



One Million Pennies

The Spies Library Foundation Inc. continues its quest to collect one million pennies. 755,000 pennies have been collected to date! When one million pennies (\$10,000) have been collected, the funds will be invested in the Foundation endowment fund.

UNIQUE MANAGEMENT, INC.

In January of 2000, the Spies Public Library began to use a collection agency to encourage patrons with overdue materials to return them to the Library. The cost of the service is passed on to each patron whose account is handled by the collection agency. This decision was made with fairness to all library

patrons in mind. Materials not returned are not available for others to use or borrow. Also, if materials are not returned, in most cases, money from the library budget is used to replace them. This same money could be better used to purchase new items for patrons use instead of replacing non-

returned items. To date 465 accounts have been submitted for collection. The total dollar amount due from all accounts submitted for collection is \$36,023.81. 70% of patrons have responded due to the collection process with \$14,000 being recovered in actual money or value of material returned.

LINDA'S GARDEN

The Spies Public Library is the home of Linda's Garden. Linda's Garden is a children's garden that was designed to trigger the natural curiosity of a child's mind through literature and gardens. Linda's Gar-

den has continued to evolve over the years with the main goal of joining the forces of gardening and literature to fuel a child's curiosity and teach invaluable life lessons.
