Razorbacks Go On the Road

For the first time this season the Arkansas baseball team takes a road trip, this one to Shreveport, La., to take on the Centenary Gents at Sheehee Stadium. The Razorbacks (9-2) are coming off a solid week where they went 4-1 with a two-game sweep of Valparaiso midweek and then taking two of three from Pac 10 power California. Centenary enters the contest 5-3 overall and swept a doubleheader from Jackson St. on Saturday. Game times for the mid-week series are 6 p.m. on Tuesday and 2 p.m. on Wednesday.

In the Cal series, the Razorbacks were forced to come from behind in game one, then were beat soundly in game two. Game three however witnessed the Arkansas bats come alive as the Hogs scored 13 runs on solid California pitching. Chase Leavitt would earn Southeastern Conference Player of the Week honors for his part as he went 9-12 in the series with two runs, two doubles, five walks, a stolen base and seven RBI. Ben Tschepikow also had a solid weekend at the plate as he went .385 for the three games and hit his third home run of the season, a bottom of the ninth, two-out shot into the Arkansas bullpen.

The Razorbacks should have a full compliment of pitchers at their disposal for the Centenary games as they used on two on Sunday afternoon. Sophomore Brett Eibner gets the starting nod on Tuesday looking for his second win of the season while Wednesday's starter is TBA and will likely be a committee approach.

Centenary hopes to build on last season's victory at Baum Stadium where it ended a 25-game losing streak to the Razorbacks. The Gents are throwing some of their best pitchers in their effort to take down Arkansas and create their own winning streak.

The Centenary series can be heard on the Razorback Baseball Network from ISP with Chuck Barrett handling the play-by-play duties.

The Razorbacks lost a pair of games with Western Illinois to the weather and hope to make up both contests to get to their threshold of 56 games, but as of now, no games have been placed in the books. Western Illinois could return to Fayetteville later in the year on their way to the Summit League Tournament in late May, but no dates have been set.

Cal Victories Improve Ranking

The Razorbacks 9-2 overall record in conjunction with their series victory over California last weekend has the Arkansas baseball team on the rise in terms of national rankings. *Baseball America*, who had the Hogs at No. 21 last week improved Arkansas' stock to No. 18, its highest ranking. *Rivals.com* moved the Razorbacks up to No. 21 and the Collegiate Baseball Writers placed Arkansas at No. 24. New this week was Arkansas' ranking in the USA Today/Coaches Ranking where they went from receiving votes to No. 20.

Scouting the Gents

Centenary has struggled at the plate this season which is what has cost them some wins and brought their record to 5-3 this season. They are coming off a double-header sweep of Jackson State on March 7 and used solid starting pitching to dispatch of their opponent.

Offensively, Centenary is led by the terrific trio of Ricky Imperiali, Tell Ross and Jomar Tabor who are each hitting better than .375. Unfortunately for the Gents, the remainder of the team is at .276 or below and eight players reside under .215.

Centenary's strength is in their pitching as the Gents have amassed a 3.28 ERA over their eight games. Midweek starters Boone Whiting and Stephen Tromblee are 2-1 respectively on the Centenary stats for earned run average with Whiting allowing just one earned run in 10.2 innings of work and Tromblee having yet to surrender an earned run.

The All-Time Series

The Razorbacks and Gents have played 37 times over the years and every year since 1999. Arkansas is 30-7 in the all-time series including a 25-game win streak that was broken last season when Centenary got the best of Arkansas at Baum Stadium, 5-1.

A Look at the Razorbacks' Rotation

Tuesday - Brett Eibner, RHP (1-1, 4.26 ERA) - Eibner has looked very good on the mound in two starts this season. Victim of a pitch count in his first start against Kansas, he came back against Valparaiso and threw very well to earn his first victory of the season. Eibner was a fourth round draft pick of the Houston Astros in the 2007 draft and possesses an overpowering fastball with movement and a sharp curve.

Wednesday - TBA - The Razorbacks have yet to name a Wednesday starter and probably won't until after Tuesday's contest. With the opening weekend of Southeastern Conference play beginning this weekend, the Razorback coaches will likely be careful who they use during the midweek series.

