What is a Cambridge International A Level?

International A Level is one of the most popular academic qualifications around the world for 16-19 year olds. International A Level is accepted as proof of academic ability for entry to universities worldwide.

International A Level gives students in-depth subject knowledge and lifelong skills that prepare them for success in higher education and employment.

Cambridge International A Levels typically take two years to complete and offer a flexible course of study that gives learners the freedom to select the subjects that are right for them.

Cambridge International AS Level

Cambridge International AS Level is typically taken at the mid-point of an A Level programme and is optional. AS Level has half the value of an A Level.

Schools can offer AS Level as a qualification in its own right to increase breadth in the curriculum and allow students to complement other subjects they are studying.

Structure

Schools and students find A and AS Levels very flexible. Schools can offer almost any combination of the wide choice of subjects available.

Learners have the freedom to select the subjects that are right for them - either to follow a broad course of study, or specialise in a particular area.

Learners will commonly take three International A Levels and one International AS Level.

Global popularity

Cambridge International A/AS Level students with good passes gain admission to the world's top universities. Cambridge International A/AS Level is recognised by universities as the equivalent – gradefor-grade – of UK A Level.

Cambridge International A/AS Level is available in over 100 countries. In the US, state schools in Florida are using the Cambridge programme to raise academic standards. This has resulted in

undergraduates at the University of Florida who have Cambridge qualifications, out-performing IB and Advanced Placement students at the end of their first year.

In New Zealand, growing numbers of schools are choosing Cambridge International A Levels as an alternative to the national system.

Singapore Cambridge A Level is the state qualification in Singapore. Singapore learners top many education league tables.

How does International A Level differ from UK A Level?

The programme is significantly different in that it is a linear, rather than a modular, course, with examinations taken at the end.

Cambridge International A/AS Level is designed for a worldwide student body.
