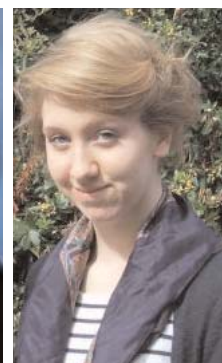
## ■ Riverwalk School's Spanish Day
