Anna Yin

Anna Yin is a gifted writer who has won several poetry contests including the Ted Plantos' Memorial Award from T.O.P.S. in 2005. In 2006, she was selected as the feature poet by the Canadian Federation of Poets and in 2007; her works in translation were chosen for a Canadian Studies' textbook used by the students at Humber College. Her work *Toronto, No More Weeping* has also been featured on CBC Radio.



Benjamin Thornton

Benjamin Thornton is a unique Canadian writer. He is the author of *The Ideal Candidate*, the only novel he knows of that satirizes that hotbed of political intrigue: the city of Mississauga. As a poet and artist, Meena Chopra has held several exhibitions internationally. She represented India at the SARC Artists meet, and also represented Canada in India at the International Hindi Literature Meet. As a poet in English and Hindi, her first book of verse, *Ignited Lines* was published in 1996. Meena received an Honourable Mention for her poetry from the Mississauga Library System. She also co-founded Cross Currents, with a mission of embracing diverse culture through art.
