




### ICE HOCKEY

The International Ice Hockey Federation (IIHF) approved the regulations and conditions of the Ice Hockey competitions of the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games on 31 August 2011.

The IOC approved the English-language version of this manual on 16 September 2011.

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### 1 WELCOME

From 13 to 22 January 2012, Tyrol will stage a sporting event of the highest level for the youth of the world integrating a diverse Culture & Education Programme.

In all, the 1st Winter Youth Olympic Games will feature high-level sport performances from 1,059 athletes aged 15 to 18 in 63 Medal Events in 7 sports and 15 disciplines, alongside great concerts and interesting workshops for everyone.

This Sport Explanatory Brochure aims to assist athletes and team officials in their preparation for and participation in the Games. As you complete your preparations for the coming events, we want you to know that we share your ambition and dedication to make these 1st Winter Youth Olympic Games an extraordinary experience.

### OPENING CEREMONY AND CLOSING CEREMONY

The Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games Opening Ceremony will be held at Bergisel Stadium on 13 January 2012. The doors will open to the audience at 16:00, the pre-show will begin at 17:30 and the Ceremony itself will start at 18:30. The ceremony will conclude at 20:00. This is an outdoor event.

The Closing Ceremony will be held at Medals Plaza in Maria-Theresien-Strasse on 22 January 2012. The pre-show will begin at 18:45 and the Ceremony will start at 19:15. After the conclusion of the Ceremony at 20:00, the Closing Ceremony Clubbing will continue at Congress Innsbruck until 00:00.

### COMPETITION PERIOD

The Ice Hockey competitions will take place at the Tyrolean Ice Arena in Olympiaworld Innsbruck from 13 January until 22 January 2012. Training opportunities at the Competition Venue will start on 10 January 2012.



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### 5 QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

### ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

In order to be eligible for the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games, male athletes must have been born between 1 January 1996 and 31 December 1996, and female athletes must have been born between 1 January 1994 and 31 December 1994.

### MEN'S AND WOMEN'S 5-TEAM TOURNAMENTS

The Men's and Women's 5-Team Tournaments will be composed of the following teams:

- Austria 34 athletes (two teams: one male, one female), selected for their ability to play on a national team;
- the top eight (8) nations in the 2011 IIHF World Rankings 136 athletes (eight teams: four male, four female), selected for their ability to play on a national team.

The Men's 5-Team Tournament and the Women's 5-Team Tournament will form the tournament programme. It is planned that this tournament programme will operate with ten (10) national teams from nine (9) separate nations.

As the host nation, Austria will be represented in the tournament programme by one (1) male team and one (1) female team.

The remaining eight (8) places will be awarded to the top eight (8) nations according to the men's and women's 2011 IIHF World Rankings. Each qualified nation will be allowed to select only one (1) team to participate. The right to determine the gender of the team entered will be awarded according to nations' position in the 2011 IIHF World Rankings, with the higher-ranked nations having the right to decide which team gender they wish to enter for their participation in the tournament programme.

### MEN'S INDIVIDUAL SKILLS CHALLENGE

A total of 15 male athletes selected as the top athletes in their category from a Global Skills Challenge and from nations not competing in either the Men's or the Women's 5-Team Tournament will participate in the Men's Individual Skills Challenge.

Qualification will carried out in accordance with the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games Qualification System Principles.

Timelines (please see detailed timeline below).

In order to be eligible to compete in the Men's Individual Skills Challenge, male athletes must have been born in 1996 and must come from nations not competing in the Men's or the Women's 5-Team Tournament.

Qualification for the Men's Individual Skills Challenge will be carried out in two (2) stages. The first stage will be carried out at a national level, with every participating National Association conducting their own Skills Challenge to determine a national winner. This national winner will be eligible to compete in the second stage. The second stage will be an international competition carried out at the Global Skills Challenge held during the 2011 IIHF Hockey Development Camp in Vierumäki, Finland.

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### WOMEN'S INDIVIDUAL SKILLS CHALLENGE

A total of 15 female athletes selected as the top athletes in their category from a Global Skills Challenge and from nations not competing in either the Men's or the Women's 5-Team Tournament will participate in the Women's Individual Skills Challenge.

Qualification will carried out in accordance with the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games Qualification System Principles.

Timelines (please see detailed timeline below).

