5 YEAR ACTION PLAN FOR THE HEALESVILLE LIBRARY



SUSTAINABILITY

- Seek funding to update the children's library area to reflect the cultural significance of Healesville and surrounding areas.
- Ensure the Library is an integral part of the Community Link and continues to work closely with community groups, including those who are co-located.
- Enhance the integration of the Community Link and the Library to provide seamless customer service.
- Promote the use of the online library throughout Healesville and surrounding areas.



LIFE LONG LEARNING

- Develop a partnership between Council's Youth Services and Eastern Regional Libraries Corporation (ERLC) to develop a homework support group to meet at the Library.
- Investigate the potential to develop a stronger partnership with learning organisations to extend opportunities for life long learning.
- Explore partnerships to develop a digital installation of artworks reflecting Healesville and the surrounding areas' heritage.
- Continue to expand early years services, including literacy programs and develop a strong relationship with local playgroups and early childhood education centres.



ACCESS FOR ALL

- Work with co-located key partners to promote community well being.
- Work with the Yarra Ranges Neighbourhood House Group and other community service providers to promote the benefits of the Library to the Healesville community.
- Develop a resource plan to increase the availability of popular current titles through the provision of hard copy and downloadable materials.
- Seek funding to have more audio and large print resources available.



INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- Develop a youth centred marketing campaign highlighting the benefits of online information resources and library services.
- Increase the number of PCs and investigate the potential for other IT resources.
- Use the technology available to cross promote Council, ERLC and community events occurring within the municipality.
