
The Directed Energy (DE) Systems Symposium focuses on systems aspects of DE in a limited-attendance environment. The Sixth DE Systems Symposium consists of co-located technical sessions organized by five separate conferences, with joint technical and plenary sessions to encourage discussion outside narrow technical limits. The objective of this year's symposium is to provide a forum for the interchange of ideas and to focus on near term demonstrations of DE technology. [Previous Symposia](#) were also held in Monterey.

Some portions of the Symposium will be conducted at the Secret level. Attendance at all sessions will be limited to U.S. citizens with security clearances and who are employees of the U.S. Government or its contractors.

Tour of NPS Directed Energy Facilities

A tour of Naval Postgraduate School DE facilities will be available again this year. The tour will include the beam control facilities, hosted by Professor Brij Agrawal. The tour will last 45 minutes to an hour; space will be limited to 25 persons.

Proceedings

With the exception of the HEL Lethality Conference, all conferences of the Systems Symposium will publish properly marked and released presentations and papers in a combined proceedings for the Directed Energy Systems Symposium. To allow for the maximum distribution of the technical data, the Systems Symposium will generate five sets of proceedings covering the various combinations of Classification and Distributions (A, C, and D). The HEL Lethality Conference plans to issue a proceeding that consists of papers only (formal manuscripts, not presentations or posters). Based on prior year's experience, this proceeding will be classified Secret/NOFORN and will be limited distribution D.

Location and Accommodations

Sessions of the Symposium will be held at the [Naval Postgraduate School](#) (NPS) and at the [Hyatt Regency Monterey](#). Directions to these sites are available through their web pages. Both of the sites consist of multiple buildings. A map of the location of sessions on NPS and at the hotel will be available on site for registrants. A schematic view of the hotel looking south from a position high over NPS is available through the virtual tour on the hotel welcome page.

A block of rooms at government rates for all attendees has been reserved at the Hyatt Regency Monterey. To take advantage of these rates, call the hotel at 831 372-1234 and mention that you are attending this DEPS meeting. Make your reservation early; the room block expires well before the Symposium. The hotel enforces a 48-hour cancellation policy.

The Hyatt and NPS are within close walking distance. Although a shuttle bus will be available, most Symposium attendees have chosen to walk between venues. Private auto access to NPS is restricted, and parking is extremely limited.

The Tuesday evening reception, with light hors d'oeuvres, will be at the Monterey Bay Aquarium. Wednesday evening's Exhibit reception will be at the Hyatt.

Companions

Please note that some sessions at the Symposium are likely to be covered by Distribution Limitation D, which restricts participation in those sessions to employees of the U.S. Department of Defense or its contractors. If you do not meet this requirement, you will be unable to attend such sessions, even though you have a classified visit request on file.

Note: Registered companions and exhibit staff who do not attend program sessions do not have to meet these security requirements.

Submission Instructions

General information on the submission of abstracts, presentations, and papers is provided below. Specific information on sending presentations and papers differs for each conference and can be [found here](#). *Note that it is the responsibility of the lead author to obtain all approvals and releases for submitted abstracts, presentations, and papers. All submitted materials, including unclassified presentations, must be appropriately marked for security classification and distribution restrictions.*

Abstracts

Note that abstracts are still being accepted for all conferences.

All persons wishing to present at the Directed Energy Systems Symposium must submit an abstract. Extended abstracts (between 500-100 words) are encouraged to allow the author to fully describe their planned presentation/paper. Abstracts must be unclassified and should include: presentation title, a complete description of the presentation/paper, author's names/organizations, lead author contact information, expected classification of the presentation/paper as well as the expected distribution restrictions.

Abstracts should be [submitted online by completing this form](#). Questions about abstract submittal may be directed to [David Loomis](#).

Authors will be notified in early February of acceptance of their paper for presentation and/or publication. Additional instructions for submitting classified papers and presentations will be provided at that time.

Presentations

In order to assemble the presentations for the conference in a timely manner, authors are requested to submit the sponsoring Program Office approved version of classified and unclassified presentations **no later than 11 March 2011**. Any presentation received after this date is subject to not being presented at the discretion of the conference technical committee.

Authors are requested to submit presentations on electronic media (CDs preferred) per [instructions provided here](#). Please contact your [Conference Chair](#) if you have any questions on submitting your presentation.

Papers

All conferences of the Systems Symposium encourage papers to be submitted as well as presentations. These should be written in the [DEPS conference paper format](#). Authors are reminded that papers are also of interest to the [Journal of Directed Energy](#) editors as manuscripts, and that the opportunity to publish in the DEPS Journal has now been expanded to classified material. This provides authors an opportunity to publish classified as well as unclassified articles in a referred journal.

Papers are due on or before **25 March 2011** and should be submitted in either Microsoft Word format (preferred) or Adobe Acrobat format (PDF file). Specific format instructions are described on the [DEPS conference paper format](#) page. Include full information (including address, phone, fax, and email) for corresponding author. It is the authors' responsibility to ensure that the paper has not been published, nor under consideration, elsewhere. Papers will be submitted according to instructions per [instructions provided here](#). Again, please contact your [Conference Chair](#) if you have any questions on submitting your paper.

Release Forms

Release forms will be required for all papers and presentations submitted to the conferences of the 2011 DE Systems Symposium. These Microsoft Word release forms can be completed electronically, then printed for signature and submission. *It is the responsibility of the lead author to obtain all approvals and releases for submitted presentations and papers.* Submission instructions are provided on the form itself. Forms are due at the same time as the corresponding presentation/paper. **Note that poster papers are considered presentations and the presentation release form should be used in those cases.**

Distribution

Distribution statements of technical documents must be identified in accordance with DoD Directive 5230.24, Paragraph 6. Papers with distribution statements A, C, D, and X are encouraged to facilitate publication of the technical data in the proceedings.

All presentations must have an authorized distribution statement on the first page. Presentations containing Distribution Statements B and E will not be presented at the DE Systems Symposium.

All papers must have an authorized distribution statement on the first page. Papers containing Distribution Statements B, E, and F will not be published in the DE Systems Symposium proceedings.
