Playing for Seeds and Regional Hosts

Having clinched a spot at the SEC Tournament last weekend, the No. 16 Arkansas baseball team is playing for its seed this weekend as well as a potential NCAA Regional host when it faces No. 9 Ole Miss in a three-game series at Baum Stadium beginning on Thursday night, May 14, at 6:35 p.m. The series continues on Friday at 6:35 p.m. on what is Fireworks Night, and concludes on Saturday at 2:05 p.m. on Senior Day.

The Razorbacks (32-17, 14-12 SEC) are coming off a thrilling 3-2 victory over Oral Roberts on Tuesday, but are really hoping to bounce back from three bitter defeats at Alabama last weekend and build momentum heading into the third season. The Rebels (37-15, 17-10 SEC) also enter this weekend set trying to overcome adversity as they dropped two of three from in-state rival Miss. St. last weekend at home and are without their No. 1 pitcher Scott Bittle.

Arkansas rebounded from their losses at Alabama on Tuesday by defeating Oral Roberts on a two-out, bottom of the ninth double by Scott Lyons. The shot to left-center field cleared the bases and brought Arkansas back from a 2-0 deficit. A character building victory, the Razorback coaching staff hopes it restores the confidence in the team needed to face another top 10 team.

Ole Miss is the fifth top 10 team that Arkansas has faced this season and the Razorbacks have stepped up to their competition, posting a 5-4 record against those opponents. The series also marks the eighth, ninth and 10th games against ranked opponents in Arkansas' last 11 contests.

The Rebels are built similar to the Razorbacks in that solid pitching and timely hitting are their keys to success. Ole Miss also remembers what happened last season in Oxford, Miss., when the Razorbacks used the long ball to dispatch the Rebels in a Saturday doubleheader, taking two of three from the home squad.

The Ole Miss series can be heard on the Razorback Baseball Network from ISP with Chuck Barrett handling the play-by-play duties.

Razorbacks Drop in National Polls

Arkansas' sweep at the hands of Alabama hurt the Razorbacks in the national polls. Ranked from #16 to #20 in the polls, the Razorbacks dropped six spots or more in the national rankings with Baseball America even removing Arkansas from its top 25 completely after being the only publication to rank the Hogs throughout the year.

A Program First

Arkansas' No. 1 ranking in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's* April 6 poll is the first time in program history that the Hogs earned a No. 1 ranking. The Razorbacks had been ranked as high as No. 3 in previous years but never achieved a No. 1. *Collegiate Baseball* was cool to the Razorbacks through the first three weeks of the season as they did not rank the Hogs, but in the next four weeks Arkansas went from No. 23 to No. 9 to No. 4 to No. 1.

Scouting the Rebels

Over the past several years the Ole Miss Rebels have been know for their pitching and 2009 is no exception. The Rebels have amassed an impressive 37-15 overall record and are 17-10 in SEC play and have an outside chance to win a Western Division title with a sweep of the Razorbacks.

Drew Pomeranz and Brett Bukvich have been in Ole Miss' rotation from the start and have compiled a record of 13-5. A healthy Scott Bittle made the rotation nasty, but the All-American is out with a biceps strain and won't be available this weekend forcing Phillip Irwin to get the Sunday start.

At the plate, the Rebels are hitting .315 as a team and just about the entire starting line-up is batting at .330 or better.

Tim Ferguson and Matt Smith lead the way with batting averages of .356 and .348, respectively. Not a power hitting club, Ole Miss has just 47 home runs on the year, the squad can go gap-to-gap as they do own 103 doubles and 12 triples.

A Look at the Razorbacks' Rotation

Friday - Dallas Keuchel, LHP (7-2, 3.99 ERA) - A veteran on the Razorback staff, Dallas Keuchel is making his 13th start this season. Against Florida he retired the first 14 hitters he faced and earned the win with a seven-inning outing. In SEC play he is 6-2 with a 3.99 ERA over 58.2 innings of work. Keuchel pitched for the Wareham Gatemen of the Cape Cod League this summer and was an All-Star after finding his groove and increasing his velocity.

Sunday - Brett Eibner, RHP (4-4, 4.25 ERA) - Brett Eibner has been hot and cold on the mound for the Razorbacks this season, but has been very good in his last six starts. Eibner was a fourth round draft pick of the Houston Astros in the 2007 draft and possesses an overpowering fastball with movement and a sharp curve. Against No. 1 Georgia he pitched a complete game one-hit shutout that earned him numerous player of the week awards and honors.

Sunday - Justin Wells, RHP (2-0, 3.51 ERA) - Making his first start of the season Wells is no stranger to the Razorback rotation as he spent most of the 2008 season as a key component to Arkansas' success. A rubber-armed righty with the ability to go deep into games, Wells throws three pitches and has a devastating out pitch.

