#### Historical Vaughan Wednesday, September 30, 1:00 p.m. - 4:30 p.m.


Early settlers began to settle in Vaughan in the late 1700's, although indigenous peoples inhabited the area since 9000 BC. Learn from experts at the City of Vaughan Cultural Services Division about the history of Vaughan and it's indigenous people. Our historical experts can talk about significant archaeological sites in Vaughan and interpretations from these excavations.

In addition you will learn about over 245 properties identified as Signifcant Heritage Structures under The Ontario Heritage Act.

Accompanied by knowledgeable historians, you will visit a number of key heritage sights in Vaughan and learn their history. Visit the home of Lord Beaverbrook, Thoreau MacDonald House and Vellore Village.









### A Taste of Vaughan Thursday, October 1, 11:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

Vaughan is home to many cultures and as many interesting food experiences. Today we will do the pasta, wine and cheese route. Begin your tour with a lesson in making home-made pasta. Be our guest in the kitchen of a genuine Italian Trattoria. Learn firsthand how to make pasta dough and roll gnocchi. Once the lesson is complete, enjoy the fruits of your labour with a wonderful Italian luncheon.

Following lunch we resume our tour with a visit to Magnotta Winery, which is also a Brewery and a Distillery. Learn firsthand from the renowned wine makers the great success Magnotta has enjoyed winning over 300 awards for it's wines. Sample as you go! Learn the secrets of great beer and how some of Canada's finest vodka is distilled. Visit the outlet store and marvel at the paintings that are featured on Magnotta labels. Our day finishes with a visit to Quality Cheese, a major cheese producer in Vaughan. Learn how many of the favourite cheeses enjoyed in Canada are produced.

Walk the path of McMichael to the small graveyard where the Group of Seven are buried and hear tales of murder, intrigue and curiosity that surrounded their lives.

Stroll picturesque Kleinburg and visit historical buildings specially opened for visiting CIB delegates.
