DUTY - YOU WILL DO AT LEAST ONE HOUR AS DUTY PERSON AFTER YOUR PROGRAM.
DON'T SAY YOU DIDN'T KNOW YOU HAD TO DO DUTY.

CARTS, CASSETTES - Put them back into their respective cases/boxes in numerical sequence. Don't leave them all higgledy-piggledy. Clean up before you leave, most especially at the close of the day. The duty person is just as much to blame as the presenter.

Numerous examples of bad housekeeping occurred during our last test - it won't happen again - WILL IT.

You must play the promo's and financial supporters cassettes logged. This is a must, failure to comply means that you don't get a program next time.

CARTS must be allowed to run until they stop of their own accord. Do NOT stop any cart under any circumstances, unless the cart does not stop at the cue pulse, in this instance, remove the cart from the studio and report the matter in the studio report book (DIARY).

JANUARY 1989

This being our first Newsletter for 1989 gives me the opportunity to wish all our members the compliments of the season, and hopes that 1989 is going to be a very fruitful year for S.E.R., however lets recap a little about 1988.

We had another 3 successful test transmissions thanks to all concerned, most especially to our Technical, Production and Programming experts. The Programming side has seen our program sub-committee set up a system of co-ordinators. (These are the people responsible for presenters in various groups). This system shares the workload as well as making it easier for presenters to have direct access to the one responsible for the quality as well as program time allocations. Technical and production could do with more people interested in those areas. Training has progressed quite well, but more people interested in being Training Instructors would be grabbed with both hands.

"IN-HOUSE" has had a few hiccups, but I am pleased to say that we have more presenters in this field.

1988 saw a number of Commercial and Community Radio Stations in strife for not meeting their quota of AUSTRALIAN CONTENT. The absolute minimum Aussie content for EACH day, is 20%, in which MUST be included 5% Australian compositions.

This means, in effect that every 20 records played, 4 MUST be Australian, one of which must be an Australian composition.

If you only have, say 15 tracks in the hour, 3 WILL be by Australian performers, and one of the three WILL be an Aussie composition.

The A.B.T. make no exceptions. Religious, Multi-cultural, Modern, Contemporary, Country, Jazz, Nostalgia, etc MUST conform. No conform - No program.

For 1987/88, here are some interesting figures:
