

Compton Invitational Founder Will Retire

Herschel C. Smith, founder and director of the annual Compton Invitational track and field meet for the past 33 years, has announced his retirement from active management of the athletic classic he organized in 1936.

Smith formally announced his decision to the Southern California Track Writers Association at their weekly meeting, but added that he will remain in an advisory capacity for this year's meet.

The Compton/Coliseum Invitational again will be held in early June at Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.

Smith 65 first gained athletic prominence as a sprinter at San Fernando High School in the early 1920s, winning Southern California and state honors.

Despite recurring leg injuries, he was a standout at The University of Southern California for four years, running on a relay foursome which set world 800-meter and 880-yard records in 1927.

Smith began coaching at Compton College (then a combined junior college and high school) in 1928 and directed track teams there with tremendous success until 1960.

After a 33-year coaching career, he continued eight more years in an administrative capacity before winding up a 41-year tenure in 1968.
