Authorizing the creation of a State Debt, the proceeds to serve as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Hyattsville Community Development Corporation for the planning, design, construction, acquisition, installation, and capital equipping of public safety infrastructure improvements in the area surrounding the West Hyattsville Metro Station.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

The bill requires a matching fund of \$ 65,000, which may consist of in kind contributions.

8. Special Provisions

As new development impacts the area, the Hyattsville Development Corporation will work with the developers to augment and adapt the project to incorporate the new pedestrian traffic patterns and structures.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The Hyattsville CDC has proudly served residents of Hyattsville, MD for five years. Civic activists created the CDC in Dec. of 2000 with a vision for a sustainable and economically dynamic community. The Hyattsville CDC works with residents, elected leaders, the development and arts community to realize that vision, by implementing elements of the City's Strategic Plan and the Sector Plans governing the Arts and Transit Districts.

Hyattsville is a Route One-affiliated, historic municipality located inside the Washington DC Beltway. With a population of 16,000, it is racially, intellectually, and culturally diverse: a strong residential community of Prince George's County. Its demographic, income, and economic profile is typical of many suburban sprawl-affected, inner-ring suburbs, with a struggling traditional downtown Main Street.

The Hyattsville CDC is a non-stock, charitable organization whose mission is:

- 1. To develop arts and public spaces in the community of Hyattsville
- 2. To spur economic development and the quality of life in Hyattsville
- 3. To revitalize residential and commercial areas in the community
- 4. To encourage widespread leadership for community revitalization

5. To undertake broad educational campaigns to advance our mission and encourage sustainability of the community

In 2001 the Hyattsville CDC was awarded a grant to execute a Mural promoting the historic identity of Hyattsville as a critical node in the Anacostia Trails Heritage Area on its first external funding foray. The CDC conducted an open search, a juried selection for the design, reviewed proposals from across the country and abroad, and assisted the artist with the business of mural production: implementing the project on time and within budget.

In 2001 The CDC led the residents and decision-makers of the City of Hyattsville in a Comprehensive Planning exercise that led to the development of a Strategic Revitalization Plan, and expansion of the City's Nationally-Registered Historic District, through a \$300,000 statefunded planning and development grant program called the Community Legacy Program. The development of this strategy and its implementation through the Hyattsville CDC's Economic Development Program and other efforts have led to significant redevelopment activities within and around the traditional downtown area.

The CDC's past initiatives have showcased the talents of school age artists: creating venues for both group and individual performances, while reaching out to the broader Hyattsville community to promote and educate residents and others about the CDC's mission and the great assets we have at hand in Hyattsville. As capacity and funding develop, the CDC looks forward to future activity converting under-performing properties: eliminating blight, while promoting the creation of locally-owned businesses and encouraging regional and Hyattsville-based talent in the creation of a sustainable, locally-driven marketplace.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

Synopsis of Proposed Project: Authorizing the creation of a state debt in the amount of \$200,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Hyattsville Community Development Corporation for the planning, design, and construction of public safety infrastructure such as surveillance cameras and emergency call boxes at critical pathway entrances to the West Hyattsville Metro Station to better connect surrounding adjacent communities with the transit facility: providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, etc.

Discussion:

Proposed development around The West Hyattsville Metro Station transit district stands to increase usage of the Metro and bring considerably more pedestrian traffic and activity. Current crime statistics suggest that this area still presents crimes of opportunity along the pedestrian pathways connecting adjoining neighborhoods with the Metro station. In order to build investment confidence, and in support of the revitalization efforts to promote safer streets and pedestrian access in the neighborhoods of the 47th District: the Hyattsville Community Development Corporation proposes to work with the Avondale Civic Association, the Eighth Precinct Civic Association, Resident managers at the Kirkwood Apartments, development entities under contract with WMATA, County and Municipal Police officials to best place public safety measures incorporating security cameras and call boxes in the neighborhoods at access points surrounding the Metro station.

We would seek \$200,000 to implement these strategically placed safety elements.
