Scout Executive's Corner

I am proud to announce that 2009 was a fantastic year for the Samoset Council! We balanced our budget, grew our membership and increased the number of volunteers in our great council. While numbers are important, I think it is more important to measure our success by the difference we make in the lives of kids. This is often hard to measure

because Scouting is a journey and the results of our work are often not seen for many years.

However, I recently received a letter that I want to share with you which clearly shows the power of this great program. It is actually an essay by a young Scout written for school. The assignment was to write an essay about a "Hero" and tell why this person is a "Hero" to you. The essay reads:

At a Boy Scout summer camp (Camp Tesomas), I met a man who I became friends with. He is enthusiastic about Scouting, and is supportive towards others. He isn't employed at the camp though, he volunteers. He teaches 1st year Scouts how to build fire; handle sharp objects/pocket knives, helps them be physically fit and at night deals with medical issues of Scouts. This man's name is Ed Zahn, and he has been with this camp since he was 15 years old. He is now in his 80's. I met him my first year of Boy Scouts, when I was in a program that each first year Scout goes through, called Eagle Quest. Mr. Zahn is kind, is always happy, perseverant and never looks at the bad side of things; even in spite of his own family issues he has rarely spoken of (except to my mother). He was always willing to help others, even when it wasn't convenient for him. He taught me how to make a fire, in a pit, safely, and he helped me earn my Fireman's chit. When I have it with me, I am permitted to build a fire in a designated fire pit. He helped me understand and see the meaning in the ideals of Scouting and realize the beauty in every living thing. This is just something I would like to mention; he has been with the camp for a long time, almost since it opened, and so he was given a

road named after him. You couldn't research info on him, he is a hero to me. He has spent his life teaching Scouts how to be good hearted person, how to be physically fit, and has emphasized and explained the Scouting ideals. A hero isn't only a person who fought in a war, or invented a cure for a plague, or a person who caused a governmental reconstruction to better the "people", or any person who did something well known. People fail to recognize the heroes who do the small things, but when summed up, those small things aren't so small. Ed Zahn is the best example I have of a true hero.

This essay clearly demonstrates the impact this program has on children and the power of YOU, the volunteer. I want to thank Brian for taking the time to share this with us and I want to thank each of you for the time you spend on behalf of Scouting changing the lives of our children. Well Done!

Samoset Council, BSA 2009 Centennial Quality Council

Samoset Council is proud to announce, due to the hard work and efforts of the volunteers and staff at Samoset Council, BSA we have achieved the *Centennial Quality Council Recognition for 2009*! This achievement was highlighted by a balanced budget, an increase in new youth membership, and an overall increase in the quality of program delivered to youth. Samoset Council, BSA was only 1 of 2 Councils in the Central Region to have increased in the total number Cub Scouts in 2009.

Accordingly, some of the key features of the 2009 year included more than 1,000 new youth registering in the Scouting program during the months of September and October. Four out of the six Districts had 100% Unit Retention. The Crystal Lake District had nearly 8% of an increase in traditional youth membership. Additionally, the Ahdawagam District had nearly 4% growth in traditional youth membership for 2009. The Ojibwa District, the Northwoods District, the Mushkodany District, the Rib Mountain District, the Ahdawagam District and the Crystal Lake District all achieved Centennial Quality District for 2009. Furthermore, Samoset Council, BSA is currently only 1 of 3 Councils in Area 1 to have achieved Centennial Quality Council award for 2009. Finally, our year-round camp program had another great year with an attendance and participation of more than 6,000 youth and adults. The newly offered Webelos Fall Adventure Camp Program was a particularly great success with over 130 youth representing all of the Districts in attendance.

All of these great accomplishments could not been achieved without the support, time and dedication of all of you. The professional staff and the support staff of Samoset Council, BSA truly appreciates your continued help to ensure we increase the impact of the Scouting program in North Central Wisconsin. You are truly the heroes who lead us to becoming a great success in 2009. Thank you all very much for your work and efforts to keep us moving ahead in a very positive direction for 2010.

Preserving The Legacy

Samoset Council's Endowment Campaign

Samoset Council is proud to announce the final phase of the *Preserving The Legacy* Endowment Campaign. Our goal for the Endowment Campaign is to reach a total Endowment of \$10 million by the year 2011. Currently, the *Preserving The Legacy* Endowment Campaign has reached a total of \$7.2 million in cash gifts, pledges and estate gifts. The goal was determined by a recent feasibility study which outlined a new strategy and opportunities for Endowment growth. We are also pleased to announce we secured a total of \$728,000 of new Endowment gifts for 2009. Accordingly, for the fifth time in the last six years of this Campaign, Samoset Council, BSA will be recognized with the *National BSA Bronze Record* for our Endowment success.

In our effort to reach our final goal for the Endowment Campaign, we have officially formed an Endowment Committee which includes Patrick Wallschlaeger Chairman, Dr. Frederick Prehn Council President, Dr. Kevin Flaherty, Richard Rhyner, John Paprocki, Pete Knitt, Richard LaCerte and Tom Knudsen. These volunteers have agreed to devote their time and expertise to lead our efforts to secure the final \$2.8 million needed to reach our Endowment Campaign goal. Furthermore, now is a great time to become a donor and official supporter of this important Campaign. After all, the annual returns on investment from the Endowment Fund continue to generate nearly \$40,000 of support for Camp Maintenance projects, the Scouting Program Delivery and various outreach projects Samoset Council, BSA provides to all of the youth and families in Samoset Council, BSA. For example, as we ended 2009, \$14,000 from the annual return on investment from the Endowment Fund was allocated to support the much needed purchase of the new dishwasher at Camp Tesomas.

FROZE MY TOES 2010 - BOY SCOUT WINTER EVENT

This year's Boy Scout Winter Event will be held on February $5^{th}-7^{th}$ at North Wood County Park and Powers Bluff ski area. Come out and enjoy the fun with patrol events, the Snow Sports Merit Badge (to include both skiing and snowboarding), tubing, and so much more! Activities will begin at 8:30 AM on Saturday. Camping will be held both Friday and Saturday night at North Wood County Park. A hay ride will be provided to transport Scouts to and from Powers Bluff.

The Troops are to bring a can of soup for each participant for a group soup dump. 

CAMPERSHIP APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The **Tesomas Alumni Camping Trust** has been established to assist any youth with financial need to experience camping. To be eligible for this financial assistance, the youth must:

- 1. Be registered with the **Boy Scouts of America** and in good standing in his unit for at least 30 days prior to camp.
- 2. Demonstrate a need for financial assistance in order to attend camp.
- 3. Be recommended for this support by his unit leader.
- 4. Be approved by the Campership Committee.

Just as Scouting encourages one to "pay their own way" (a Scout is thrifty) each individual applicant should pay a portion of their own expense and their unit or chartered partner should also pay a portion of the camp cost. The applicant's parents and unit leader should sign the campership application committing their portion of the cost.

Applications for camperships must be made **in writing**, using the "Samoset Council Campership Application for Financial Aid" for each person. **Summer camp applications must be made before April 1st (or) winter camp before December 1st.**

After review of the campership application by the campership committee, a letter will be sent to the unit leader whose signature appears on the form informing them of the decision and of the amount (if any) that will be awarded to the individual applying.

This application for financial aid is to be completed, marked "CONFIDENTIAL", and sent to the Samoset Council, Boy Scouts of America, Attention: Campership Committee, 3511 Camp Phillips Road, Weston, WI 54476.

There must be no promise made to this applicant that a campership will be awarded. Allocations may not be awarded for the full amount requested if comparative need or total applications are in excess of available funding.