Coming Up Just Short

There is no question that Arkansas has struggled to get the big hit or to make the pitch that it needs as of late and the proof is in the numbers. In Arkansas' last seven SEC losses, they have fallen by a combined 13 runs and if you remove the 5-0 LSU victory from May 2, the Hogs have lost six games by eight runs. Six Arkansas losses in SEC play have been by one run and two others by two.

Arkansas' MVP Candidate

At the midway point in the season many players could be considered Arkansas' MVP, but perhaps the most compelling case goes to senior shortstop Scott Lyons. A sure-handed fielder when it counts, Lyons entered the 2009 season with a career .200 batting average and is currently hitting .305 with five home runs, 15 extra-base hits and 34 RBI. Lyons has also secured the No. 2 spot in the batting order giving Arkansas a left-right-left look through its first three hitters.



Leading the League

We should point out that Scott Lyons is currently leading the SEC in assists this season with 147. Lyons has had a couple of bad games which contribute to his .957 fielding percentage, but the senior went 23 consecutive games without an error.

Matching a Season Best

Scott Lyons quietly matched Ben Tschepikow's season best hitting streak at 11-games and then extended it to a season best 13. Beginning at the California game on March 8, Lyons may not have the gaudy numbers that Tschepikow's streak had, but the Covina, Calif., native batted .385 with 20 hits, 11 runs, two doubles, a home run, three walks and 14 RBI.

The All-Time Series

The Razorbacks have and Rebels have played a pretty even series since their first meeting in 1982 with Arkansas holding a slim 33-24 lead. The Razorbacks took two of three from the Rebels in Oxford a year ago, but prior to that Ole Miss had been the beneficiaries of five consecutive series wins. Arkansas' last series win in Fayetteville against the Rebels came during the 2003 season.

Kuhn Named SEC Freshman of the Week

Redshirt Freshman Collin Kuhn was named the Southeastern Conference's Freshman of the Week on Monday, March 16. Kuhn batted .353 over four games and in the Florida series was placed at the top of the order and hit .429 with a team leading six hits in the series. Kuhn had his first three-hit contest against the Gators and led off Sunday's victory with a triple to left-center field and scored the first of Arkansas' four runs.



Don't Run on Kuhn

Collin Kuhn has been impressive at the plate, but his defense is getting better all the time. Against Cal, Kuhn threw out a would-be run at home plate from left field for Arkansas' first outfield assist of the season. In the Auburn series Kuhn threw out three runners, two at second and one at the plate. He now has five outfield assists on the year, the most by a Razorback since Casey Coon had seven in 2007.

First Time Since

As far as we can know, Collin Kuhn's two assist day on Friday against Auburn was the first two-assist performance by a Razorback outfielder since Blake Parker threw out two LSU runners at the plate on April 10, 2004.

Keuchel Brilliant in First SEC Outing

Junior Dallas Keuchel was outstanding in his first SEC start of the season as he tossed seven innings and allowed just one run on four hits while striking out a near career best nine hitters. Keuchel retired the first 14 hitters he faced before surrendering a walk. He did run into trouble in the sixth inning when he loaded the bases with no outs, but a sacrifice fly was followed by a pair of strikeouts to get out of the jam. Arkansas' ace earned his second win of the season with the effort.

**A Great Start**

Dallas Keuchel has had a great start to his junior season. Over his first seven starts, Keuchel amassed a 5-0 record with a 3.45 ERA over a team high 44.1 innings of work and walked just five batters while striking out 35. Even more important than those numbers is that Arkansas was 7-0 in games that Keuchel started.

Seven Excellent Outings, One Bad Game

As Friday night starter you are expected to pitch well and aside from one game, Dallas Keuchel has done just that. In eight SEC starts (Vanderbilt aside) Keuchel is 6-1 with a 3.09 ERA over 55.1 innings of work. Has allowed just 19 runs on 51 hits with 12 walks and 32 strikeouts.

Outdueling the Best

Dallas Keuchel has pitched against some of the nation's best pitchers and accounted for seven wins and one loss in 11 starts. Keuchel's wins have come against Matt Way of Washington St., Billy Bullock of Florida, Grant Dayton of Auburn, Devin Jones of Miss. St., Sam Dyson of S. Carolina, Ty'Relle Harris of Tennessee and Anthony Ranaudo of LSU, while his two losses were to Mike Minor of Vanderbilt and Austin Hyatt of Alabama. Keuchel has pitched no decisions against Seth Hall of Kansas, Matt Flemer of Cal and Trevor Holder of Georgia.

