuation centers; **703<sup>rd</sup>** Brigade, 7ID, PA, AFP assisted RDRRMC-3 in the conduct of SAR operations in various flooded areas in the region;

assisted in the evacuation of 15 families to Central Elem. School in Dagupan; conducted rescue operations in the flooded areas of Brgy. Alaska, Aringay..

- d. **Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)** assisted the Rizal DRRMC in evacuating 220 families / 874 persons from Rodriguez; San Mateo Rizal and Taytay Rizal Province. **Bato Fire Station** in Camarines Sur dispatched BFP rescuers and conducted SAR operations at Bato Lake for the fishermen declared missing for 2 days. **BFP Rescuers** in coordination with LGU Bato and PAF personnel was able to rescue Restituto Bandalas y Rafanan, 70 years old. **BFP IV-A** assisted in the conduct of pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and near mountain slopes.

- e. **Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)**

**DPWH Central Office** directed all its District Engineering maintenance crew to conduct immediate clearing operations at the landslide-stricken areas and immediate repair of damaged roads and bridges in all affected areas.

**DPWH CAR** facilitated massive clearing operations and assured that all major roads will be opened by 29 September 2011.

**DPWH III** installed warning signs to the eroded shoulder and collapsed retaining wall along Brgy Piut, Carrangalan, Nueva Ecija..

- f. **Department of Education (DepEd)**

Ninety six (96) schools (39 in NCR, 3 in CAR, 1 in Region I, 8 in Region II, 4 in Region III, 5 in Region IV-A, 36 in Region V) in 18 Divisions are being utilized as evacuation centers with 7,571 families / 25,863 individuals.

- g. **Philippine National Police (PNP)** deployed Reserve SAR Assets; supported other government agencies in actual conduct of search and rescue operations in affected areas; provided police visibility and security in affected areas and evacuation centers; assisted in the clearing of highways and major thoroughfares; and supported other government agencies in rehabilitation and recovery efforts.

**NHQ NDOC** assigned 1 PSI and 2 PO1 at PNP-NOC from 0800 to 0800 the following day (September 28-29, 2011).

**PRO 1** conducted clearing operations along the national highway of Aringay, Agoo and Caba of La Union Province and WASAR teams of Pangasinan Provincial Police conducted evacuation operations in Dagupan City, Binmaley and Calasiao, Pangasinan; conducted pre-evacuation of residents at Pasungol, Santa IS affected by the storm surge; Sual PNP immediately investigated the fatality in Brgy Sioasio East, Sual, Pangasinan.

**PRO 2** dispatched three (3) rescue teams with 5 rubber boats with/ without outboard motor to rescue isolated residents in Brgy. Rancho, Angandanan and Brgy. Mabuhay, Echague all in Isabela; dispatched light trucks to Brgys Marana 1st and 2<sup>nd</sup> in Ilagan, Isabela; tapped SAR teams from PCG, TOG2 and PAF to assist in the rescue operations. Four SAR teams from the RPSB 2 are enroute to IPPO to reinforce the rescue operations. The teams conducted clearing operations along Maharlika Highway and other major thoroughfares in Santiago City, Nueva Vizcaya and Quirino. **In total, they have deployed 16 rubber boats, 156 vehicles, and 563 SAR teams.**

**PRO 3** proceeded to Cabanatuan City for the conduct of rescue and relief operations, bringing with them a Canter truck with 2 motorboats.

**Rizal Police Provincial Office** PS/INSP Aristone Dogwe led the rescue team with rubber boat augmented the SAR operations in San Mateo and Rodriguez, Rizal.

