Use i-Zoom and pay pre-April 1, 2008 toll rates; Transponders available for purchase at Travel Plazas

Two-axle passenger vehicles and motorcycles that use i-Zoom and electronic tolling will be charged the pre-April 1, 2008, rates until April 1, 2016. And now, retail i-Zoom transponders for two-axle vehicles and motorcycles are available for purchase in the gift shops/convenience centers of several travel plazas along the Indiana Toll Road.

Eight out of the 10 plazas along the road are equipped to sell i-Zoom transponders for two-axle passenger vehicles and motorcycles. The plazas are located in eastbound and westbound lanes at mile markers 21, 90, 126 and 146. The plazas located at mile marker 56 are expected to be stocked with i-Zooms in the coming weeks.

The initial cost, including a \$40 credit and \$10 deposit, is \$50 for a two-axle i-Zoom at the plazas. The i-Zoom transponder must first be activated by calling the Customer Care Center at (888)-izoom90 before using it on any road, and activation via the Internet will also be available in the near future. Each retail transponder comes equipped with mounting and activation instructions to help drivers with the setup.

How to get i-Zoom

Indiana's electronic toll-collection system, i-Zoom, was successfully implemented along the entire length of the toll road on April 1, 2008. i-Zoom transponders may be ordered through the ITRCC Web site, www.getizoom.com. They are also available by calling our Customer Care Center at 1-888-izoom90 (888-496-6690) or by visiting the Center at our Granger office, 52551 Ash Road. In addition, the i-Zoom will soon be available for purchase in select retail stores.

About the ITR

In operation since 1956, the Indiana Toll Road stretches 157 miles across the northernmost part of Indiana from Ohio to the Illinois state line. It links Chicago with the largest cities on the eastern seaboard. It also serves as the primary connecting route to the Chicago Skyway, a main route to downtown Chicago.
