OUR ROLL OF HONOUR.

Great sorrow has been caused at King's College Hospital, Denmark Hill, by the news of the death of Sister Elise M. Kemp, of the Territorial Force Nursing Service. Sister Kemp, who was trained at King's College Hospital, and afterwards promoted to the position of Sister, was a great favourite with her colleagues, both at home and abroad. At the time of her death she was working at a Casualty Clearing Station in France, where she was killed instantaneously by the explosion of a bomb. We offer our sincere sympathy to her parents, Dr. and Mrs. Kemp, of Hastings, in their bereavement.

We regret to record the death, in Egypt, under tragic circumstances, of Sister E. K. Cooke, R.N., Q.A.I.M.N.S.R., who was killed on September 8th while attempting to cross the tram lines near Fleming. At the time of her death, Sister Cooke was attached to the 17th General Hospital, where she had worked faithfully for two years.

As soon as the war broke out, she came from New Zealand to join up in England, and for eight months served in France under the French

Flag Nursing Corps.

She is sincerely mourned by all with whom she worked in Egypt. The funeral took place the day following her death, in Hadra Cemetery, and was attended by the Matron-in-Chief, the Commanding Officer and other Medical Officers, the Matron and Sisters, the Chaplain and six patients from Sister Cooke's ward. The coffin was borne by officers to the grave side, and the service ended with the "Last Post." Many beautiful wreaths were placed on the coffin and around the grave.
