



THE HISTORY OF OHIO STATE FOOTBALL

To quote authors Mary Homan and Paul Hornung, who co-wrote *Ohio State – 100 Years of Football*: "Ohio State University has experienced an overwhelmingly eventful, colorful, often controversial, ever-intriguing and, above all, enormously successful football history." Much of the information in this section, which peeks at various seasons of Ohio State football between 1900 and 1999, was supplied with permission from *Ohio State – 100 Years of Football*.

1890

Football becomes a varsity sport and Alexander Lilley is the first head coach.

1899

The Buckeyes notch a 9-0-1 record, their first unbeaten season.

1901

Football crowds and support grow at an alarming rate. Columbus newspapers begin devoting more space to football and most importantly, for the first time after 12 seasons of football, the sport turned a modest profit for the ever-struggling university athletic association.

1902

Coaching hero John Eckstorm shocks the university community, announcing his resignation as head football coach. Perry Hale, a star player at Yale, takes the reins.

1904

E.R. Sweetland became the school's first year-round football coach. Expectations were high for the 1904 team, driving the athletic association to purchase 1,500 additional bleacher seats to be installed on the east side of University Field. Unfortunately, the team and the expected crowds fell way short of all expectations. Ohio State won just six times in 11 tries. Ticket prices ranged from 25 cents to a dollar for "deluxe" games with Michigan and the Carlisle Indians.

1906

Chillicothe native and former Michigan player Al Herrnstein takes over as head coach. Herrnstein, who coached at Purdue in 1905, was instrumental in proving a non-Eastern coach could be successful in college football.

1910

The construction of new bleachers increases the capacity of Ohio Field to 10,000. Football season tickets are sold for \$2.50. Howard Jones, an All-American from Yale, is named head coach.

1911

On the recommendation of Howard Jones, the athletic board hires Harry Vaughn, also from Yale, as head football coach. Vaughn shows little interest in coaching and resigns after leading Ohio State to a 5-3-2 season.

1912

The athletic board, growing tired of the constant turnover, decides to try a new approach and make the head football coach also serve as the director of athletics. Weary of choosing Eastern coaches, the board hired John Richards, a former Wisconsin coach, to assume both roles. The strategy backfires, as Richards goes 6-3 and resigns after one season. With five minutes remaining in the Penn State game and OSU trailing 37-0, Richards took the Buckeyes off the field because of alleged rough play and PSU was awarded a 1-0 win. Ohio State joins the Western Conference, which later became the Big Ten, but could not compete in the conference in football until 1913.

1913

Only after Carl Rothgeb of Colorado College declined to accept the position, John W. Wilce, a former three sport star at Wisconsin, was named head football coach at Ohio State. Wilce went on to a storied 16-year career at OSU, leading the school to three Big Ten championships. The Buckeyes made their football debut in the Western Conference, creating a wave of electric enthusiasm throughout Columbus. Ohio Field's capacity had been increased to 14,000 in anticipation of joining the conference. Ohio State collected its first league win Nov. 13 with a 58-0 trouncing of Northwestern.

1914

Ohio State produced its first All-American, end Boyd Cherry, and went 5-2. Interest in football at the school continued to skyrocket.

1915

Varsity manager William A. Dougherty wrote the fight song "Across the Field." The song was dedicated to Coach John Wilce and was first performed at the Illinois game (Oct. 16, 1915).

1916


Ohio State went a perfect 7-0 and captured its first Western Conference title – sort of. For a reason still unknown, the conference did not officially recognize football championships in those days. Highlights of the championship season included a school record 128-0 win over Oberlin, the first win over Wisconsin (14-13), and a season-ending 23-3 victory over Northwestern that decided the conference championship. Chic Harley earned the first of what would become three All-America awards. He was OSU's first three-time All-American and one of only six in school history.

1917

A powerful Ohio State team finished 8-0-1, capturing its second-consecutive Western Conference championship. Strangely enough, two postseason games were played that year. Ohio State tied Auburn, 0-0, in a game played in Montgomery, Ala., to benefit the Ohio National Guard training in the South. Another game not originally on the schedule was played the next weekend, as Ohio State rolled over Camp Sherman, a team from Chillicothe. Chic Harley earned All-America honors for the second-consecutive season, and more importantly, became the talk of the Midwest. Fans turned out in record numbers to see Harley, one of the most versatile players in the country, pass, punt, rush, return punts, drop-kick extra points, and play stellar defense. The legendary Walter Camp, who selected the only official college All-American team in those days, made a personal visit to Columbus to watch Harley play.

1919

Ohio State outscored its opponents 176-12 and went 6-1. OSU recorded its first win over Michigan, 13-3. The admittance of Ohio State to the Western Conference and the dramatic success of the football team under Coach Wilce magnified the inadequacy of Ohio Field.



1920

A landmark year for Ohio State football. Professor Thomas E. French, a member of the athletic board, and Director of Athletics Lynn Wilbur St. John decided it was time to take advantage of the soaring interest in Ohio State football. An extensive stadium campaign was launched in the fall, with hopes of building a new football facility. The campaign opened Oct. 18, 1920, with a goal of reaching \$600,000, a figure considered unrealistic by many. By Nov. 26, 1920, over \$923,000 had been pledged. With the campaign in full force, coach Wilce's team kept interest levels high by finishing the regular season 7-0 and capturing the school's third Western Conference title. The undefeated season drove Ohio State football into the national spotlight and caught the eye of the Tournament of Roses Association in Pasadena, Calif. At the conclusion of the regular season, Ohio State received an invitation to play in the Rose Bowl against California Jan. 1, 1921. After heated discussions between members of the athletic board and St. John, the football team was granted permission to play in the game.

1921

The fact Ohio State went 5-2 and collected its third-consecutive win over Michigan was dwarfed by the construction occurring just a few blocks from Ohio Field in 1921. On Aug. 3, Ohio Governor Harry Davis joined a crowd of over 2,500 to officially break ground on the new stadium. The massive project was scheduled to take only 14 months and originally was to be completed at a cost of \$1,341,017. After speculation the new stadium would seat about 35,000, it was officially announced it would actually seat over 60,000, a figure that drew harsh criticism from many. Upon completion, the final cost of the stadium exceeded \$1,500,000. More than \$1,000,000 of that cost had been pledged by proud and dedicated Ohio State football fans.

1922

Those that cited concerns of Ohio Stadium being too large looked on in awe as the stadium was dedicated prior to the Michigan game Oct. 21. Temporary stands were erected in the south end of the stadium, and a crowd of 72,500 was estimated. The dedication game against the Wolverines was actually the third game played in Ohio Stadium. Ohio State christened its new home with a 5-0 win over Ohio Wesleyan in front of 25,000 people. OSU won the first two games in Ohio Stadium, but finished the season with a disappointing 3-4 mark.

1928

L.W. St. John announces all stadium debt has been paid, a remarkable achievement considering the facility had been standing for only eight short years. Coach Wilce announces his resignation, to take effect in June, 1929, citing the desire to enter the private practice of medicine. After capturing three Western Conference championships and producing 14 All-Americans, Wilce left football and did postgraduate research at Harvard and Columbia before becoming the Director of the Ohio State University Student Health Services in 1934.

