SCHEDULE

AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE CHARTERED INSTITUTE OF HOUSING

1. These amendments shall come into effect from the date of, and the time immediately after, the passing of a resolution by the members of Chartered Institute of Housing (CIH) which resolution deals with the appointment of individuals to the proposed Governing Board of CIH (being the Governing Board referred to in these Charter amendments).
2. In Article 2, *delete* "Housing Associations" and *substitute* "Housing Organisations (as defined in the Byelaws) providers of Social Housing, Registered Providers,".
3. At the end of Article 4(b), after "other communications" *insert* ", by training and knowledge management (including electronic- and distance-learning)".
4. In Article 4(j), *delete* "Committees" and *substitute* "Delegated Boards".
5. In Article 4(k), *delete* "section 736 of the Companies Act 1985" and *substitute* "section 1159 of the Companies Act 2006".
6. *Delete* "Council" wherever it appears and *substitute* "Governing Board", *except* in Article 12 and Article 13 where it refers to "Our Heirs or Successors in Council".

7. In Article 5:
 - a) *delete* "No member of the Council shall be appointed", and *substitute* "No Trustee (being a member of the Governing Board, herein referred to as "Trustee") shall be appointed"
 - b) *delete* "member of such Council" and *substitute* "Trustee"
 - c) *delete* "member of the Council" and *substitute* "Trustee"
 - d) *delete* "and such member shall not" and *substitute* "and such Trustee shall not".
8. *Delete* Article 6 and *substitute* "6. There shall be a Governing Board of the Institute, herein referred to as "the Governing Board", consisting of a maximum of fifteen Trustees to be appointed and constituted in accordance with the Byelaws and to hold office for such period and on such terms generally as may be prescribed by or in accordance with the Byelaws."
9. *Delete* Article 8 and *substitute* "8. Unless and until the Byelaws shall otherwise provide there shall be two classes of Member of the Institute, Chartered Members and Non-Chartered Members and the Bye-laws may also prescribe that there shall also be Honorary Members who may be Honorary Chartered Members or Honorary Non-Chartered Members."
10. In Article 10(b), *delete* "first".
11. In Articles 11 and 14, *delete* "Corporate" wherever it appears.

AND WHEREAS Patricia Hodgson resigned as a BBC Trust member on 1st July 2011 her appointment as an ordinary Trust member is vacant.

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Suzanna Taverne shall be, and is hereby, appointed as an ordinary member of the BBC Trust for the period beginning on 1st January 2012 and ending on 31st December 2015.

The College was expressed to be founded for Study and Prayer. It was a Foundation designed in part for the offering of prayers for all the souls of the faithful departed, and especially for the souls of Henry V, King of England and France, of Thomas

Representations were duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for Justice that, subject to the exceptions below, burials should be discontinued forthwith in:-

- 1) St Peter's Churchyard, Malvern Wells, Worcestershire;
- 2) St Stephen's Churchyard, St Stephen-in-Brannel, St Austell, Cornwall;
- 3) St Wystan's Churchyard, Repton, Derbyshire;
- 4) Ordsall Parish Churchyard, Ordsall, Nottinghamshire (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 5) Churchyard of St Mary the Virgin, Templecombe, Somerset.

In pursuance of the Order in Council made on 12th October 2011 these representations have been published and taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council.


Accordingly, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that burials shall be discontinued forthwith in the places listed above, subject to the following exceptions:-

- (a) in the places numbered 3, 4 and 5 above, in any existing earthen grave in the churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in that grave, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave;

- (b) in the place numbered 4 above, in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or any member of the family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave; and
- (c) in the place numbered 5 above, in any vault or walled grave in the churchyard, burial may be allowed but every coffin in such vault or grave must be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.
