# Wildrose Alliance Leads in Alberta as **Progressive Conservatives Falter**

Following the election of Danielle Smith as leader, party becomes the first choice for voters in the province.

[CALGARY - Dec. 11, 2009] - Just weeks after its leadership election, the Wildrose Alliance Party has become the most popular provincial political force in Alberta, pushing the long-governing Progressive Conservative Party into a tie for second place, a new Angus Reid Public Opinion poll has found.

In the online survey of a representative provincial sample of 1,000 Alberta adults, 39 per cent of decided voters say they would support the Wildrose Alliance candidate in their constituency if a provincial election were held tomorrow.

The governing Progressive Conservatives and the opposition Liberal Party are tied for second place with 25 per cent each, followed by the New Democratic Party (NDP) with nine per cent.

# **Demographics**

The Wildrose Alliance leads in all areas of the

province. Their stronghold is Southern Alberta

(outside of Calgary) where they have twice the support of the PCs (46% to 23%). In Calgary, the Liberals are in second place (30%) and the PCs are ranked third (23%) as their support flows to both the Liberals and Wildrose Alliance (38%). The Wildrose Alliance is ahead in Edmonton (36%) and Northern Alberta (39%) as well.

As voters get older they are more likely to support the Wildrose Alliance, with more than half (51%) of those 55 and over planning to vote for the party. For both the Wildrose and the PCs there is a close relationship to household income. For both parties the higher the income, the higher the level of support.

# KEY FINDINGS

- Voting Intention: Wildrose 39%, Prog. Con. 25%, Lib. 25%, NDP 9%, Other 2%
- Calgary: Wildrose 38%, Prog. Con. 23%, Lib. 30%, NDP 6%, Other 3%
- Edmonton: Wildrose 36%, Lib. 26%, Prog. Con. 25%, NDP 12%, Other 1%

From November 23 to November 29, 2009, Angus Reid Public Opinion conducted an online survey among 1,000 randomly selected Albertan adults who are Angus Reid Forum panelists. The margin of error—which measures sampling variability—is +/- 3.1%. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region Census data to ensure samples representative of the entire adult population of Alberta. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.

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That said, it should be noted that the Wildrose Alliance still leads with people in households that make less than \$50,000 a year.

Higher education is linked to voting for the Liberals. In fact, people with university degrees are one of the few segments in which the Liberals are ahead (38% to 30% for the Wildrose Alliance).

#### **Analysis**

A difficult economic year, coupled with the criticism levelled against the government for its handling of H1N1 vaccinations, has resulted in a noticeable level of dissatisfaction with the Progressive Conservatives. The Wildrose Alliance appears to have capitalized on this sentiment. However, at least two years will pass before the next election and the only thing that is certain is that a new volatility has entered Alberta politics.
