**Miriam Shuchman** is a psychiatrist and a journalist with a background in medical ethics. She is Clinical Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the State University of New York at Buffalo and a member of UB's Center for Clinical Ethics and Humanities in Health Care. Her teaching area is psychiatry and ethics, and her academic interests are in research

ethics, informed consent, and media coverage of medicine. She authored a chapter for the Encyclopedia of Bioethics and is completing a book on medical whistleblowers for Random House Canada. Dr. Shuchman's articles on ethical issues in medicine and psychiatry have appeared in the New York Times, the Los Angeles Times, the Washington Post and other newspapers and magazines. Since moving to Canada in the mid-1990s, she's written regularly for the Globe and Mail in Toronto and commented on ethical issues in medicine for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and TVOntario. Prior to that she was a medical commentator for National Public Radio for many years. Dr. Shuchman trained in psychiatry at the Massachusetts General Hospital and studied ethics at Dartmouth and the University of California San Francisco. Her honors include a Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholars fellowship at U.C.S.F. and the Media Award from the Northern California Psychiatric Society.
