#### STEP 7: Teach the Online Comprehension Skills of Locating Information and Critical Evaluation

Locating Information:

Critical Evaluation:

Use sites such as Save the Pacific Northwest Tree Octopus

(http://zapatopi.net/treeoctopus/) or Dog Island Free Forever

(<u>http://www.thedogisland.com/</u>) and ask students to figure out how to prove that each site is completely false.

Use other spoof sites to engage students in discussions about critical evaluation strategies. Google "spoof sites" or visit <u>www.snopes.com</u> for spoofs, urban legends, and other false information sightings. (Screen some of these sites first, for younger children, to make certain that they are appropriate.)

#### **STEP 8:** Work with colleagues to help the last become first.

Introduce new technologies, requiring new literacies, to your weakest readers, providing appropriate support. This will enable them to become the "experts" in your class. Your weakest readers will now be literate, while others will need to acquire these new literacies from them. We should NEVER permit students to use the Internet only when their other work is done.

## STEP 9: Explore the potential of Wikipedia for your class.

#### STEP 10: Keep a patient heart and be willing to help others on their journeys.

Keep in mind that the Internet fulfills the promise of the age-old aphorism, "Many hands make light work!"