1929

Sam Willaman, an assistant on Wilce's staff and a 1913 Ohio State graduate, was named the 13th head coach in the history of Ohio State football. He led the team to a 4-3-1 finish in his first season.

1930

Wes Fesler becomes only the second three-time All-American in Ohio State history, captaining the Buckeyes and leading them to a 5-2-1 record. He also is the first recorded winner of the team's Most Valuable Player Award. Fesler, one of the school's top all-time all-around athletes, earned nine total varsity letters – three each in football, basketball and baseball.

1933

Fueled by an incredible defense, Ohio State finished 7-1, dropping only a 14-0 decision to Michigan. The Buckeyes allowed only 26 points the entire season, while scoring 161.

1934

Francis Schmidt is named the head football coach at Ohio State, ushering in not only a new era but also a new style of football. With an offensive scheme dubbed "azzle-dazzle" by the press and featuring double and triple reverses, laterals, and passes, Schmidt's inaugural team scored 267 points – the second most in OSU history at that point. Schmidt's off-the-field antics were just as colorful as his on-field plays, making him an instant hit with the community. After accepting the coaching position, he was asked how he expected to cope with the OSU nemesis from Ann Arbor. Dressed in his inevitable bow tie, his matter-of-fact answer developed into a cliché: "They put their pants on one leg at a time same as everybody else." Schmidt's comment leads to the formation of the "Gold Pants Club," which awarded miniature gold football pants to all players who had a hand in a victory over the Wolverines. The tradition of an annual Captain's Breakfast, where all former grid captains are invited to a breakfast and welcome the current team captains, also began.

1935

Ohio State collected its second-consecutive 7-1 season under Schmidt, claiming the school's first Big Ten title in 14 years. The Buckeyes capped the year with a 38-0 season-ending win over Michigan. That season finale launched the now famous season-ending rivalry. Since then, Ohio State has ended its regular-season schedule with a battle against the Wolverines every year but one. Also in 1935, Ohio State and Notre Dame play what was hailed as the "greatest college game ever played," for many years after. The Buckeyes held a 13-0 lead entering the fourth quarter, but Notre Dame scored three times in the final stanza – twice in the last two minutes – for an 18-13 win.

1936

The Ohio State Marching Band performed "Script Ohio" for the first time at the Pittsburgh game (Oct. 10, 1936). OSU dropped its Big Ten opener to Northwestern, 14-13, but steamrolled through its remaining conference schedule with four shutouts in four games.

1941

After a dominant high school coaching career in Massillon, Ohio, Paul Brown was named Ohio State's 15th head coach. An incredibly organized, meticulous man, Brown led Ohio State to a 6-1-1 mark in his debut season. He also earned OSU's first West Coast win, a 33-0 trouncing at Southern California in only Brown's second collegiate game. The season ended with a 20-all tie at Michigan.

1942

Though World War II loomed over the nation, Ohio State football fans reveled in one of the most glorious seasons ever. The Buckeyes captured the school's first national championship as well as a Big Ten title, finishing the year 9-1 and ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll. Led by a star-studded backfield that included Les Horvath, Paul Siringhaus, and Gene Fekete, OSU rolled to 337 points, a record that stood until 1969. The only loss of the season, a 17-7 decision at Wisconsin, even had an asterisk. Several key players and coaches caught a debilitating virus from a drinking fountain on the train from Chicago to Madison.

1943

With a game apparently ending in a 26-all tie, Ohio State and Illinois left the field. But the teams were called back 20 minutes later when it was discovered the Illini were called for a penalty on the Buckeyes' final play. With little of the crowd remaining, John Stungis kicked a 27-yard field goal – the first of his career – for a 29-26 OSU win. Brown, a Lieutenant Junior-Grade, left Ohio State for the Great Lakes Naval Training Station in April of 1944.

1944

Carroll Widdees, an assistant of Paul Brown's at Massillon and Ohio State, was named acting head coach. In his first season, the Buckeyes finish 9-0 and claim the Big Ten championship, but finish No. 2 in the Associated Press behind Army. OSU fans claim an unofficial "civilian national championship."

Les Horvath became the school's first Heisman Trophy winner. Ohio State received an invitation to the Rose Bowl, but faculty representatives from around the Big Ten disallow the trip.

1946

In one of the program's more unique coaching moves, offensive coordinator Paul Bixler and head coach Carroll Widdees switched roles prior to the season. Warren Amling earns All-America honors at tackle, just a year after being named an All-America guard. Following the season, Bixler turns in his resignation.

1947

In the same meeting Bixler announces his intentions to resign, L. W. St. John proposes to the athletic board that Wes Fesler be the next head coach at Ohio State. The board concurs, and Fesler, a three-time All-American at Ohio State in the 1930s, becomes the program's fifth head coach in eight years. In one of the stranger games during the 1900s, Ohio State was afforded three plays after time had expired because of Northwestern penalties and came away with a 7-6 victory in Ohio Stadium.

1949

Ohio State captures a share of the Big Ten championship and collects its first Rose Bowl win, beating California, 17-14.

1950

Vic Janowicz puts on arguably the greatest individual display in college football history against Iowa. He sent two kickoffs out of the endzone for touchbacks, recovered two fumbles on defense, scored on an 11-yard touchdown run, returned a punt 61 yards for a touchdown, threw a 12-yard scoring strike, and kicked three extra points – all in the first five minutes of the game. The famous "Snow Bowl" game with Michigan was played in late November. Somehow, between the swirling winds and zero visibility, Janowicz boots a 27-yard field goal in what would later be called one of the "Greatest Feats in American Sports" by a panel of sportswriters. To no one's surprise, Janowicz wins the Heisman Trophy. On Dec. 9, Fesler submits a lengthy resignation statement.

1951

After a highly-scrutinized selection process, Wayne Woodrow "Woody" Hayes begins his 28-year tenure as head coach. A tireless worker, meticulous planner, and a Lieutenant Commander in the Navy, Hayes led his initial Buckeye team, which struggled to adjust to his T-formation style, to a 4-3-2 finish. Many thought Hayes' days at Ohio State were numbered. They were wrong.

1954

Ohio State claims its second national championship with a perfect 10-0 season, beating Southern Cal, 20-7, in a rainy, mud-soaked Rose Bowl game. The rift between West Coast writers and Hayes is born when the OSU coach criticizes the Tournament of Roses Association for not covering the field before the game and allowing the bands to perform at halftime.

1955

Ohio State uses a 17-0 blanking of Michigan to claim its second consecutive Big Ten championship. Howard "Hopalong" Cassady becomes Ohio State's third Heisman Trophy winner. During the season, Hayes voices his displeasure over the fact several other football conferences had started awarding scholarships to student-athletes, but the Big Ten had failed to follow suit. After a series of meetings and heated debates, the conference adopts a complicated grant-in-aid program based on financial need, marking the first form of athletics scholarship available at Ohio State.



In 1890, Alexander S. Lilley was named Ohio State's first head football coach.

1956


Ohio State sets a Big Ten record with 17-consecutive victories, breaking Michigan's previous mark of 15. Offensive guard Jim Parker became the first OSU player to win the Outland Trophy.

1957

After dropping the season opener, the Buckeyes win nine-consecutive games to capture the school's third national championship – the second under Hayes. OSU knocked off Oregon 10-7 in the Rose Bowl for its third-consecutive win in Pasadena.

