VS. PHILADELPHIA: The Hawks head to Philadelphia for the first time this year in the first-of-three contests with the 76ers ... Atlanta hosts the Sixers on 2/4 before returning to Philadelphia on 3/31 to end the season series ... The teams split last season's series at 2-2, each winning once at home and once on the road ... The 76ers took the last two meetings ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 157-154, with the Sixers holding a 87-49 edge in home games.

COMMON THREADS: Willie Green spent the first seven years of his career with the 76ers ... Jerry Stackhouse was drafted third overall by the Sixers in 1995, and spent two-and-a-half years with Philly ... Kirk Hinrich and Andres Nocioni were teammates for several years in Chicago ... Bob Bender is a former 76ers assistant coach ... Louis Williams attended South Gwinnett HS in Snellville, and was named Mr. Basketball in Georgia twice ... Thaddeus Young played at Ga. Tech in 2006-07 ... Jodie Meeks starred at Norcross HS, leading the Blue Devils to the 2006 state title ... Sixers associate head coach Michael Curry grew up in Augusta and attended Georgia Southern ... Spencer Hawes is the nephew of Steve Hawes, who played for the Hawks from 1976-83.

THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY:

January 16, 1972 – Pete Maravich scores 50 points in Atlanta's 124-116 win over Philadelphia. It is tied for the 9th highest scoring game in Hawks history. Exactly one year later, Maravich put his name in the record books again, dishing out 18 assists in Atlanta's 130-129 OT win over Detroit. It is tied for the 5th highest assist total in club history.

THE HIGHLIGHT FACTORY:

Since the start of the 2008-09 season, Atlanta has recorded a 96-35 (.733) mark at Philips Arena.

PICKING UP THE SLACK: Since Al Horford left the lineup after suffering a torn left pectoral muscle on 1/11 at Indiana, Joe Johnson and Josh Smith have elevated their games. Here are their numbers during that span (the last four games):

Johnson – 24.8 ppg (99), 6.0 rpg (24), 5.5 apg (22)

Smith – 20.8 ppg (83), 11.8 rpg (47), 2.8 apg (11), 2.0 bpg (8), 39-71 FGs (.549)

TEAGUE MAKING THE JUMP: Point guard Jeff Teague has picked up right where he left off in the Playoffs last year, and is making a case as one of the league's most improved players this season. He is averaging 12.4 ppg (up from 5.2 last year), 5.8 apg (2.0 last season) and 2.2 rpg (1.5), while leading the league in total steals with 31.

SMOOVE MAKES HISTORY AGAIN: Josh Smith finished with 25 pts, 5 rebs, 5 assts, 6 blks and 4 stls in 34 mins v/Chi (1/7), becoming the first player in over 18 years to hit those levels in a game (since Hakeem Olajuwon on 12/30/93), according to Elias Sports Bureau ... He's also the fourth player to ever record those numbers in a game, joining Hall-of-Famers Olajuwon (5x), Kareem Abdur-Jabbar (4x) and David Robinson (once).

MORE FREE BASKETBALL: On 1/6 @Char, the Hawks became the third team in NBA history to follow up a triple OT game (1/5 vs. Miami) with an OT game the next night, joining Dallas (Dec. 1989) and Minneapolis (Dec. 1951) ... Coincidentally, Hawks Executive VP/GM Rick Sund was the VP of Basketball Operations for Dallas in 1989.

TRIPLE VISION: The Hawks lost to Miami, 116-109, on Jan. 5 at Philips Arena in Atlanta's first triple overtime contest since 2/22/04 (@Hou, 123-121, L) ... It was also the first triple OT game in Philips Arena history.

TOUGH IN THE 1ST: Atlanta is holding opponents to 20.0 points (300) in the 1st quarter of games this year, while scoring 23.4 (351) ... The Hawks have held 9 opponents to less than 20 pts in the opening stanza and allowed only two to score more than 25 ... Atlanta has trailed five times after the first 12 mins, and in each instance the opponent has scored more than 20.

STARTING ON A ROLL: According to Elias Sports Bureau, the Hawks were the third team in the last 20 years to outscore their first two opponents by a combined 50-points-or-more ('02-'03 Kings and '08-'09 Lakers).

RECORD SETTING OPENER: Atlanta won 106-70 at New Jersey on 12/27 in the season opener (the largest margin of victory ever in an opener), winning their fifth consecutive opening night, the longest streak in Atlanta history ... The previous best was 3 straight from 1986-88 ... The game marked the third time in NBA history that a team won on the road by more than 35 points in its season-opener (Cavaliers over Hornets 133-93 in 1988 and Bulls over Heat 108-66 in 2006) ... Additionally, the Hawks tied a franchise record by holding the Nets to 22 made FGs for the game (previously 4 times).

50,000 POINTS: The triumvirate of Tracy McGrady (18,196), Jerry Stackhouse (16,129) and Joe Johnson (13,911) are nearing 50,000 career points collectively ... The veteran trio has combined for 48,232 career points in the NBA ... McGrady ranks 9th among active NBA players in scoring, while Stackhouse is 13th and Johnson 27th.

