1973 – 74

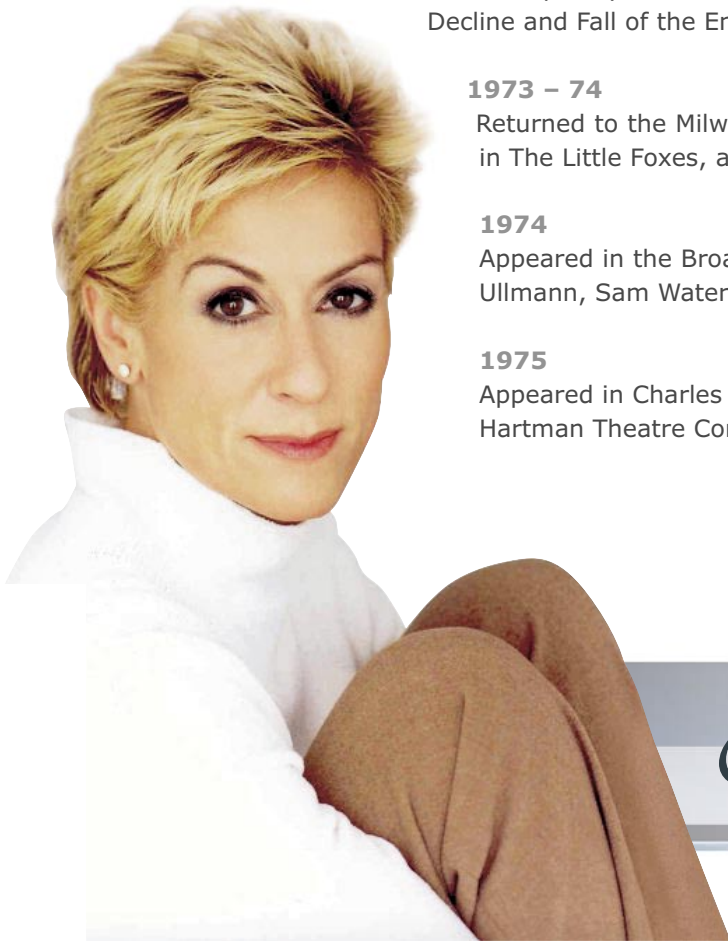