- h. **MERALCO**

The Senior Vice President and Head of Customer Retail Services and Corporate Communications Alfredo S. Panlilio said that Meralco service crews will continue to work round-the-clock until power to the last circuit affected by Typhoon "Pedring" has been

restored; further assures that person are doing their best to be able to restore power the soonest possible time and advised affected customers to get in touch with Company's Call Center at Tel. No. 16211 for queries regarding the status of restoration work in their respective areas

**i. Philippine Coast Guard (PCG)**

**PCG** dispatched today 2 vehicles, 3 rubber boats and 26 rescuers to Nueva Ecija for SAR operations and conducted initial reconnaissance in Region III. **Another teams were dispatched composed of the following: 42 PCG personnel, two (2) 6x6 Army trucks and 2 rubber boats while the SAR teams deployed were the following: 2 teams with 2 rubber boats and 1 PCG Bus (Cabanatuan, Nueva Ecija); 2 teams /2 rubber boats, 1 PCG Bus and 1 Boom Truck (Isabela Province); 2 teams with 2 rubber boats (Lupao, Nueva Ecija; and 2 teams with 4 rubber boats and 1 boom truck (Bagong Silang, Nueva Ecija).**

**j. Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)**

LGUs in 5 provinces in Region II and affected cities and municipalities in NCR are now conducting damage and needs assessment, deployment of manpower with SAR equipment for the conduct of SAR operations and clearing operations at the landslide areas / flood stricken-areas, evacuation of families to safe areas, and provision of relief services.

**k. Philippine Information Agency (PIA)**

Continuously disseminates all news reports from NDRRMC to all PIA Regional/Provincial Offices nationwide and media organizations for further dissemination to the general public

**l. Department of Trade and Industry (DTI)**

**DTI Region I** conducted inventory of supply of basic commodities in to ensure stable prices of basic commodities.

**m. Donations**

**San Miguel Corporation** donated 1,700 cases of bottled water (Pure Water 355 ML. PET Pineapple 355 ML and PET Lemon 355 ML) on September 29, 2011. The said products were subsequently distributed to the affected areas of Regions III, IV-A and NCR.

## **Local DRRMCs Response Efforts**

### **RDRRMC / OCD I**

#### **Dagupan City**

Implemented pre-emptive evacuation of 3 barangays (Bonuan-Guesset, Pantal and Herrero-Perez) threatened by storm surge; conducted medical check-ups for evacuees in partnership with CHO.

### **RDRRMC/OCD III**

- Facilitated the request of different LGUs requesting relief assistance thru DSWD, SAR Teams and rubber boats for the flooded areas in the region.
- **conducted an aerial reconnaissance over the flooded areas in Region III, utilizing two (2) choppers giving particular attention on following municipalities: Jaen, Cabiao and San Antonio, Nueva Ecija where large devastation in Agriculture and mass flooding were observed; Arayat, Candaba, San Simon and San Fernando City, Pampanga; and Calumpit, Bulacan**

### **Tarlac**

CDRRMC Tarlac City dispatched PDRRMC Tarlac DART Team and local DPWH for clearing operations along Romulo H-way blocked with uprooted acacia trees; controlled situation at Sta. Lucia Bridge in coordination with CDRMC Capas, PNP and Provincial Public Safety Company; dispatched 1 DRRO Team from 3<sup>rd</sup> Mech IB to assist in rescue/evacuation operations in Concepcion, Tarlar.

### **Bulacan**

PDRRMC Bulacan conducted rescue operation in Bulacan together with PNP, PA and BFP.

### **Pampanga**

PDRRMC Pampanga conducted rescue operation together with the PNP, ARMY, BFP, and PAF for the 4 trapped persons at Pasig-Potrero Bridge. Two (2) of the four (4) were rescued.

