Conservative Lead Dwindles After Liberals Settle on New Leader

Twenty-point advantage drops to six points; Ignatieff ties Harper as the preferred Prime Minister for Canadians.

[TORONTO – Dec. 13, 2008] – The governing Conservative Party remains ahead in Canada's federal political scene, but the Liberal Party has made significant gains after officially choosing a new leader, a new *Toronto Star /* Angus Reid poll has found.

In the online survey of a representative national sample, 37 per cent of respondents (-5) say they would vote for the Tories in the next federal election, followed by the Liberals with 31 per cent (+9), the New Democratic Party (NDP) with 15 per cent (-3), the Bloc Québécois with nine per cent (-1), and the Green Party with eight per cent (+1).

Earlier this month, the Conservatives held an imposing twenty-point advantage over the Liberals (42%-22%), which has dropped to six points after Michael Ignatieff became the new leader of the official opposition.

While the Tories command strong support in Alberta, Manitoba and Saskatchewan, the Liberals are now clearly the second choice for voters in Quebec (28%, behind the Bloc at 35%) and British Columbia (also 28%, behind the Conservatives at 38%). In Ontario, the Tories hold a six-point lead over the Grits.

From December 11 to December 12, 2008 Angus Reid Strategies conducted an online survey among 1,004 randomly selected Canadian adults who are Angus Reid Forum panelists. The margin of error—which measures sampling variability—is +/-3.1%, 19 times out of 20. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region Census data to ensure a sample representative of the entire adult population of Canada. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.





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Preferred Prime Minister and Momentum Score

For the first time in two years, Conservative leader and Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper has fallen below the 30 per cent mark when respondents are asked which of the five federal party leaders would make the best head of government.

Liberal leader Ignatieff is at the top of the list with 28 per cent, followed by Harper with 27 per cent, and NDP leader Jack Layton with 10 per cent. Green Party leader Elizabeth May and Bloc Québécois leader Giles Duceppe are in single-digits.

The results of this particular question reveal a major breakthrough for the Grits. Former Liberal leader Stéphane Dion was unable to reach the 20 per cent mark as the preferred prime minister in two years, and trailed Layton in several surveys conducted during the last federal electoral campaign.

Still, many Canadians appear upset with their political leaders. None of them was able to garner a positive momentum score this week. A majority of respondents (51%) say their opinion of Harper worsened over the course of the past month, and 39 per cent feel the same way about Layton. May posted a negative momentum score of -10, while Ignatieff stands at -1.

Qualities and Characteristics

In the poll, respondents were provided with nine qualities and characteristics usually associated with politicians, and asked to state whether each of them applied to Canada's three main federal party leaders.

While Ignatieff posted significantly higher numbers than his predecessor, Harper continues to dominate as being a strong and decisive leader (45%), an effective economic manager (35%), and a person who understands complex issues (42%).

Layton is still regarded as a man who cares about the environment (57%), has a vision for Canada's future (47%), understands the problems of Canadians (44%), is honest and trustworthy (39%), and who generally agrees with Canadians on issues they care about (32%).

Ignatieff holds the upper hand over his two rivals as a politician who inspires confidence (34%).
