On November 10th a difficult twenty-eighth anniversary faces New York's Livingston County Sheriff Investigators

Early morning hours of November 10, 1979 brought Sheriff's Investigators to meet with a local farmer who had discovered the lifeless body of a young female while checking his fields off Route 20 in the rural town of Caledonia, New York. Upon investigation it was determined that she had been shot, pulled into the cornfield, shot again, and stripped of identification.

Sheriff John York, the lead investigator at the time, continues to lead the investigation with his agency's efforts to identify the victim, return her to her family, and identify the killer.

Although the case received national attention on television ("America's Most Wanted", "USA Today", "Prime Suspect", the BBC network) and having tracked over 10,000 leads across the United States, Canada, Europe, Mexico, the Caribbean and Interpol, the case remains unsolved.

Body exhumation and specialized forensic efforts such as tooth enamel identification, Texas A&M's pollen identification, and a multitude of new technologies with DNA have still not brought identification and resolve to this case.

Sheriff York and investigators from the Livingston County Sheriff's Office asks for the public's help again this November to identify both the victim and her killer. Anyone with information is asked to contact the Livingston County Sheriff's Office.