1963

Ohio State defeated Michigan in Ann Arbor, 14-10, marking the fourth-consecutive Buckeye win over the Wolverines. The game was delayed a week as the nation mourned the death of President John F. Kennedy. The attendance of 36,424 was the smallest at Michigan Stadium in 20 years.

1966

Billy Ray Anders, a true walk-on that did not play high school football, set an OSU record with 55 receptions. The record would stand until Cris Carter's arrival in 1985.

1968

Arguably the finest Ohio State team in history uses a dominating 50-14 win over Michigan and a 27-16 come-from-behind victory over Southern California in the Rose Bowl to earn the school's fifth national championship. Before the final polls crowning the Buckeyes champions are released, Coach Hayes departs for Vietnam for a volunteer trip to talk football with U.S. servicemen. Later, the Sporting News called this team one of the 10 greatest college football teams of all-time.

1969

A squad Coach Hayes called "the best team we ever put together, probably the best team that ever played college football," rolled easily to a 9-0 record, but a season-ending loss to Michigan ended OSU's 22-game unbeaten streak and bid for a second-consecutive national title.

1970

Jim Stillwagon wins both the Outland and the first Lombardi Award. Ohio State rolls to nine-consecutive wins – including a 20-9 triumph over Michigan that has been called one of the most emotional games in Ohio Stadium history – before falling to Stanford in the Rose Bowl. Ohio State still was awarded a national championship by the National Football Foundation. A senior class featuring six All-Americans and nine all-Big Ten selections leaves OSU with a three-year mark of 27-2.

1972

Freshmen are cleared to play for the first time, signaling the start of the Archie Griffin era. Against the better judgment of Coach Hayes but after strong urging from backfield coach Rudy Hubbard, Griffin comes off the bench against North Carolina and rushes for a then-Ohio State record 239 yards in only his second collegiate appearance. OSU uses two goal-line stands – one in each half – to beat Michigan, 14-11, and claim a share of the Big Ten title and a trip to the Rose Bowl.

1973

Ohio State goes unbeaten, finishing 10-0-1 including a 42-21 trouncing of USC in the Rose Bowl. OSU becomes the first school to own three of the Top 5 vote-getters in the Heisman Trophy balloting. With five Big Ten titles, two

national championships, and four Rose Bowl trips all in a six-year span, Ohio State football popularity hits an all-time high. Columbus becomes known as the "Capital of College Football."

1974

On June 5, Coach Hayes suffers a heart attack, but pledges to return by OSU's opener Sept. 14. The fiery coach, who by this point had become larger-than-life in Columbus, did return and led OSU to its third-consecutive Big Ten championship and yet another Rose Bowl. Archie Griffin won the Heisman Trophy, becoming the fifth non-senior to win the award.

1975

Hayes gives West Coast reporters a now famous quote about Archie Griffin: "He's a better young man than he is a football player, and he's the best football player I've ever seen." Griffin becomes the first two-time winner of the Heisman Trophy, leading the Buckeyes to their conference-record fourth-consecutive Rose Bowl. He also becomes the NCAA's all-time leading rusher in a midseason game against Purdue.

1976

Just one year after the Big Ten changes the rule to allow more than just the conference champion to attend a bowl game, the Buckeyes notch a share of the Big Ten championship and beat Colorado, 27-10, in the Orange Bowl.

1979

Former Ohio State player and assistant coach Earle Bruce is named head coach. The Buckeyes finish the regular season 11-0 and come within a point of a national championship, falling 17-16 to Southern California in the Rose Bowl. Bruce is named the Big Ten and national coach of the year in his first season.

1980

Ohio State and Illinois combined for 1,057 yards and 91 points in a 49-42 OSU win.

1981

The Buckeyes capture their second Big Ten championship in three years under Bruce and top Navy in the Liberty Bowl. Art Schlichter completed 31 of 52 passes for 458 yards – all OSU records – against the Florida State Seminoles.

1984

After a five-year absence, Ohio State returns to the Rose Bowl with an undisputed Big Ten championship. Chris Spielman makes his debut a memorable one in the season opener against Oregon State, making 10 tackles in the second half after coming off the bench. Keith Byars rushes for a then school-record 274 yards and scored five touchdowns in a 45-38 win over Illinois. Byars' memorable day also included a 67-yard touchdown run where he lost one shoe 35 yards from the goal line.

1985

The first night game in Ohio Stadium history – thanks to portable light standards – ends in a 10-7 Ohio State win over Pittsburgh. Flanker Mike Lanese becomes the first OSU football player to win a Rhodes Scholarship. A preseason foot injury to Heisman Trophy favorite Keith Byars dampens Ohio State's hopes for a championship season.

1987

Linebacker Chris Spielman wins the Lombardi Award and the season ends with a thrilling 23-20 win at Michigan. College football fans everywhere mourn the death of Woody Hayes. President Richard Nixon, joined by a crowd of over 10,000, speaks at Hayes' memorial service.

1988

John Cooper, then head coach at Arizona State, was named the school's 21st head football coach after an intense search conducted by new Director of Athletics Jim Jones.

1989

Ohio State celebrates its 100th season of intercollegiate football. The Buckeyes overcome a 31-0 deficit to win 41-37 at Minnesota, equaling the largest comeback in NCAA history. OSU competes in the Hall of Fame Bowl, its 10th different postseason bowl appearance.

1990

Natural grass returns to Ohio Stadium. Robert Smith gains 1,126 yards to break Archie Griffin's OSU freshman rushing record.

1991

Thanks to 5,000 new bleacher seats, home total (654,500), average home (90,500) and single game (95,357 vs. Iowa) attendance records fall.

1993

OSU records its best record since 1979 by going 10-1-1, capturing a share of the Big Ten title and winning the Holiday Bowl.

1994

The Buckeyes defeat Michigan 22-6, ending a six-game winless streak against the Wolverines.

1995

Ohio State dominated college football's individual awards. Eddie George becomes OSU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner. Orlando Pace becomes the first sophomore to win the Lombardi Award, and Terry Glenn wins the Biletnikoff Award. The Buckeyes tie a school record with 11 wins and play in the Citrus Bowl. OSU sets a school record that still stands with 475 points scored. A then Ohio Stadium record crowd of 95,537 is on hand for Ohio State's 45-26 win over Notre Dame.

**1996**

The Buckeyes win their 27th Big Ten title and defeat Arizona State in the Rose Bowl, winding up No. 2 in both national polls. Orlando Pace repeats as the Lombardi Award winner and wins the Outland Trophy. It marks the fourth-consecutive season Ohio State has finished among the nation's Top 10 in one of the major polls.

1998

Ohio State notched its fourth-consecutive 10-win season. The Buckeyes spend 10 weeks as the No. 1 in the Associated Press Poll and cap the season with a 24-14 win over Texas A&M in the Sugar Bowl. Joe Germaine wins the Chicago Tribune's Silver Football Award as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player, and the Buckeyes go a perfect 5-0 against teams ranked in the Top 25. Antoine Winfield wins the Thorpe Award.

1999

Athletics Director Andy Geiger announces the retirement of Archie Griffin's No. 45 at the Sept. 30 Iowa game. It is the first number retired in any sport in Ohio State history.

