

Mr. Poul M. Thomsen joined the IMF in 1982 and is currently Deputy Director of its European Department.

Mr. Thomsen has an extensive knowledge of the economic and social problems facing the former socialist countries in Central and Eastern Europe, having worked primarily on countries in this region during most of his career at the IMF. He started working on the former Yugoslavia in 1987: was the Fund's Resident Representative in Belgrade from 1990 to 1991; headed Fund missions to Slovenia and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia from 1992 to 1996; was mission chief for Romania from 1996 to 1998; was head of the IMF's Russia Division from 1998 to 2000; and was Senior Resident Representative and head of the Fund's Moscow Office from 2001 to 2004.

In his current position, Mr. Thomsen heads the periodic Fund missions to Poland and Russia, and directs and approves the work of other country teams, in particular for countries that are using the Fund's financial resources under Stand-By Arrangements, including Iceland, Romania, Serbia and Ukraine. He is also overseeing the Fund's work on Greece.