The Razorback Pitching Staff

As a whole, the Razorback pitching staff has done one thing very well and that is get the ball over the plate. Through 11 games the Razorbacks have walked only 29 batters which ranks No. 4 in the Southeastern Conference.

SEC Player of the Week

Thanks to a once-in-a-lifetime weekend, senior Chase Leavitt was named the Southeastern Conference's Player of the Week on March 9. Leavitt was a thorn in California's side as he reached base in 14 of 17 plate appearances and cracked nine hits against the Bears. His startling numbers included nine hits, five walks, two runs, two doubles, a stolen base and seven RBI. He also came through with the game-winning hit on Sunday afternoon and set career bests with four hits and five RBI.



The Catalyst

Chase Leavitt proved once again why he is the catalyst of the Razorback offense against the Cal Bears. He works the count, lets his teammates get a look at the pitcher, walks and hits better than .350. In fact, Leavitt is currently hitting .419 and has on on-base percentage of .537.

Leavitt Remains at the Top of the Lineup

Senior Chase Leavitt was a player that not many people noticed at the beginning of the 2008 season, but the Utah native was on everyone's mind by the time the NCAA Regional came. Leavitt led the Razorbacks with a .366 average last season and hit .388 in Southeastern Conference play. Arkansas' catalyst at the top of the order, Leavitt's plate discipline earned him 41 walks, 13 hit by pitches and a team high .518 on-base percentage.

Preseason All-SEC

Rivals.com and *SEBaseball.com* each named Chase Leavitt one of its preseason All-SEC picks. Leavitt led the Razorbacks in hitting last season with a .366 average and was a valuable part of what the Hogs accomplished in their run to a NCAA Regional. *Rivals.com* had Leavitt on its one and only All-SEC team while *SEBaseball.com* placed Leavitt on its second team.

Cardiac Kids

The 2009 Arkansas baseball team has a flare for the dramatic to say the least. They have been behind or tied in the eighth inning or later six times this season and have come back to win four of those games. The Razorbacks have delivered two walk-off home runs, a game-ending triple and a squeeze bunt to pull out their victories and have even received a two-out home run in the bottom of the ninth to tie a game and force extra innings.

Smyly Earning His Spot in the Rotation

Arkansas' coaches thought very highly of Drew Smyly when they brought him to campus last season, but an elbow fracture required surgery and sidelined the Little Rock native for a year. Back and healthy, Smyly is proving his worth as the redshirt freshman has started three games, holds a 1-0 record and has allowed just two earned runs in 13.2 innings for a 1.32 ERA. Along with those impressive numbers, hitters are batting just .212 against him.

The Back End Anchor

The Razorbacks feel that their bullpen is much improved over last year and a key component to that is a healthy Stephen Richards. Over his first five appearances, Richards has been lights out on the mound with 10 innings pitched and no earned runs allowed. He has struck out 10 batters, walked two and allowed only four hits. He did get touched up for one run and a blown save when a batter that he struck out with two outs reached on a passed ball.



Record Crowds

Its only been two weeks of college baseball and the Razorbacks are already setting attendance records. The season opened with Arkansas' largest opening day crowd against Washington St. and continued into the Cal series where the Razorbacks set records for largest paid and actual non-conference series attendance. In the Friday night opener of the series, the 17th largest actual attendance (8,426) watch Arkansas pull out a dramatic victory including more than 1,800 University of Arkansas students.

Playing His Way Into the Lineup

Redshirt freshman Collin Kuhn has impressed the Razorback coaches since the start of the fall and his numbers this season give credence to the fact that the Arkansas coaches need to find him a permanent position. Kuhn is batting .286 with eight runs scored, a double, five RBI, seven walks, three hit by pitches, two sacrifice bunts and a stolen base.



And By the Way

We spoke about Collin Kuhn's numbers at the plate, but we should also point out that he can play some defense as well. Against Cal, Kuhn threw out a would be run at home plate from left field to pick up Arkansas' first outfield assist of the season. The assist was the first by a Razorback outfielder since May 19, 2008 when Casey Coon threw out a Western Illinois runner.