Unlikely Contributors

In the Alabama series, Arkansas head coach Dave Van Horn decided to change things up and the results were impressive. Starting five freshmen or redshirt freshmen and one sophomore on Saturday, the Razorbacks responded with early runs and showed their grit in the clutch. Arkansas got need production from the likes of Collin Kuhn, Jarrod McKinney and James McCann on Saturday which carried over to Sunday and could be the first step to fabulous careers.

A Pure Hitter

Arkansas' lineup has pop, speed and great swings, but perhaps the best pure hitter on the club is sophomore Andy Wilkins. The Razorbacks' clubhouse leader in home runs, Wilkins is batting a healthy .304 this season with 11 doubles and 15 home runs. He has driven in 37 runs while scoring 41 more and all this while being pitched around as Wilkins has drawn 43 walks.

**SEC Play, No Problem**

Some hitters feast on non-conference pitching, but struggle against the best that the SEC has to offer. Not so in the case of several Razorback hitters including Andy Wilkins who boasts a .319 batting average against the conference. Wilkins has 29 hits in 26 conference games with three doubles and nine home runs.

Improving as a Defender

Everyone knew that Andy Wilkins could hit the ball, but he has never been known as a fantastic defender. While Wilkins does have five errors on the season, he has not made one since March 6 against California, a streak of 39 games.

Coaching Milestones

Thanks to Arkansas' sweep of the Auburn Tigers Razorback head coach Dave Van Horn reached a pair of coaching milestones. The Razorbacks' Friday night victory was his 100th as Arkansas' head coach against the Southeastern Conference and the Saturday afternoon win was his 250th as the head man at Arkansas. Arkansas' victory over Oklahoma earned Van Horn the 850th of his career.

SEC Player of the Week

Thanks to a once-in-a-lifetime weekend, senior Chase Leavitt was named the Southeastern Conference's Player of the Week on March 9. Leavitt was a thorn in California's side as he reached base in 14 of 17 plate appearances and cracked nine hits against the Bears. His startling numbers included nine hits, five walks, two runs, two doubles, a stolen base and seven RBI. He also came through with the game-winning hit on Sunday afternoon and set career bests with four hits and five RBI.

**College Baseball Foundation National All-Star Lineup**

Along with his SEC Player of the Week honors, Chase Leavitt was also placed on the College Baseball Foundation's National All-Star Lineup. He is the second Hog to make that prestigious list in the last two years joining head coach Dave Van Horn who was honored after winning his 800th career game as a coach.

Leavitt Remains at the Top of the Lineup

Senior Chase Leavitt was a player that not many people noticed at the beginning of the 2008 season, but the Utah native was on everyone's mind by the time the NCAA Regional came. Leavitt led the Razorbacks with a .366 average last season and hit .388 in Southeastern Conference play. Arkansas' catalyst at the top of the order, Leavitt's plate discipline earned him 41 walks, 13 hit by pitches and a team high .518 on-base percentage.

Preseason All-SEC

Rivals.com and *SEBaseball.com* each named Chase Leavitt one of its preseason All-SEC picks. Leavitt led the Razorbacks in hitting last season with a .366 average and was a valuable part of what the Hogs accomplished in their run to a NCAA Regional. *Rivals.com* had Leavitt on its one and only All-SEC team while *SEBaseball.com* placed Leavitt on its second team.

Record Crowds

The Razorbacks are setting attendance records. The season began with Arkansas' largest opening day crowd against Washington St. and continued into the Cal series where the Razorbacks set records for largest paid and actual non-conference series attendance. The Arizona State series saw a Baum Stadium record 11,014 fans attend Wednesday night's game with 11,434 tickets sold. That series broke a two-game attendance mark for a non-conference midweek series. Most recently, the Razorbacks set the all-time mark for tickets sold in a season on Sunday afternoon against LSU.

Two Great Weeks for the Freshman

Freshman Zack Cox would tell you that his freshman year hasn't quite been up to par, but the Louisville, Ky., native was turning things around quickly. Three weeks ago he batted .529 with nine hits, six runs, three doubles, two home runs and six RBI. That included the first four hit game of his career and a game-winning hit. He followed that performance up with a week where he hit .400 with six more hits, five runs, a double, two home runs and five RBI. Over a nine game hitting streak he batted .455 with 15 hits, 11 runs, nine RBI and raised his season average 59 points.

**Cox Named One That Got Away**

Freshman Zack Cox was tabbed as one of the top prospects in the nation that "got away" from Major League Baseball according to *Baseball America's* Nov. 3 issue. Cox, a 20th round pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 2008 First Year Player Draft, was named the No. 4 prospect that chose to attend college rather than play in professional baseball.