2000

The jersey numbers of former Heisman Trophy winners Vic Janowicz (31) and Howard "Hopalong" Cassady (40) are retired at home games against Penn State and Michigan, respectively. The Buckeyes fall to South Carolina in the Outback Bowl on Jan. 1, the first meeting between the two teams. Following the season, former OSU assistant Jim Tressel is named to replace John Cooper as head coach of the Buckeyes.

2001

Jim Tressel becomes the Buckeyes' 22nd head football coach. The jerseys of Les Horvath (22) and Eddie George (27), Ohio State's first and most recent Heisman Trophy winners, respectively, are retired. The Buckeyes defeat Michigan in Ann Arbor, their first win there since 1987. The three-year, \$194 million stadium renovation is completed.

2003

The Buckeyes began the season by winning their first five games and extending their winning streak to 19 games – the second longest in school history. A 17-10 setback at Wisconsin ended that streak. The Buckeyes also played the first ever overtime game in Ohio Stadium, a 44-38 triple overtime victory over visiting North Carolina State. It was the longest game in OSU history, lasting 4 hours and 17 minutes from kickoff to final gun. OSU won its second consecutive BCS game with a 35-28 win over Kansas State in the Fiesta Bowl.

2004

Minus 14 players who had been taken in the NFL draft the previous April and 28 seniors overall, the youthful Buckeyes won their first three games, lost the next three and then won five of the last six, including wins over Michigan in the regular-season finale and Oklahoma State in the Alamo Bowl to finish at 8-4. The senior class had the satisfaction of being just the second class in Ohio State history to post winning records against Michigan (3-1) and in bowl play (3-1). Mike Nugent became the school's first Lou Groza Award winner as the top kicker in college football and took over as the Buckeyes' all-time leading scorer. Nugent and junior A.J. Hawk both won first team All-American honors, Chic Harley, Ohio State's first three-time All-American, had his jersey retired.

2005

The Buckeyes captured a share of their 30th Big Ten title and closed the season with seven consecutive wins en route to a 10-2 record. Coach Jim Tressel's squad posted rare back-to-back wins over Michigan and Notre Dame, the latter in the Fiesta Bowl for the Buckeyes' fourth consecutive bowl victory and third BCS triumph in four years. Linebacker A. J. Hawk was a consensus All-American and won the Lombardi Award. Center Nick Mangold and safety Donte Whitner were also accorded first-team All-America honors. Quarterback Troy Smith was the MVP of the Fiesta Bowl, where he accounted for 408 yards in total offense.

2006

The 2006 Buckeyes opened the season at No. 1 in the polls and remained there throughout the regular season. Jim Tressel's team compiled a perfect 12-0 regular season record and won the school's first outright Big Ten title since 1984. The Buckeyes defeated No. 2 Texas in Austin and No. 2 Michigan in Columbus, the latter a 42-39 shootout that will go down as one of the most thrilling games every played in the storied rivalry between the two Big Ten giants. After a loss to Florida in the National Championship game in Arizona, the Buckeyes wound up No. 2 in the final polls. Individually, the story of the season was senior quarterback Troy Smith, who threw for a school record 30 touchdowns, won unanimous All-American honors and became Ohio State's seventh Heisman Trophy winner. On the defensive side of the ball, tackle Quinn Pitcock and linebacker James Laurinaitis both won All-America acclaim. Laurinaitis won the Nagurski Award as the best defensive player in the country and was one of three finalists for the Butkus Award. Pitcock was a finalist for both the Lombardi and the Lott awards. Anthony Gonzalez and Stan White Jr. both won first-team Academic All-American laurels.

2007

Picked third in the preseason Big Ten race, the young and offensively inexperienced Buckeyes went on to win another Big Ten outright title and finished the regular season with an 11-1 mark, the only loss coming to Illinois. Ohio State, which moved to No. 1 in the polls by mid-October, finished with a 14-3 win at Michigan; after a number of upsets across the nation during the next two weeks, the Buckeyes were No. 1 in the BCS standings entering the bowl season. Ohio State went to play LSU in New Orleans, dropping a 38-24 decision to finish ranked fourth. Junior James Laurinaitis, the Butkus Award winner, was a finalist for five national awards; he and offensive tackle Kirk Barton earned first team All-America honors. Brian Robiskie was a first team Academic All-American, and six Buckeyes were first team all-conference.

2009

Capturing their fifth straight Big Ten title, the 11-2 Buckeyes advanced to Pasadena for the first time in 12 years, defeating favored Oregon 26-17 behind the play of Rose Bowl MVP Terrelle Pryor. Winning the conference crown outright, Ohio State closed the regular season with wins over nationally ranked Penn State, league-leading Iowa (in overtime) and at Michigan (21-10), the sixth consecutive victory over the Wolverines, an OSU record. All-America safety Kurt Coleman was voted team MVP.

2010

Ohio State became the first team in Big Ten history to win at least 10 games in six consecutive seasons en route to a 12-1 record, a sixth consecutive Big Ten championship, a seven straight win over rival Michigan and its second straight BCS bowl victory with a 31-26 win over Arkansas in the Sugar Bowl. Ohio State finished No. 5 in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches polls for the second straight season while center Mike Brewster and cornerback Chimdi Chekwa picked up first team All-America honors. NOTE: The 2010 football season was vacated by The Ohio State University in July, 2011.

2002


Ohio State captures the school's seventh national championship and the Big Ten's first unanimous crown since 1968 by compiling a 14-0 record and defeating Miami in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 3. The 14 victories set an NCAA Division I-A record. The Buckeyes begin the season ranked 13th in the Associated Press Preseason Poll, but gradually work their way up to the No. 2 spot prior to their showdown with the previously unbeaten and top-ranked Hurricanes. Their 31-24 double-overtime victory over Miami is typical of a heart-pounding season in which they win five games by six points or less. Quarterback Craig Krenzel and two-way star Chris Gamble, who starts at both flanker and cornerback for the Buckeyes, share team MVP honors. Additionally, Krenzel is selected as the offensive MVP of the bowl game, while teammate Mike Doss is the defensive honoree.



Laurinaitis was Big Ten defensive player of the year, junior Vernon Gholston was Big Ten defensive lineman of the year and tailback Chris "Beanie" Wells, who rushed for 1,609 yards, was voted team MVP. Coach Jim Tressel won his 200th career game with the victory at Washington. Bill Willis, the pioneering 1940s All-American, had his No. 99 jersey retired.

2008

In 2008, Ohio State posted a fifth straight win over Michigan (42-7) for the first time in the storied rivalry. The Buckeyes also won a share of their fourth straight Big Ten title and played in their fourth consecutive BCS bowl, losing 24-21 to heavily favored Texas in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. James Laurinaitis won the Lott Trophy and the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, while Malcolm Jenkins was the winner of the Jim Thorpe Award; both were consensus All-Americans, Laurinaitis for the third time. Chris "Beanie" Wells, who rushed for 1,197 yards, was voted team MVP for a second year.

PASADENA, Calif. – California finished an undefeated season by spoiling OSU's first Rose Bowl appearance, and tagging the Buckeyes with their first loss of the year. It was a season in which the Bears rolled up 510 points to 14 for the opposition, and a team that would remain undefeated from 1920 until 1924. Cal quarterback Harold "Brick" Muller was named the player of the game and was credited with a 53-yard touchdown pass.