In order to be eligible to compete in the Women's Individual Skills Challenge, female athletes must have been born in 1994 and must be from nations not competing in the Men's or the Women's 5-Team Tournament.

Qualification for the Women's Individual Skills Challenge will be carried out in two (2) stages. The first stage will be carried out at a national level, with every participating National Association conducting their own Skills Challenge to determine a national winner. This national winner will be eligible to compete in the second stage. The second stage will be an international competition carried out at the Global Skills Challenge held during the 2011 IIHF Hockey Development Camp in Vierumäki, Finland.

### HOST COUNTRY REPRESENTATION

As the host nation, Austria will be represented in the 5-Team Tournaments by one (1) male team and one (1) female team.

One (1) male and one (1) female athlete from the 5-Team Tournaments will represent the host country in the Individual Skills Challenge.

### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

Any places that are not taken up in the Individual Skills Challenge will be reallocated to the next-best-ranked athletes at the Global Skills Challenge held during the 2011 IIHF Hockey Development Camp in Vierumäki, Finland.

### 6 TRAINING

The training concept for the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games aims to meet the needs of the athletes and provide Training Opportunities at the Competition Venues on specific days and at pre-defined times, as published in the schedule.

### PRE-GAMES TRAINING (UNTIL 8 JANUARY 2012)

Pre-Games training at the Innsbruck 2012 Competition Venues and in the region around Innsbruck and Seefeld will be available in several sports until one (1) day before the opening of the Youth Olympic Village on 9 January. Expenses must be covered by the respective NOC.

### GAMES-TIME TRAINING (9 - 22 JANUARY 2012)

In accordance with IOC policy, all Innsbruck 2012 athletes shall remain at the Youth Olympic Games for the duration of the Games (at least from the day of the Opening Ceremony until the day of the Closing Ceremony), regardless of their competition schedules, and shall participate both in sporting competitions and in the Culture & Education Programme.

Games-time training, including both sport-specific training and non-sport-specific training for all athletes, will be provided from the opening of the Youth Olympic Village on 9 January 2012 until one (1) day before the closure of the Youth Olympic Village on 24 January 2012. 012.

### SPORT-SPECIFIC TRAINING

There will be two (2) categories of sport-specific training for Ice Hockey during Games-time, as outlined below. Transport to the training sessions will be provided by IYOGOC.

### a) Scheduled pre-competition training (Official Training)

The type and number of scheduled Ice Hockey training sessions are determined in consultation with the IIHF. All scheduled pre-competition training sessions are included in the Competition Schedule by Session.

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### b) Training Opportunities which require booking (free training)

Several Training Opportunities will be available for Ice Hockey athletes according to their requirements and in consultation with IIHF. These Training Opportunities must be booked at the Sport Information Desk in the Youth Olympic Village at least one (1) day in advance.

### NON-SPORT-SPECIFIC TRAINING (GENERIC TRAINING)

There will be the following training facilities for generic training needs from the opening of the Youth Olympic Village until the Closing Ceremony of the Games. The Innsbruck 2012 training concept aims to meet the needs of the athletes and provide easily accessible facilities and partially-supervised training sessions. Non-sport-specific Training Opportunities will be open to all accredited NOC members free of charge.

### a) YOV Gymnasium Reithmann

The YOV Gymnasium Reithmann is an easily accessible and supervised training facility which is equipped with generic sports equipment. It is open to all NOC members on the following dates and at the following times:

No booking is required for the YOV Gymnasium Reithmann. No transport will be provided due to the short distance (600m) between the Youth Olympic Village and the YOV Gymnasium Reithmann.

### b) Tyrol Sport Centre

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Training Opportunities at the Tyrol Sport Centre are available from 10 to 22 January 2012. Situated adjacent to Olympiaworld Innsbruck, the Tyrol Sport Centre is easily accessible, supervised and equipped with a generic training gymnasium, weight room and swimming pool, which are open to all NOC members. Opening hours will be limited, and registration must be carried out one (1) day in advance (by 18:00 at the latest) at the Sport Information Desk. All registrations will be handled on a 'first-come, first-served' basis. Transport is possible from the Youth Olympic Village to the Tyrol Sport Centre by taking the Yellow Route Innsbruck Shuttle to Olympiaworld Innsbruck.