A Prospect to Keep Tabs On

Like Brett Eibner, Zack Cox has also been placed on a pair of *Baseball America* prospect lists. He was tabbed the No. 4 newcomer in the SEC in the publications SEC preview and the No. 5 freshman prospect overall.

Brett Eibner's pitching performance against No. 1 Georgia on Sunday, April 19, was one for the record books. Eibner tossed a complete game one-hitter to one of the nation's most potent lineups while striking out a career best 12 batters. Even more important for the Razorbacks though, was the fact that it took a game off the SEC East leading Bulldogs who had won the previous two days on hits in the bottom of the ninth.



Player of the Week

With a performance like his at Georgia there was almost no uncertainty that Brett Eibner would be named SEC Pitcher of the Week on April 20, which he was. What came later was a nice bonus as he was also tabbed as one of five Louisville Slugger National Players of the Week, named to the College Baseball Foundation's National All-Star Lineup and picked as College Baseball Insider's Southeast Region Player of the Week. The weekly honors are a first for Eibner.

Eibner Named Freshman All-American

A huge miss in the media guide this season was the fact that Brett Eibner was a first-team *Baseball America* Freshman All-American. Eibner was slotted into the utility spot by *Baseball America* based on his pitching and outfield play.

Baseball America Projections

In their string of prospect projections over the winter *Baseball America* made mention of Brett Eibner a couple of times. He was tabbed as the No. 5 projected prospect in the SEC for the 2010 draft in the publications SEC preview. He was also the No. 28 sophomore prospect in their list of the top players in the country.

Best Start Ever

Arkansas opened the SEC season with an eight-game winning streak, its best start since joining the league in 1992. Arkansas' previous best through eight games was 6-2 and the Razorbacks extended the career best start through 10-3 before matching the 1999 team's start.

Second Longest Streak

Arkansas' eight-game SEC winning streak was the second longest in school history behind 1999's 10-game winning streak.

Two Significant Streaks

Senior Ben Tschepikow had an 11-game hitting streak snapped against Nebraska on March 18, but followed it up with another seven games streak. During Tschepikow's first stretch he batted .442 with 19 hits, 13 runs, a triple, four home runs, nine walks, five stolen bases and 16 RBI. His second run had him at .423, with 10 runs, two doubles, a triple, home run, seven walks and eight RBI.



Consistency

The Razorbacks are seeking consistency throughout the lineup and Ben Tschepikow is providing just that. He has at least one hit in 33 of 46 games this season and has reached base multiple times in 22 of the 46 contests.

The Back End Anchor

The Razorbacks feel that their bullpen is much improved over last year and a key component to that is a healthy Stephen Richards. In 24 appearances, Richards has been very good on the mound with 29.1 innings pitched and three earned run allowed. He has struck out 43 batters, walked 13 and allowed only 16 hits. He has been touched up for two blown saves, the first when a batter that he struck out with two outs reached on a passed ball and the second on an error by the second baseman.



Fifth in the Conference in Saves

Stephen Richards may not be on everyone's mind when it comes to great closers in the country, but we should point out that the Texas native is fifth among SEC pitchers in saves with eight, three behind the conference leaders. Richards has also amassed a miniscule 0.95 ERA this season which would be among the nation's elite had he thrown more innings.

Arkansas' Recruiting Class Among the Nation's Elite

The Razorbacks have a large class of freshmen and transfers this season, but the recruiting prognosticators feel good about what Arkansas is bringing to the field. *Baseball America* named Arkansas' recruiting class the No. 8 class in the nation and tabbed true freshmen Zack Cox and Jarrod McKinney as the No. 72 and No. 157 prospects, respectively.

Cardiac Kids

The 2009 Arkansas baseball team has a flare for the dramatic to say the least. They have been behind or tied in the eighth inning or later 21 times this season and have come back to win eight of those games. The Razorbacks have delivered three walk-off home runs, a game-ending triple and a squeeze bunt to pull out their victories and have even received a two-out home run in the bottom of the ninth to tie a game and force extra innings.

Game-Winning Hits

Coming through in the clutch is a big emphasis for the Razorbacks this season and here is where we will track all of the Razorbacks' game-winning hits. As we roll through mid season, Ben Tschepikow has five game winners with Chase Leavitt contributing four. Andrew Darr, Brett Eibner, Zack Cox and Scott Lyons each have three and two others have two. In all, 11 Razorbacks have come through with game-winning hits this season.

Attendance Leaders

The Razorbacks have been among the nation's leaders in attendance for years and 2009 is expected to be no exception as the Hogs welcome some of the nation's toughest competition. At the midway point in the year, Arkansas is on pace to once again have huge numbers at Baum Stadium and could challenge for the nation's largest crowds.
