

## Recap of Conference Call with Gov. Tim Kaine and the DNC


**Gov. Kaine** began the conference call by relaying his concern and prayers for those families and friends effected by the **Ft. Hood** shooting in **Texas**. He then gave a summary of the election results this month.

**Bad news:** We lost the 2 Governor's races in **New Jersey** and **Virginia** but the analyzes show that this should not effect the elections in 2010 as research shows President Obama has a 60% approval in **New Jersey** and a 57% approval rating in **Virginia**. (55% overall in the country)

Good news: A Democrat won the **New York** Congressional seat. It had been 100 years since a Democrat held that position. Democrats also picked up a congressional seat in **California**. We also won 2 mayoral seats in **Charlotte** and **Washington**.

What was learned: Independents in both Governors races went Republican. Voter turnout was very low with 10% voter turnout in Virginia. In the Congressional races, Independents went Democrat.

**Health Care:** Gov. Kaine felt the vote in Congress look very good and it did in fact pass with support from **AARP** and the **AMA**. **Organizing for America** got a lot of credit enlisting volunteers to make calls and making over 300,000 call to support health care. It is the first time in history to pass.