It marked only the second time a Big Ten team had met a Pac 8 squad in the Rose Bowl, with Michigan having played Stanford in the first game in 1902.

PASADENA, Calif. – The Buckeyes avenged a loss to Cal in their first Rose Bowl trip by breaking a 14-all tie in the fourth quarter to snatch a victory from the Bears.

With just more than three minutes remaining in the game, Cal quarterback Bob Celeri was back to punt at his own 16 on fourth down. A low snap forced Celeri to kick the ball on his wrong (left) foot, the ball dribbling out of bounds at the Cal 13. Three plays advanced Ohio State to the 6, where Jimmy Hague kicked the winning field goal with under two minutes remaining.

It was a dramatic end to a game OSU had dominated early, outgaining Cal 143-15 in total yards in the first half and driving inside the Bears' 20 three times with nothing to show for it. Two Ohio State touchdowns were called back by penalty.

For the game, OSU held a 255-239 advantage in yardage, gaining 221 on the ground. Fred Morrison topped all carriers with 127 yards for the Buckeyes.

PASADENA, Calif. – Woody Hayes made his first trip to the Rose Bowl a memorable one, as the Buckeyes dominated the Trojans in the rain and mud. OSU and UCLA had tied for national championship honors, but the Bruins were excluded from the bowl because of the "no repeat" rule that was in effect.

Led by Howard "Hopalong" Cassady, the Buckeye ground game drove for 304 yards, helping OSU to a 360-206 advantage in total offense. Cassady ran for 92 yards, Dave Leggett for 67 and Bob Watkins for 64. Leggett, the Ohio State quarterback, was named the outstanding player of the game. He completed six of 11 passes on the day for 63 yards and a touchdown.



PASADENA, Calif. — The Buckeyes put the finishing touches on a perfect 10-0 season and a national championship by coming from behind to beat Southern California. The game had matched unbeaten teams for the first time in the 22-year history of the Big 10-Pac 8 meeting at the Rose Bowl.

Heisman Trophy winner O.J. Simpson had followed a USC field goal with an 80-yard run to take the Trojans to a 10-0 lead midway through the second quarter. Ohio State answered with a 1-yard run by Jim Otis and a 26-yard field goal by Jim Roman to tie before the half.

OSU would put it away with 14 points early in the final quarter. A USC fumble at the Trojans' 21 set up a Rex Kern pass to Leo Hayden for the final 4 yards, then a fumbled reception cost Southern Cal the ball again at its own 16. Kern, the game's MVP, hit Ray Gillian on the Buckeyes' first down for the score and a commanding 27-10 lead with 10:05 remaining. USC turned the ball over five times on the day, while OSU was error-free.



PASADENA, Calif. — Heisman Trophy winner Jim Plunkett quarterbacked Stanford to a come-from-behind win over favored and previously unbeaten OSU in the 1971 Rose Bowl.

Plunkett passed 30 times, completing 20 for 265 yards and a touchdown.

His performance offset a tremendous rushing day for Ohio State, as the Buckeyes rolled up 364 yards on the ground and actually led the Cardinal in total offense, 439-408. Rex Kern led OSU with 129 yards rushing, while John Brockington added 101 and two touchdowns.

Stanford scored the first two times it had the ball, only to see Ohio State gain a 14-10 lead at the half. After trading third quarter field goals, OSU drove from its own 6 to the Stanford 19 to begin the final quarter. On fourth and less than a yard, the Cardinal defense stopped Brockington short of the first down. Plunkett then ran and passed down the field for the go-ahead score.



PASADENA, Calif. – All-America quarterback John Sciarra led UCLA to 23 second-half points to upset top-ranked and previously unbeaten Ohio State. Sciarra hit on nine of 13 second-half attempts for 173 yards, helping the Bruins amass 366 yards in total offense in the half.

Despite the backfield of Big Ten MVP Cornelius Greene, two-time Heisman Trophy Award winner Archie Griffin and national scoring leader Pete Johnson, OSU was limited to 124 yards in the second half.

Ohio State was impressive offensively in the first half, gaining 174 yards and 11 first downs, but managed only a 3-0 lead. Defensively, OSU held UCLA to 48 yards.

But sparked by Sciarra and the running of Wendell Tyler, the Bruins roared back to dash OSU's national championship hopes and spoil a fourth-consecutive Rose Bowl trip for the Buckeye seniors. Sciarra directed drives of 61 and 83 yards in the third quarter, hitting Wally Henry with scoring tosses of 16 and 67 yards.

OSU answered with a 65-yard scoring march to close it to 16-10, but Tyler broke away for a 54-yard touchdown run and close out the scoring.



NEW ORLEANS, La. – In the first meeting between coaching legends Woody Hayes and Paul "Bear" Bryant of Alabama, the Crimson Tide made a pitch for the national championship with a convincing performance. It also marked OSU's first appearance in the Sugar Bowl.

Alabama's Jeff Rutledge was the game's most valuable player. Rutledge was good on eight of 11

passing attempts for 109 yards, including scoring strikes of 27 yards to Bruce Bolton and a 3-yarder to Rick Neal to stake the Tide to a 21-0 lead in the third quarter.

Alabama rolled up 389 yards in total offense, 286 on the ground. Ohio State was limited to 263 yards, and gave up the ball three times on interceptions. The lone Buckeye score was a 38-yard Rod Gerald to Jim Harrell pass which capped an 85-yard drive.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — The Clemson Tigers won their 10th consecutive game of the season and 11th overall by holding off Ohio State in Woody Hayes' last game as head coach at OSU.

After Bob Atha gave Ohio State an early 3-0 lead with a 27-yard field goal, Clemson's Steve Fuller, named the game's outstanding player, directed the Tigers on an 80-yard, seven-minute drive.

Fuller passed for 25 yards and ran for 36, including a scoring jaunt of 4 yards, in the drive.

Freshman Art Schlichter answered with a 78-yard drive, scoring himself from 4 yards away. Vlade Janakievski's extra point was blocked, but OSU had a 9-7 lead.

Clemson scored the next 10 points before Schlichter tallied again at the end of an 88-yard march with 8:11 left in the game. His two-point conversion run was stopped short of the goal line.

OSU got a chance at victory when Tim Sawicki covered a Fuller fumble on the Clemson 24 with 4:22 remaining. But on third-and-five at the 24, the Tigers' Charlie Bauman stepped in front of a Schlichter pass intended for Ron Springs, and OSU's hopes were dashed.

Ohio State held the high octane Cougars to 349 yards, limiting quarterback Robbie Bosco to 261 yards passing—about half his average. And each time Bosco threatened to bring his team back, the Buckeyes thwarted him with an interception, four in all.

All four of those interceptions came in the second half. The first two were by Larry Kolic, Kolic, the Buckeyes' middle guard, picked off his first on the second play of the third quarter and returned it 14 yards for a touchdown and a 10-7 OSU lead. That was the last score by either team.

In the fourth quarter, cornerback William White and safety Terry White each had interceptions in the end zone. The latter came with three seconds left.

Given new life, the Bulldogs marched 84 yards in 11 plays, scoring the winning touchdown with 4:32 to play.

