

PROFILE AND TRANSCRIPT SUPPLEMENT

PENNSBURY SCHOOL DISTRICT

In the southeastern corner of Pennsylvania, along the great bend of the Delaware River, lies Bucks County. In the extreme southeastern corner of Bucks County lie the four political subdivisions whose jointure for school purposes led to the formation of the Pennsbury School District. Yardley Borough is a typical small Bucks County municipality that has retained much of its early American charm and beauty. Lower Makefield Township is a predominantly suburban residential area. The site of the major early expansion in the area was Falls Township. The Keystone Industrial Port Complex, all of the homes in Fairless Hills, and some of the homes in Levittown are in this township. The last of the four sections that make up the district is Tullytown Borough. This small borough was part of the Penn Manor Tract in the early 1700's.

With an enrollment of approximately 11,000, the Pennsbury School District currently has 11 elementary schools (K-5), three middle schools (6-8), and one high school.

PENNSBURY HIGH SCHOOL

Pennsbury High School, located in Fairless Hills, is a four-year comprehensive high school with an approximate enrollment of 3,500.

Students from Pennsbury High School may attend a comprehensive Vocational Technical School.

The core instructional program at the high school consists of English, Social Studies, Math, Physical Education and Science.

Pennsbury High School operates on an intensive, or block, schedule. In one given marking period, a student takes four 87-minute class periods. Classes are nine weeks or eighteen weeks, with the exception of AP Physics B, which is 27 weeks in length. One- credit courses are eighteen weeks, and half-credit courses are nine weeks.

THE FACULTY AND STAFF

The professional staff at Pennsbury High School numbers 255, which includes professional staff, administrators, librarians, eleven school counselors, and two school nurses.

ACCREDITATION

Pennsbury High School is fully accredited by the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS

All students are encouraged to participate in extra-curricular activities, which are primarily held after school.
