The Lend-A-Hand Club for young women was begun in 1886. The Club offered young women living and working away from home opportunities for education and fellowship in a chaperoned environment. The Club occupied a variety of rented quarters in the downtown from which lecture series were offered and a ladies' waiting room operated before 1900. In 1922 funds were secured and a permanent building was erected on South Main Street. The building contained dormitory rooms, a lounge, an excellent cafeteria, and a swimming pool.

As an affiliate of the national network of Lend-A-Hand Clubs, the chapter motto was:

Look up, and not down

Look forward and not back

Look out, and not in

Lend a hand.

In the 1960's the building was closed as a women's facility. It was rented to the City of Davenport and converted to housing for the elderly in 1973. The Lend-A-Hand building at 105 South Main Street was razed in July of 1990.