All-America tailback Garrison Hearst had an All-America day for Georgia, rushing for 163 yards and two touchdowns on 28 carries. But it was the passing of QB Eric Zeier, who threw for 241 yards, that kept the Buckeyes off balance.







Reserve quarterback Joe Germaine came off the bench to lead the Buckeyes to the victory and was named as the game's Most Outstanding Player.

OSU took a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter on a 9-yard pass from Stanley Jackson to David Boston. ASU scored early in the second period on a 25-yard pass from Jake Plummer to Ricky Boyer and the two teams were deadlocked at halftime.

The Sun Devils jumped out to a 10-7 lead on their first possession of the second half on a 37-yard field goal by Robert Nycz. The Buckeyes recaptured the lead moments later when Germaine and senior flanker Dimitrius Stanley hooked up on a 72-yard score, the longest TD pass in OSU bowl annals.

Plummer, on a third-and-11, somehow snaked his way into the end zone to give ASU a 17-14 lead with 1:40 to play. Earlier, Plummer had kept the drive alive with a 29-yard completion on fourth down.

Germaine responded by calmly marching the Buckeyes 65 yards in 12 plays, hitting Boston from 5 yards out with the game winner.



TEMPE, Ariz. - Ohio State worked two overtimes to rip the national championship from the Miami Hurricanes in one of the greatest college football games ever. Maurice Clarett ran 5 yards for the winning touchdown, and Ohio State's defense turned back one final Miami bid to tie the game. With that, the Buckeyes completed an unbeaten run to their first national title in 34 years with a 31-24 win.

Trailing 24-17 in the first OT, Ohio State converted a 4th-and-14 on a pass by Craig Krenzel. But the Buckeyes then faced a 4th-and-3 at the 5 when Krenzel threw to the right corner of the end zone for Chris Gamble. A flag was thrown from the back of the end zone indicating pass interference and three plays later Krenzel scored from the 1 to send the game to a second OT. In the second OT, the Buckeyes went first and Clarett capped the five-play drive.

The Buckeyes took a 14-7 halftime lead, turning two turnovers into touchdowns in a 78-second span, and extended the margin to 10 points on Mike Nugent's 44-yard field goal. The Hurricanes closed to 17-14 on Willis McGahee's 9-yard scoring run in the third quarter to set the stage for Todd Sievers' 40-yard kick at the end of regulation.



TEMPE, Ariz. - Craig Krenzel improved to an amazing 24-3 as a starter at Ohio State as the Buckeyes claimed a 35-28 victory over Kansas State in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. Krenzel overcame two first quarter interceptions to complete 11-of-24 passes for 189 yards and four touchdowns, finding both Michael Jenkins and Santonio Holmes for two scoring strikes each.

The Buckeyes stormed out to a 21-0 lead in the second quarter, scoring first on special teams before Krenzel hit Holmes and Jenkins to pad the lead, which slipped to 21-7 at the half. After intermission, the Wildcats pulled within seven, but Krenzel and Jenkins teamed up to again to reclaim a two-touchdown lead. Holmes caught his second TD pass from Krenzel and dragged two feet in the back of the end zone to make the score 35-14. Kansas State added two more scores.

Jenkins finished with five receptions for 96 yards, and ended his career with 2,898 career receiving yards. Kansas State out-gained Ohio State 378-337 in total yards, but the Buckeye defense held the Wildcats to 84 yards rushing. Ohio State ran for 148 yards to go with 189 passing yards. Defensively, Robert Reynolds and A.J. Hawk, the Fiesta Bowl Defensive MVP, each had 10 tackles to pace the Buckeyes.

SAN ANTONIO, Texas - Justin Zwick threw for one touchdown, Lydell Ross and Ted Ginn Jr. each ran for another and Mike Nugent kicked four field goals to lead No. 24/24 Ohio State to a 33-7 MasterCard Alamo Bowl victory over Oklahoma State in front of 65,265 fans at the Alamodome.

The Buckeyes finished 8-4 on the year as they won their 40th game under head coach Jim Tressel, who became the fifth coach in school history to reach the mark. He was the second fastest to reach 40 wins, taking 51 games. Tressel's mentor Earle Bruce reached the plateau in 50 games. Tressel is now 40-11 after four seasons in Columbus and boasts a 19-year career record of 175-68-2. He also has guided the Buckeyes to a 3-1 bowl record.

Zwick, completed 17-of-27 passes for 189 yards and one touchdown without an interception. The Buckeyes added 214 rushing yards to finish with 403 yards of total offense. It was the fifth time this season for Ohio State to surpass 400 yards in total offense.

Ross carried the ball 12 times for 99 yards and a score, while Branden Joe carried 13 times for 57 yards. Ginn added 40 yards on eight carries and scored.

Ginn, normally a flanker for the Buckeyes, made his first appearance at quarterback. His 5-yard run up the middle that gave Ohio State a 30-0 lead with 8:13 to play in the third quarter. The OSU freshman was named the Most Valuable Offensive Player of the game.

Ohio State did not put any more points on the board until Nugent delivered his fourth field goal of the night to lift the Buckeyes to a 33-0 cushion with 10:44 to play in the game. Nugent, the 2004 Lou Groza Award winner, connected from 37, 35, 41 and 36 yards to set the school's bowl record with four field goals, his 20th school record.

Ohio State limited Oklahoma State to 286 total yards. The Cowboys had entered the game averaging 245.0 rushing yards per game, but the Buckeyes held them to 149 yards rushing on 30 carries. Oklahoma State added 137 yards passing. Donte Whitner led the Buckeyes with eight tackles, including seven solo stops. Anthony Schlegel, A.J. Hawk and Quinn Pitcock added five tackles each. Simon Fraser was named the Most Valuable Defensive Player of the Alamo Bowl.



TEMPE, Ariz. – Led by Troy Smith and Ted Ginn Jr. on offense and All-America A.J. Hawk on defense, Ohio State ran roughshod over Notre Dame in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, downing the Irish 34-20 in a game that wasn't as close as the final score indicated.

The Buckeyes were making their third appearance in four years in the Fiesta Bowl, and Sun Devil Stadium seemed to fit them like an old pair of well broken in sneakers.

After Notre Dame opened the game with a crisp six-play, 72-yard drive that culminated with a 20-yard run by Darius Walker, it was pretty much all Ohio State the rest of the way.

Smith and Ginn saw to that. First they hooked up on a beautifully thrown 56-yard scoring pass on which Ginn was five yards beyond his defender when the ball settled into his outstretched hands. Then Ginn gave the Buckeyes the lead for good on a dazzling 68-yard reverse in which he cut this way and that and left frustrated Notre Dame defenders strewed helplessly in his wake. Smith dialed pay dirt again just before halftime, connecting with Santonio Holmes on an 85-yard pass that gave the Buckeyes a 21-7 lead at intermission. Had it not been for two fumbles, one in the ND red zone, and a blocked field goal, the margin might have been greater.

The Buckeyes had 391 yards in total offense at halftime. Notre Dame had 154. Ohio State was a perfect five-for-five on third-down conversions.

Smith had thrown for 248 yards by intermission and both Ginn and Holmes were over the 100-yard mark in receiving yards.

Walker scored on a 10-yard run in the third quarter to cut the deficit to eight at 21-13, but a 40-yard field goal by Josh Huston made it 24-13 at the end of three quarters.