TRIPLE THREATS: Joe Johnson, Tracy McGrady, Jerry Stackhouse, Vladimir Radmanovic and Kirk Hinrich are among the top active career three-point shooters in the NBA ... Johnson has made 1188 (16th among active players), while McGrady has sunk 1071 from long range, which puts him 21st ... Stackhouse is 28th with 946 triples, Radmanovic is 29th with 937 3FGs and Hinrich is 32nd with 887.

10,000 AS A HAWK: Joe Johnson needs 240 points to reach 10,000 points in a Hawks uniform ... He would become just the seventh Hawks player to accomplish the feat and just the fifth since the club moved to Atlanta, joining Dominique Wilkins, Bob Pettit (St. Louis Hawks), Lou Hudson, Cliff Hagan (St. Louis Hawks), John Drew and Kevin Willis.

OPENING NIGHT AGE: Atlanta's opening night roster had an average age of 29 years, 77 days, the second-oldest team in the NBA behind only the defending NBA Champion Dallas Mavericks (30 years, 106 days) ... The Hawks' starting five of Marvin Williams (25-years-old), Josh Smith (26), Al Horford (25), Jeff Teague (23) and Joe Johnson (30) is significantly younger than the overall team average at just under 26-years-old (25.8).

SCHEDULE NOTES: In the 2011-12 season, the Hawks have:

- 20 back-to-backs and 12 road/road back-to-backs
- 10 3-games-in-4 nights
- 29 games with 1 day of rest, most in NBA, and 2 games with 2 days of rest (least in NBA)
- Also, Atlanta was the only NBA team with 9 games in the first 12 days of the season ... Seven teams had 8 games in the first 12 days.

HEAD COACH LARRY DREW

Overall NBA Coaching Record: 55-42 (2nd year)

2011-12 Record: 11-4

Larry Drew was named head coach of the Atlanta Hawks on June 12, 2010, becoming the 11th full-time head coach in the franchise's history.

Through his first season, Drew guided the team to a 44-38 record and led the Hawks to the playoffs for the fourth consecutive campaign, coaching his players to a series victory over division-rival Orlando in the first round of the 2011 NBA Playoffs, and falling short of reaching the Eastern Conference finals in a six-game series against the Chicago Bulls.

The Hawks came out of the gates strong to start the 2010-11 season, winning its first six games – Atlanta's longest winning stretch overall of the year – and enjoyed their best months during December and January when the team won 19 of 30 contests. Despite cooling off a bit prior to the playoffs, the Hawks showed enough determination in that series against Orlando, and shook off any thoughts of another playoff disappointment to eliminate the Magic in six games before their eventual loss to the Bulls.

Drew finished with an even .500 record in the postseason as his six playoff victories were the most-ever by a rookie Atlanta coach in his first playoff appearance.

Drew has experience, having played with championship-caliber players like Magic Johnson, James Worthy and Byron Scott. He has also coached under individuals like Scott, Alvin Gentry and Doug Collins, and following 27 seasons as a player and coach, the work invested in those positions set the stage for Drew to obtain the job he has desired for some time, and after 18 years on the bench as an assistant, he was ready for the challenge when Hawks GM Rick Sund named him to the position.

He knows the personalities of his core players after seven years of work in Atlanta, as well as their strengths and weaknesses on the court, and that knowledge serves him well as he attempts to keep the Hawks amongst the best in Eastern Conference and lead them back to the playoffs for the fifth straight season.

Before arriving in Atlanta as the top assistant to then-head coach Mike Woodson in August 2004, Drew was an assistant with the New Jersey Nets and Scott after spending the previous three seasons with the Washington Wizards in a similar capacity (2000-03) under Collins. Prior to that, he re-joined one of the teams he previously played for, the Detroit Pistons, as an assistant coach in 1999-2000. Drew returned to Detroit as an assistant under Alvin Gentry, for the first time since playing with the team as a NBA rookie with the Pistons in 1980-81. His coaching career began in 1992-93 when he broke into the ranks with another of his former teams, the Los Angeles Lakers, whom he played for from 1989-91.

An 11-year professional, Drew averaged 11.4 points and 5.2 assists in 714 career games for four NBA teams. After one season in Detroit, he played the next five years with the Kings, in Kansas City and Sacramento (1981-86), and his final four in Los Angeles (1986-91), for the Clippers and the Lakers. In addition, Drew spent one season internationally as a member of Scavolini of the Italian League in 1988-89.

He was a first round pick in the 1980 NBA Draft – 17th overall selection by the Pistons – and he reached postseason play four times in his pro career (31 games). Drew recorded his best season during the 1982-83 campaign, when he averaged 20.1 points, 8.1 assists and 1.7 steals for Kansas City.

Born April 2, 1958 in Kansas City, Kansas, Drew played four seasons at the University of Missouri, where he averaged 12.0 points and 2.8 rebounds and prepped at Wyandotte High in Kansas City. During the summer, Drew runs the Larry Drew Advanced Guard Academy in Los Angeles, and holds camps around the country.

Drew and his wife Sharon have three children, Larry, Landon and Lindsey. While Larry II is sitting out this year as he transfers to UCLA, he will have one year of college eligibility remaining in 2012-13, his brothers Landon and Lindsey both play high school basketball in the Los Angeles area for Fairfax High School.