Arkansas' Recruiting Class Among the Nation's Elite

The Razorbacks have a large class of freshmen and transfers this season, but the recruiting prognosticators feel good about what Arkansas is bringing to the field. *Baseball America* named Arkansas' recruiting class the No. 8 class in the nation and tabbed true freshmen Zack Cox and Jarrod McKinney as the No. 72 and No. 157 prospects, respectively.

Tschepikow Has Brilliant Week

If not for the unreal weekend of fellow senior Chase Leavitt, Ben Tschepikow could have easily been the SEC Player of the Week. Tschepikow batted over .400 over the five games, scored six runs and drove in six more. In the Cal series he hit .385 and was instrumental in Arkansas' first-game victory when he popped a home run over the left-field wall with two outs in the bottom of the ninth to force extra innings.



Arkansas Captains

An almost unanimous vote by the Razorback players and coaches determined Arkansas' 2009 captains and the honors went to seniors Chase Leavitt and Ben Tschepikow. Leavitt is in just his second year with the Razorback program, but was Arkansas' leading hitter last season and was an above average defender despite taking on a new position. Tschepikow is in his fifth year with the Razorbacks and continues to improve. Healthy for the entire season for the first time in his five years, Tschepikow hit better than .300 and was a fixture at second base.

Tough To Steal On

Arkansas' pitchers and catchers are tough to steal on and the proof is in the numbers. The Razorbacks have allowed just six stolen bases in 13 attempts this season and have picked off two runners. Ryan Cisterna has thrown out four would-be base stealers while understudy James McCann has thrown out three.

Eibner First Freshman to Lead Razorbacks in RBI Since . . .

Brett Eibner quietly led the Razorbacks in RBI last season when he drove in 48 runs. The significance of that feat is that he became the first true freshman to lead Arkansas in RBI since former Major Leaguer Jeff King drove in 55 runs during the 1984 season.

**Eibner Named Freshman All-American**

A huge miss in the media guide this season was the fact that Brett Eibner was a first-team *Baseball America* Freshman All-American. Eibner was slotted into the utility spot by *Baseball America* based on his pitching and outfield play.

Game-Winning Hit

Brett Eibner has struggled at the plate in the early going, but seemed to bust out of that slump against Western Illinois as he was patient and effective, going 2 for 2 with two walks and the game-winning triple in the 10th. A hot Eibner at the plate could be what Arkansas needs to get on a roll.

A Player to Watch

The online publication *SEBaseball.com* went through its list of players to watch this season and named Brett Eibner as one of the six players it looked at. Eibner, a former fourth round pick of the Houston Astros as a pitcher, blossomed last season as a defender and at the plate and has looked solid all fall with added muscle and awareness.

Baseball America Projections

In their string of prospect projections this winter *Baseball America* has mentioned Brett Eibner a couple of times. He was tabbed as the No. 5 projected prospect in the SEC for the 2010 draft in the publications SEC preview. He was also the No. 28 sophomore prospect in their list of the top players in the country.

Pre-Season Conference Finishes

The Razorbacks have been a unanimous choice so far to finish fourth in SEC West by the SEC coaches, *SEBaseball.com* and *Baseball America*. In fact, the top four spots in each projected order have been LSU, Ole Miss, Alabama, Arkansas. The SEC coaches' projections are included on page 7 of this release.

Cox Named One That Got Away

Freshman Zack Cox was tabbed as one of the top prospects in the nation that "got away" from Major League Baseball according to *Baseball America's* Nov. 3 issue. Cox, a 20th round pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 2008 First Year Player Draft, was named the No. four prospect that chose to attend college rather than play in professional baseball.

**A Prospect to Keep Tabs On**

Like Brett Eibner, Zack Cox has also been placed on a pair of *Baseball America* prospect lists. He was tabbed the No. 4 newcomer in the SEC in the publications SEC preview and the No. 5 freshman prospect overall.

Baum Stadium Named Top Collegiate Facility in the Country

In a ranking released in late October, Baum Stadium was named the best collegiate stadium in the country by *Rivals.com*. The online publication called Baum Stadium "the palace of college baseball stadiums" and mentioned that many schools who are building stadiums are attempting to catch Arkansas' gem which was built in 1994 and has been renovated several times since its initial construction.