Huston converted again, this time from 26-yards out at the start of the fourth quarter, to give OSU a 27-13 lead.

Notre Dame's final score came on a three-yard run by Walker with 5:27 to play, cutting the Ohio State lead to 27-20. Their scoring drive covered 80 yards in 13 plays.

But the Buckeyes quickly responded with an 85-yard drive of their own that included two clutch third-down completions by Smith and a 60-yard TD gallop by Antonio Pittman that eliminated any and all doubts.

Smith was the MVP of the game, rolling up 408 yards in total offense and accounting for three touchdowns. The Buckeyes finished the evening with a season-high 617 yards in total offense – 342 passing and 293 on the ground. The Buckeyes had three drives of 80 or more yards and a fourth of 68.

All-America linebacker A.J. Hawk was the defensive MVP. He had a game-high 12 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and a forced fumble.

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Ohio State's Ted Ginn Jr. returned the opening kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown, but it was all Florida from there as the No. 2 Gators upset the No. 1 Buckeyes, 41-14,



in the BSC National Championship Game Jan. 8 in Glendale, Ariz.

Big Ten champion Ohio State (12-1) had defeated the nation's second-ranked team twice earlier in the season – at Texas and vs. Michigan – but saw its four-game bowl winning streak and the nation's best 19-game winning streak overall come to an end. The 2006 Buckeyes are the only team to face a No. 2-ranked opponent three times in the same season.

Ginn was injured in the celebration of his opening kickoff return for a touchdown and the Buckeyes could not recover offensively. Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Troy Smith completed 4-of-14 passes for 35 yards and an interception and was sacked five times by the Gators (13-1).

Junior tailback Antonio Pittman rushed for 62 yards on 10 carries and his 18-yard touchdown run with 13:32 left in the second quarter brought the score to 21-14 in favor of the Gators, but it would be all the closer the Buckeyes would get.

Florida, champion of the Southeastern Conference, scored touchdowns on its first three possessions, then kicked a pair of field goals before scoring another touchdown with 23 seconds left before halftime. The Gators led 34-14 at intermission, capitalizing on the Buckeyes turning it over on downs on their own 29 yard line and a Smith fumble on his own 20 on back-to-back possessions.

OSU linebackers James Laurinaitis and Marcus Freeman both collected 15 tackles in the game.

New Orleans (AP) — Making its second straight appearance in the BCS championship game, and its third in six years, No. 1 Ohio State was unable to contain No. 2 LSU in a 38-24 loss at the Superdome.

Ohio State was trying to win its second BCS title in six years, and add to the one that Coach Jim Tressel captured by upsetting Miami 31-24 in double overtime for the 2002 championship.

LSU rallied from an early 10-0 deficit, taking a 24-10 halftime lead that held up.

"We just didn't do the things you need to do to win a ball-game of this nature. We're very aware that LSU's a deserving champion," Tressel said.

Ohio State (11-2) had little to celebrate after Chris "Beanie" Wells, who finished the game with 146 rushing yards, broke loose for a 65-yard TD run on the fourth play of the game.

Known as a punishing runner, Wells got the game off to a quick start; the Buckeyes' bruising back started left, made a nifty cut right and burst through the middle. On the longest run of his career, Beanie outran All-America safety Craig Steltz for a 65-yard TD.

This time, Ohio State made it 10-0 on its next possession. Todd Boeckman hit a wide-open Brandon Saine, setting up Ryan Pretorius' 25-yard field goal.

Only five minutes into the game, Ohio State and its all-brass band was blowing away the Tigers. LSU looked dazed and defensive coordinator Bo Pelini had few answers, but LSU's offense started clicking behind running back Jacob Hester.

First, he barreled into All-America linebacker James Laurinaitis for a short gain. Both players are the rugged type and in a nice show of sportsmanship, Laurinaitis -- whose dad, Joe, once starred as "Animal" in the "Legion of Doom" wrestling tag team -- helped up Hester.

Hester broke off a 20-yard run on the next play, and LSU eventually got a 32-yard field goal from Colt David that made it 10-3.

That score late in the first quarter seemed to jazz everyone in purple and gold. Two big penalties against Ohio State helped set up Matt Flynn's 13-yard touchdown pass to Richard Dickson, who somehow found himself uncovered. Flynn punctuated the strike by hollering, giving a wild fist pump and putting up both hands to signal TD.

Tied at 10, the Buckeyes counted on Wells. He delivered one of the season's best stiff-arms on a 29-yard romp, and Ohio State seemed poised to retake the lead.

Instead, Ricky Jean-Francois crashed through the middle, swung his big right arm and blocked Pretorius' 38-yard field goal try.

LSU turned to another of its five dangerous tailbacks, and NCAA sprint star Trindon Holliday zigzagged closer to the goal line. Flynn's perfect pass to Brandon LaFell in the back left corner of the end zone put the Tigers ahead 17-10.

Then, LSU's defense made the big play. Cornerback Chevis Jackson intercepted Boeckman's lost toss and streaked 34 yards down the right sideline.

The Tigers moved to a first-and-goal at 1. On third down, Hester plunged up the middle and it was 24-10 at the half.

The Tigers got two big plays on special teams -- Ricky Jean-Francois blocked a field goal, and LSU took advantage of a roughing-the-kicker penalty when Austin Spitzer missed on a punt-block attempt.

Flynn hit Early Doucet with a four-yard toss with 9:04 left for a 31-10 lead and the celebration was on in earnest. The Buckeyes made the score more respectable on Boeckman's 5-yard TD pass on fourth down to Brian Robiskie, only to have Flynn come back and throw his second TD pass to Dickson.

As the clock ticked down, Boeckman threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Brian Hartline.

"I worry about disappointment because of how hard the kids work. I don't worry about criticism," Tressel said. "If you struggle taking criticism, you better not be at Ohio State and better not be playing football."

LSU (12-2), whose two losses both came in triple overtime, became just the fourth favorite to win in 10 BCS championship games.

Texas trailed 6-3 at the half after being held to minus-9 yards rushing and giving up 140 to the Buckeyes, 96 to junior running back Chris "Beanie" Wells, who missed most of the fourth quarter after he was concussed.

The Buckeyes opened up the scoring with a 51 yard field goal by Aaron Pettrey in the first quarter. Texas evened things up with a 27 yard field goal by Lawrence Hunte. Ryan Pretorius added a 30-yarder to put OSU up 6-3. Pettrey also missed a 51-yarder in the first period.

McCoy was sacked on a 4th-and-7 situation to squelch one drive in the first half and was intercepted at the goal-line by Anderson Russell in the final five seconds after the Longhorns had driven to OSU's 15-yard line.

McCoy completed 20 of 27 passes over the first two quarters and drove Texas 80 yards for the go-ahead touchdown on the opening drive of the third quarter, covering the final 14 on a quarterback draw. The Longhorns converted two fourth down plays in the drive, including Rashad Bobino's run on a fake punt on a 4th-and-2.

He found Cosby with a 7-yard touchdown pass before the quarter ended for a 17-6 lead. Ohio State scored the next 15 points and took a 21-17 lead on Dan Herron's 15-yard run with 2:05 remaining.

The Longhorns then covered 78 yards in 11 plays. Cosby broke free at the 15-yard line over the middle and had nothing between him and the end zone.

