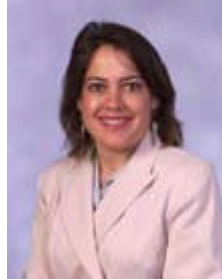


Network Member Bio



Erica Ann Eugster was born in Washington, D. C., and received her M.D. degree from the Medical College of Pennsylvania in 1990. She completed her pediatric residency training at Marshfield Clinic in Marshfield, Wisconsin in 1994, and subsequently received fellowship training in pediatric endocrinology at the University of Minnesota. In 1997, Dr. Eugster

joined the faculty of Indiana University as a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at the James Whitcomb Riley Hospital for Children, where she was promoted to Clinical Associate Professor in 2000. Dr. Eugster was a recipient of the IU Trustee Faculty Teaching Award in 2001. She is board-certified in Pediatrics and Pediatric Endocrinology. She is a member of the Society for Pediatric Research, the American Academy of Pediatrics, The Endocrine Society, Women in Endocrinology and the Lawson Wilkins Pediatric Endocrine Society. Dr. Eugster's activities include providing care to children with a wide range of endocrine conditions. She has a particular interest in intersex disorders, precocious puberty, Turner syndrome and McCune-Albright syndrome. She serves as coordinator for the Indiana Newborn Screening Follow-up Programs for congenital hypothyroidism and congenital adrenal hyperplasia, and is co-director of pediatric endocrine fellowship training. Dr. Eugster is also involved in a number of clinical research studies, and is currently co-editing a new textbook; *Pediatric Endocrinology; Mechanisms, Manifestations and Management*, which will be published by Lippincott, Williams and Wilkins in 2004.