### c) University Sports Centre

Training Opportunities (use of facilities and participation in courses) at the University Sports Centre are available from 10 to 24 January 2012. The gyms, weight rooms, outdoor track-and field area and other facilities are excellently equipped. Registration must be carried out one (1) day in advance (by 18:00 at the latest) at the Sport Information Desk. All registrations will be handled on a 'first-come, first-served' basis.

All courses at the University Sports Centre are offered for students of Innsbruck University and focus on strength training and physical conditioning. Accredited NOC members may join any of the courses, subject to availability. A detailed course plan, including descriptions of the courses on offer, will be available at the Sport Information Desk.

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### 7 COMPETITION FORMAT AND RULES

### 5-TEAM TOURNAMENTS

The tournament programme will comprise one (1) Men's 5-Team Tournament and one (1) Women's 5-Team Tournament.

Both the Men's and the Women's 5-Team Tournament will feature five (5) participating teams, each comprising 15 players and two (2) goalkeepers. These teams will be seeded into one (1) group and will play a single round-robin Preliminary Round of 10 games (four games per team) followed by two (2) Semi-Finals and two (2) Medal Games. The teams competing in the 5-Team Tournaments will play over eight (8) days, in accordance IIHF Sport Regulations.

- Men's 5-Team Tournament gold / silver / bronze (3 x 17 medals = 51)
- Women's 5-Team Tournament gold / silver / bronze (3 x 17 medals = 51)
- Total 34 gold / 34 silver / 34 bronze = 102 medals

### PENALTIES, DISQUALIFICATION RULES, PROTESTS AND APPEALS

The three-point system and tie-breaking rules described on page 22 of the IIHF Sport Regulations will be used for qualification and play-offs.

All protests must be submitted in writing to the Tournament Chairman within 60 minutes of completion of the respective game. Appeals will be submitted to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS). Please also refer to IIHF Rules 566 und 567 in the IIHF Rule Book for details on teams refusing to start play.

### TTMTNG

Each game will comprise three (3) periods of 15 minutes. The game time will be counted down in minutes and seconds from 15.00 to 00.00. Overtime will be held as described on page 24 of the IIHF Sport Regulations.

### **SCORING**

The procedure for scoring and Game-Winning Shots (GWS) will be that described on page 25 of the IIHF Sport Regulations.

### INDIVIDUAL SKILLS CHALLENGE

Please refer to the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games Skills Challenge – Operations Manual and Test Protocol, which explains the set-up, testing procedures, competition format and scoring for the Individual Skills Challenge.

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### NUMBER OF MEDALLISTS

- Men's Individual Skills Challenge gold / silver / bronze (3 x 1 medals = 3)
- Women's Individual Skills Challenge gold / silver / bronze (3 x 1 medals = 3)
- Total 2 gold / 2 silver / 2 bronze = 6 medals



### INNSBRUCK 2012 INDIVIDUAL SKILLS CHALLENGE TEST PROTOCOL

The Individual Skills Challenge will consist of 15 qualified male and 15 qualified female players, as well as one (1) male player and (1) female player from the host nation. The Individual Skills Challenge will comprise two (2) phases: a Qualification Phase and a Grand Final. Both the phases of the men's and women's competitions will be held during the same ice session. The Qualification Phase will qualify the top eight (8) female and eight (8) male players, who will progress to compete in the Grand Final.

Both phases consist of a series of six (6) skills tests, which will be conducted on a head-to-head, knockout basis until a winner is declared.

Participants will be seeded for each skills test, according to the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games Skills Challenge – Operations Manual and Test Protocol. Participants in the Grand Final will be seeded according to their ranking in each test during the Qualification Phase. Players earn points for their finishing position in each test. At the end of the Qualification Phase, the points from all six (6) tests will be added together to determine each player's individual points total.

During the Grand Final of the Individual Skills Challenge, players of each gender will compete for medals and to determine the final individual rankings.

Participants must perform the skills tests as described in the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games Skills Challenge – Operations Manual and Test Protocol. Any intentional breach of the rules will result in the participant being disqualified from that skills test. A second such breach will result in the participant being disqualified from the Individual Skills Challenge.

If a player is disqualified by the IOC and/or IIHF due to a major breach of the ethical rules of the competition, the player will be indicated as having been disqualified from the competition, have all his/her results declared null and void, and he/she will receive no ranking (neither for the Individual Skills Challenge nor for the Qualification Phase or the Grand Final).