Quarterback Todd Boeckman, a senior who lost his starting spot to Pryor after two games, gave the Buckeyes a lift when they needed it. He completed 5 of 11 passes for 110 yards and a touchdown to Pryor, who lined up at wide receiver. Brian Robiskie led Buckeye receivers with five catches for 116 yards.

Pryor threw for 66 yards and ran for 78.

McCoy finished by hitting 41 of 59 passes for 414 yards and was named the offensive MVP. Cosby had 14 receptions for 171 yards.

Ohio State, which was playing the Fiesta for the fourth time since 2003, is 4-2 in the bowl and 18-22 overall, 4-4 under Tressel. Texas now leads the all-time series 2-1, with every game being played since 2005.



PASADENA, Calif. — A Rose Bowl record-setting performance by the Ohio State offense, led by the passing and running skills of quarterback Terrelle Pryor, propelled No. 8 Ohio State to a 26-17 victory over No. 7 Oregon in the 96th edition of the "Grandaddy of them all" Jan. 1 at the Rose Bowl Stadium.

Pryor, who had not thrown more than 17 passes in Ohio State's previous five games — all wins that clinched a fifth consecutive Big Ten

Conference title and the school's first Rose Bowl berth since 1997 — had a personal-best day at quarterback to earn Most Valuable Player honors. The sophomore completed 23 of 37 passes for 266 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. He also led Ohio State in rushing with 72 yards for 338 yards of total offense.

Pryor, quite simply, was masterful in keeping the Ohio State offense on the field for 89 plays and a Rose Bowl record 41 minutes 37 seconds, the stat of the day when considering the high-scoring Duck offense just didn't have the opportunities or the time to come near its 37.7 points-per-game average. Consider:

Pryor led a 10-play, 74-yard drive on Ohio State's first possession that was capped by a Pryor to Brandon Saine touchdown pass covering 13 yards. Saine, who rushed for 45 yards and caught two passes for 59 more on the day, bulldozed through a Duck defender at the 2 to score the TD.

After Oregon came from 10 down to tie the score at 10 and retake momentum in the second quarter, Pryor and the OSU offense went on a 19-play drive that chewed up 8:03 on the clock. Devin Barclay's second of three field goals on the day — from 30 yards — put the Buckeyes back into the lead at 13-10.

A Ross Homan interception with just 25 seconds remaining before intermission gave Pryor just enough time to set up a 45-yard Aaron Pettrey field goal as time expired. The successful kick signaled Pettrey's return from knee surgery that caused the senior to miss the final three games of the regular season.

Pryor and the offense matched Oregon's touchdown to open the third quarter, one that gave the Ducks a 17-16 lead, with an 11-play drive that resulted in a Barclay field goal from 38 yards out, putting Ohio State back into the lead at 19-17.

After each team had a turnover and a punt, Pryor directed a 13-play, 81-yard fourth quarter touchdown drive for a 26-17 lead. Pryor hit Jake Ballard for 24 yards for a key third-down conversion, and then found DeVier Posey in the end zone from 17 yards out for the touchdown.

Posey and the receivers had big days with Pryor on target and his throws on pace. Posey finished with eight receptions for 101 yards and running mate Dane Sanzenbacher had nine for 64 yards. Saine, coming out of the backfield, had a marvelous over the shoulder catch-and-run along the sidelines for a 46-yard gain. Tight end Ballard leaped into the air to bring down Pryor's third-down throw that kept that winning drive going.

Equal credit goes, too, to Ohio State's defense, which limited the Ducks to a mere 260 offensive yards. Leader Jeremiah Masoli threw for only 81 yards and had just nine rushing yards while 1,400-yard rusher LaMichael James managed just 70 yards rushing.

Ross Homan led the Buckeyes with 12 tackles and an interception late in the first half that led to an Ohio State field goal and a 16-10 halftime lead. Thaddeus Gibson had two tackles-for-loss while Cam Heyward and Doug Worthington had one apiece.

The win completed an 11-2 season for Ohio State and it put an end to a number of streaks: it stopped a three-game BCS bowl game losing streak for Ohio State; it snapped a six-game losing skid against teams ranked in the Top 10; and it snapped a six-game Big Ten conference losing streak in the Rose Bowl.

The 2009 senior class, with its Rose Bowl victory, finished with 44 wins, most in Ohio State history.

CRAIG KRENZEL

Craig Krenzel will long be remembered for his role as the starting quarterback on Ohio State's 2002 national championship team. But Krenzel was perhaps even more accomplished in the classroom than he was on the football field. A molecular genetics major, he was named winner of the Socrates Award as a junior, presented by Sporting News Radio to the outstanding student-athlete in the nation. As a senior, Krenzel was named to a first-team berth on the Academic All-America Team and singled out as the Academic All-American of the Year by the College Sports Information Directors of America. He was selected as one of 13 football seniors nationwide to receive a National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame Scholarship. At the NFF awards dinner in New York in December, he was again singled out, this time receiving the Vincent DePaul Draddy Award, as the top scholarship winner. Finally, he capped off a brilliant year by being named a recipient of the NCAA's prestigious Top VIII Award for combined excellence in athletics, academics and community involvement.

MIKE LANESE

Mike Lanese always will occupy a special place in the hearts and minds of Ohio State fans everywhere. His clutch grab against Michigan in 1984 has become known as "The Catch" and is one of the most memorable receptions in Ohio State history. But Lanese's legacy also includes some memorable accomplishments in the classroom, where after twice being named to the Academic All-America team, he was named a Rhodes Scholar in 1985. The former OSU flanker is the last Big Ten football player to be so honored. After completing his studies at Oxford, Lanese served in the U.S. Navy.

BOBBY HOYING

Ohio State quarterback Bobby Hoyer was one of the National Football Foundation's 13 scholarship recipients in 1995. Additionally, at the awards banquet in New York, Hoyer was named winner of the Vincent dePaul Draddy Award, which goes annually to the top senior scholar-athlete in college football. Hoyer was the first Big Ten player ever to receive the award, which is based on athletics, academics and community involvement.

SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION AND HALL OF FAME SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Each year, the National Football Foundation awards a scholarship to the top seniors in college football. The \$18,000 grant for graduate work is based upon combined excellence in athletics and academics. Ohio State has produced 20 recipients. At its annual awards banquet, the Foundation also presents the William V. Campbell Award to the top senior in the group. Buckeyes Bobby Hoyer (1995) and Craig Krenzel (2003) are the only Big Ten players to win that award.





ERNIE GODFREY

Ohio State has had several outstanding assistant coaches down through the years. But perhaps none has had more of an impact than the legendary Ernie Godfrey, who spent 33 years on the Ohio State staff, assisting seven different head coaches. Ernie joined the Ohio State ranks in 1929 as an assistant for Sam Willaman. He would go on to work for Francis Schmidt, Paul Brown, Carroll Widdoes, Paul Bixler, Wes Fesler and Woody Hayes before retiring in 1961. After retirement, at the urging of Hayes, he spent 11 years working with the Buckeyes' kickers. An Ohio State graduate, he lettered in football in 1914 with the Buckeyes. Godfrey, who was on the coaching staff of five national championship teams and six Rose Bowl squads, is a member of the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame. The Columbus chapter of that organization is named after him.
