INVITED SPEAKERS



Professor Allan House

Professor of Liaison Psychiatry, University of Leeds, UK

Allan House is Professor of Liaison Psychiatry and Director of the Leeds Institute of Health Sciences, UK. He is a member of a multi-disciplinary research group which undertakes research into

psychosocial aspects of physical illness. Current research is supported by (among others) Cancer Research UK, the Stroke Association, the NHS R+D (SDO) programme, MRC and ESRC. His main research interests are in psychiatric comorbidity complicating physical illness; unexplained medical presentations, and self-harm. In self-harm, He is conducting research into the patterns of hospital attendance and the link between self-harm and suicide. He is also studying the relation between self-harm and aggression. He is interested in developing research partnerships between academics and service users and carers. His unit works with a Service Users and Carers Research Interest Group, and employs mental health service users in research and evaluation of mental health services. He is a member of the Welcome Trust PPH Committee.



Professor Risto Näätänen

Professor of Cognitive Neuroscience, University of Tartu, Tartu, Estonia

Professor Risto Näätänen's main field of scientific interest is central auditory processing and its neural basis. In

1978, he and his colleagues found the mismatch negativity (MMN) brain response to auditory change that opened new perspectives to the electrophysiology of central auditory processing and sensory memory in audition. This response also has a large number of clinical and educational applications of which the most important involve schizophrenia and the prediction of the outcomes of coma and vegetative states. Prof. Näätänen has founded, and been the director of, the Cognitive Brain Research Unit of the University of Helsinki, for the last two decades until 2006. Currently he holds a professorship in cognitive neuroscience in the University of Tartu, Tartu, Estonia.



Professor Roger Mulder

Professor and Head of the Department of Psychological Medicine at the University of Otago, New Zealand

Roger Mulder is Professor and Head of the Department of Psychological Medicine at the University of Otago, Christchurch

and a Consultant Psychiatrist with the Consultation Liaison Service of the Canterbury District Health Board.

His academic interests include mood disorders, personality disorders, genetics, neurobiology, suicide, and early psychosis. He is also interested in the history and philosophy of psychiatry, particularly the classification of abnormal behaviour. He is also involved in research on the psychiatric aspects of medical illnesses.

He has published over 100 articles and is a reviewer for many international psychiatry journals. He is co-editor of the Journal of Personality and Mental Health and an associate editor for the Australian and New Zealand Journal of Psychiatry and the New Zealand Medical Journal.



Dr Paul Kenny

Assistant Professor,
Department of Molecular
Therapeutics,
The Scripps Research Institute,
Jupiter, FL, USA

Dr Paul Kenny heads a pre-clinical research group at the Scripps Research

Institute in Jupiter, Florida, USA. His research focus is alterations in reward processing during nicotine abstinence using animal models of brain reward function and nicotine self-administration. He has recently shown that the reward deficits associated with nicotine withdrawal can be assessed in mice using the intracranial self-stimulation procedure and his work highlights the potential utility of this approach for the testing of genetically modified mice to identify novel substrates of nicotine dependence and withdrawal processes. His work has also shown that self-administered nicotine may reset the sensitivity of reward systems to a new increased level. This action so far appears unique to nicotine amongst drugs of abuse, and may serve as a novel source of motivation that contributes to the persistence of the tobacco habit in human smokers.

CLINICAL WORKSHOP 1

Prof Allan House - Depression and Related Emotional Disorders in Physical Illness

THE WORKSHOP WILL EXPLORE THREE AREAS:

- What are the common emotional disorders associated with physical illness, and what is the most useful way of conceptualising and describing them?
- What is the relation between emotional and physical disorder, both in terms of cause and impact of the emotional disorder?
- 3. How near are we to developing effective interventions for this problem, which is far too common to be managed by referral to specialist mental health services?

Using examples drawn from the literature in a number of disease areas, but especially cardio and cerebrovascular disease, Prof House will discuss what we know and do not know in this seemingly simple but in fact quite complex area. Prof House hopes the process will be entertaining and informative, and the output will be a framework for thinking about clinical service provision and evaluation.

CLINICAL WORKSHOP 2 Prof Roger Mulder – Difficult To Treat Depression

THE WORKSHOP WILL EXPLORE FOUR AREAS:

- 1. Depressed patients with co-existing personality disorders
- 2. Depressed patients with significant suicidal behaviours
- Depressed patients with alcohol & drug problems
- 4. What is the natural history of treatment resistant depression?

Using examples drawn from case studies and the research activities of the Department of Psychological Medicine, University of Otago, Christchurch, New Zealand and other publications, Prof Mulder will lead an informative and interactive workshop covering many of the common areas of clinical difficulty in the treatment of depression.
