CALDAY GRANGE TRUST

The School has received notification from Companies House that the Calday Grange Trust Company has been dissolved. This has been notified to the Governing Body who have contacted Wirral Local Authority and indicated their wish to revert to the Foundation Schools Instrument of Government. Once this is approved by the Authority a vacancy will arise for a Staff Governor and this will be advertised in the usual way. There will also be a vacancy for a Community Governor. Community Governors can be people who live or work in the community served by the school, or people who do not work or live close to the school but are committed to the good governance and success of the school.

EXAMINATION RESULTS

A LEVEL

We congratulate our students on an excellent set of results which has included our first ever cohort of International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme students.

The maximum score for the IB is 45 points and this year just over seventy students worldwide achieved the maximum points. Notable highlights at Calday include the following students; Chris Yarrow (42 points) will be reading Law at Oxford, Rhys Eden (41 points), Theology at Oxford, Jonathan Campbell (39 points), PPE at Oxford, Rohan Gokhale, (39 points), Maths at Warwick and Luke Devlin, (38 points), Economics at Lancaster.

Our A2 students have also excelled. We saw percentage increases in our A*-As, A*-B and A*-E categories, (excluding General Studies); four subjects achieved 60% or more A*-As including Further Maths, Art, Electronics and Latin. Outstanding individual achievements are the sixteen students who gained 4 A*-A combined, amongst these are Philip Littler and Joe

GCSE

The staff and governors would like to congratulate all students who sat their GCSEs here at Calday Grange Grammar School. We are delighted with the improvement in the new EBacc, eclipsing last year's success with 85.5% of our students achieving this benchmark which is built around the core subjects of Science, Mathematics, English Humanities and a language; a glowing tribute to the students and recognition of the diverse and challenging curriculum we offer at Calday.

The average number of A*-C grades per student was 10.3 and 98% of the cohort attained 5 or more A*-C grades including English and Mathematics. We also celebrate successes in Chinese where 48% of students gained an A*; in Russian where 84% of students were awarded A*-A and in Music and Art where more than 76% of students gained A* or A grades.

Individual successes include 28 students who gained more than 10 A*/ A grades and within this distinguished cohort, Matthew Kemp who was awarded 12A* grades.

Well done to all students in Year 11 who should be very proud but a special mention has to go to the incredible Matthew Cullen, the inspiration of the LeJog Campaign which has raised over £140k for research into childhood cancers. Matthew has won so many battles in the last two years, not only starting and finishing the relay from Lands End to John O Groats but also achieving 9A*/A grades in his 11 GCSEs; dreams can become a reality.

WIRRAL INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL AWARDS

At the end of last term, The Wirral International School Awards were held at Wallasey Town Hall. The award categories were divided into Primary and Secondary Schools with the winners picking up the Wirral International School Award, Making Tomorrow's World A Better Place as Global Citizens Award and the Enterprise Award.

Pupils from each school gave presentations on their international work to a panel. The participating schools were Christ Church CE (Birkenhead) Primary School, Ladymount Catholic Primary School, Sandbrook Primary School, The Lyndale School, Townfield Primary School, Woodlands Primary School, Wirral Hospital School, Calday Grange Grammar School, Hilbre High School, Prenton High School for Girls, The Mosslands School, Upton Hall School, Weatherhead High School, Wirral Grammar School for Boys and Wirral Grammar School for Girls.

Our students did us proud and won the Wirral International School Award. Many congratulations to all students to took part.

INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL AWARD

We are delighted to inform parents that the school has been successful in gaining the International School Award and is now accredited for three year from September 2011. The International School Award which is offered by the British Council is an accreditation framework for schools to record and evaluate their international work and embed it into the curriculum and whole school ethos. We would like to thank staff from the Languages Department, in particular, Mr Jackson, for helping us achieve this outstanding award.

PARKING

You may recall that in our July newsletter we informed parents and students that Wirral Council had introduced new parking restrictions on Grammar School Lane and surrounding areas in March this year. Whilst we understand the council's reasons for applying the restrictions, we are now faced with addressing how we can reduce the considerable additional pressures this has put on staff, many of whom now spend valuable time each morning searching for a place to park which is often a distance away from the school.

We explored a series of options, including the possibility of utilising the green space adjacent to the sports pavilion on Grammar School Lane. We have been advised that we would not be able to obtain planning permission for this and therefore a decision was made to designate all parking facilities within the school grounds as 'staff parking only' with effect from the start of this term. Could we please ask parents to remind their son/daughter that they are now unable to park on the school grounds. We understand that this will be disappointing for some students however, it was felt it was important to address the needs of staff parking as a priority.

CONGESTION & SAFETY

Could we please ask parents to avoid dropping-off their children at the bottom of the school steps, as this causes unnecessary congestion in the car park. Grammar School Lane also becomes congested, especially at the beginning and end of the day with buses arriving and departing. A major problem is caused by parents setting down and collecting boys from Grammar School Lane. The Parents' Association, in conjunction with the School and the Road Safety Authorities, has requested that parents do not set down or pick up their children in the proximity of the school and certainly not in the areas with zig-zag road markings. To do so may be to cause serious traffic congestion and endanger lives".

Sixth Form students with cars are also reminded that they should respect our neighbours and in particular should not park in Bramhall Close or Calday Grange Close. Your co-operation in this matter would be greatly appreciated. Could we please also ask that parents defer from making arrangements to pick up and drop off their children in either of these roads.
