Well how time has flown. It does not seem like 25 years since the Wagga to Albury Road Race was revived. It was at a meeting of the Lavington Sports Club Cycling Club that a decision was made to revive the Wagga to Albury Cycling Classic. At that meeting were Wayne Nichols, Kerry Garland, Bill Forge, Reg Garland, Laurie Burns, Jack Sommer, Ken Payne, John Woodman and Greg Featonby. It was decided the race be a Group Handicap of 4 bunches, and \$1700 in prizemoney allocated. On the 4th of June 1986 the race set out from the Tolland Hotel car park with 96 entries, and has since gone on to become one of the few point-to-point races left on the Australian cycling calendar, attracting some of the best road cyclists in Australia. Prior to 1986, the Wagga to Albury was first run in the 1930s, leaving the Wagga Railway Station and travelling via Tarcutta and Holbrook to finish outside the Globe Hotel in Albury. In 1948 the race was changed to run via the Olympic Way and finish in Dean St. It ran this way until its conclusion in 1963, when local rider Jack Sommer took out fastest time. The race is now known as the John Woodman Memorial Wagga to Albury Cycling Classic after John was killed on the 1st of October 1986 at Table Top, whilst training in preparation for the up and coming Sun Tour. This race would never of been possible without the support of the many sponsors we have had throughout the years, the club members and their families who have driven lead cars, stood on corners in the rain, or supported the riders in this great event which we hope will continue for many more years to come. 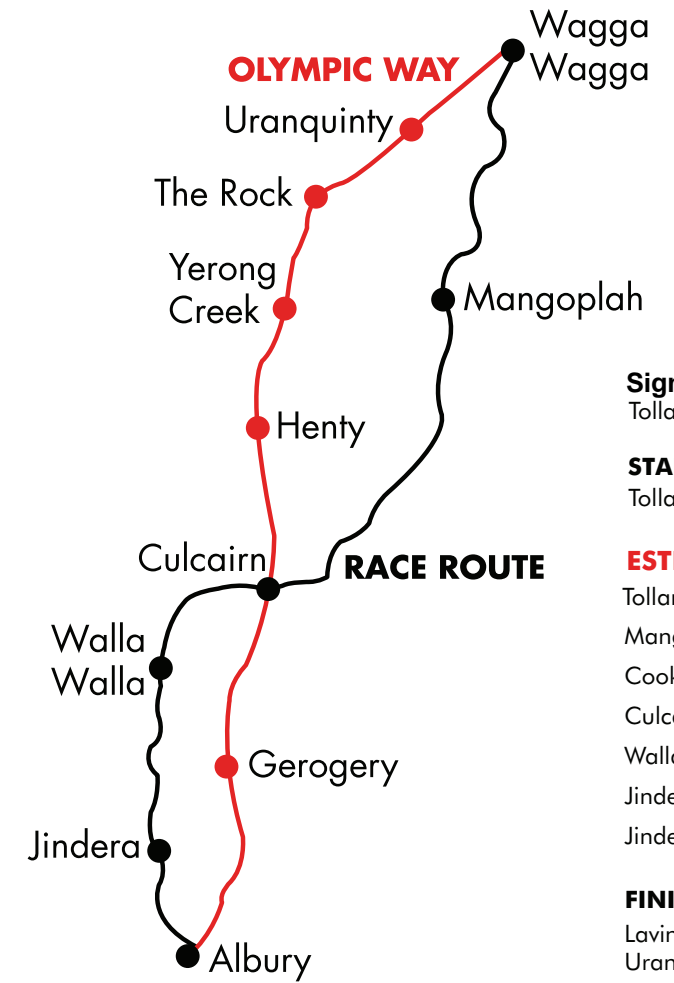
OUTSIDE TAKES ON THE CHAMP