### **Olongapo City**

CDRRMC Olongapo led in the conduct of rescue, relief and clearing operations; currently conducts SAR operation for the victims of the trashslide at the New Cabalan landfill in Olongapo in coordination with Olongapo Rescue Team, 24<sup>th</sup> IB, PA, PNP Barangay Rescue and ESMO

### **RDRRMC/OCD IV-A**

**RDRRMC OCD IV-A Chairperson with DSWD-IV-A QRT conducted ocular survey in San Mateo and Rodriguez, Rizal. OCD IV-A OpCen coordinated with PRO-IV-A on the provision of additional rescue teams with rubber boats and equipment to augment the DRO in said areas**

### **Quezon**

PDRRMC through the Infanta Engineering Office, BFP, PNP and BDRRMC Comon conducted clearing operations at the two-way lane National Road at Brgy. Comon which is blocked by fallen tree; conducted an emergency meeting on Sept 26, 2011; WASAR team of Gen Luna and Macalelon together with Coast Guard - Marinduque responded and conducted rescue operations for the fishermen on board Sydney and Ice Jade boats; and response team of MDRRMC San Narciso also conducted SAR operations of the two fishermen reported missing.

### **Batangas**

PDRRMC coordinated with local DepEd Provincial Office to ensure the implementation of SOP on the suspension of classes in all levels; recommended to the Provincial Administrator for the suspension of office work in the government offices; and deployed the provincial monitoring teams to monitor the situations in cities and municipalities

### **RDRRMC/OCD-V**

Convened an emergency meeting at OCD V conference room, attended by C, PDRRMC Albay, DSWD, DPWH, DOH, PCGDB, PA, PN, and PAGASA

### **Camarines Norte**

Joint PDRRMC Camarines Norte/MDRRMC Mercedes rescue team proceeded to Butalawan, Siruma to fetch group of fishermen from Camarines Norte that took shelter in the area at the height of Typhoon "Pedring"; and Technical team conducted meeting on the preparation and assessment of situation

### **Catanduanes**

Provided food assistance to strandeers in Tabaco Port and families evacuated to relatives

### **RDRRMC/OCD VI**

**The local DRRMC of Negros Occidental provided Php1,500.00 to the owners of partially damaged houses and Php3,000.00 to the owners of totally damaged houses. The DSWD provided 66 family food packs to the affected families. PDRRMC Negros**

**Occidental extended 5 sacks of rice while the MDRRMC Anini-y and BDRRMC Mabuyong in Antique provided relief assistance to the evacuees.**

#### **MMDRRMC/OCD-NCR**

**MMDA and LGUs** concerned are conducting clearing operations in their respective AOR. MMDA and OCD conducted an ocular inspection in Pasay City (Hotel Softel and SM Mall of Asia, Manila City along Roxas Boulevard from CCP to Port area, Navotas City along R10, Malabon City, and Marikina City; prepositioned 1,700 family packs and ready to repack additional family packs if needed.

**San Juan CDRRMC** conducted clearing operations, prepared all rescue vehicles and equipment for immediate response and dispatched ambulance and rescue vehicles for ocular inspection within AOR.

**Manila CDRRMC** deployed 4 rubber boats to Espana, P. Faura, Pandacan, and Pier 18 to assist in rescue operations; closely monitored Estero de Magdalena, Estero de San Lazaro and Estero Cabulusan; **Brgy. 177** headed by Chairman Ed Yu is monitoring the situation along Estero de San Juan which is about to overflow and readied Patricia Complex for possible evacuation.

**QC DPOS** prepositioned dump trucks, rubber boats, and rescue team.

**PCG and Iglesia ni Cristo provided relief bags in Malabon City. PRC Rizal Chapter provided relief goods to the evacuees of Muntinlupa, Marikina, Pasig and Parañaque**

#### **RDRRMC/OCD-CAR**

LDRRMCs evacuated 167 families / 735 persons in Ifugao, Mt. Province and Benguet and conducted damage and needs assessment.

##### **Mt Province**

**Local DRRMC conducted damage and needs assessment with most of the damages on infrastructure and agriculture sectors; access road to Kalinga, Ifugao and Nueva Vizcaya is still closed to traffic. Simultaneous clearing operations of DPWH-PEO and MEOs of affected areas are ongoing.**