### **SCORING**

Players will earn points for their finishing position in each test. The points will be allocated according to the Scoring Protocol detailed below:

- Winner: five (5) points,
- Runner-up: four (4) points,
- Two losing semi-finalists: three (3) points each,
- Four losing quarter-finalists: two (2) points each,
- Eight players losing in the first round: one (1) point each.



At the end of the competition, the points from all six (6) tests will be added together to determine each player's individual points total. Players' individual point totals from the Qualification Phase will not be brought forward to the Grand Final.

- Any player who fails to finish (DNS, DNF, DSQ) the initial round (the first round of the Qualification Phase or the Quarter-Final of the Grand Final) of a skills test will earn zero (0) points for the test.
- Any player who fails to finish (DNF, DSQ) either the quarter-final or semi-final round of a skills test will earn zero (0) points for that test, but will retain the points they have earned up until that test.
- Any player who fails to finish (DNF, DSQ) the final round of a skills test will earn the runnerup's points for that test.

### **EQUIPMENT**

NOCs are asked to bring their own sports equipment in order to be able to compete in the respective events. Personal sports equipment storage is provided at the locations indicated in the Sports Equipment Storage List in the Appendix.

Olympiaworld Innsbruck will host the Figure Skating, Speed Skating, Short Track Speed Skating and Ice Hockey Events for the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games.

Incorporating the Olympic Stadium, Tyrolean Ice Arena, Tivoli Stadium, Tyrol Sports Centre and the Olympic Sliding Centre Innsbruck, Olympiaworld Innsbruck has stood for unique sporting facilities in the heart of the Alps since its creation in 2004. From 13 to 22 January 2012, figure skaters, short trackers and ice hockey players will battle it out in the Olympic Ice Stadium and Tyrolean Ice Arena, while speed skaters will go head-to-head on the outdoor Olympic Speed Skating Oval.

Moreover, the Main Press Centre (MPC), Main Media Centre (MMC), Technology Operations Centre (TOC) & International Broadcasting Centre (IBC) will also be located at OWI.

### **OPENING HOURS**

- Athletes: 2h before session starts / 1h after session ends
- Media: 2h before session starts / 3h after session ends
- Guests: on competition days: 1h before competition starts / 1h after competition ends
- Spectators: on competition days: 1h before competition starts / 1h after competition ends

### SECURITY



### 10 MEDICAL SERVICES

### MEDICAL SERVICES AT COMPETITION VENUES

- Medical services, including first-aid emergency support, will be provided for accredited athletes and NOC Team Officials at all Competition Venues and Other Venues.
- In addition, there will be at least one (1) sports physician and a team from the Austrian Red Cross present at all Competition Venues. An emergency ambulance and a helicopter (if required) will also be available at all Competition Venues.
- Teams from the Austrian Red Cross will be available at all Other Venues and Innsbruck 2012 events.

### MEDICAL SERVICES AT TRAINING VENUES

During all official training times, medical services will operate at the training venues under competition conditions (IYOGOC physician, Austrian Red Cross, ambulance). No medical services will be provided by the event organisation outside the official training times. In case of an emergency, please call 144 for assistance.

### MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE OPENING AND CLOSING CEREMONIES

A team from the Austrian Red Cross will be available at the Opening Ceremony and Closing Ceremony.

### MEDICAL SERVICES AT INNSBRUCK AIRPORT

Innsbruck airport's existing on-site medical services will provide first-line medical care, including emergency support.

### MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE IOC HOTEL, MMC AND IYOGOC-RECOMMENDED HOTELS

There will be no dedicated hotel physicians in the IOC Hotel, the MMC and IYOGOC-recommended hotels. If an accredited person requires medical help outside the YOV, they can consult our partner physicians in Innsbruck. These physicians are authorised to issue prescriptions using the YOG Prescription Pad. In the case of emergency, the Austrian Red Cross can be contacted using the general emergency number 144.



### YOG PARTNER HOSPITALS AND PHARMACIES

- Innsbruck University Hospital is the main YOG Partner Hospital of the Innsbruck 2012
   Winter Youth Olympic Games. This hospital will be responsible for all emergencies, hospital treatment and laboratory analyses.
- Innsbruck Military Hospital will be on hand as a YOG Partner Hospital to deal with quarantine issues, dental treatment and laboratory analyses.
- Austrian law states that the young athletes (≥14 years) are allowed to decide whether or not they want to receive certain medical treatment, provided this treatment will not have a major impact on their health.

### MEDICAL EXPENSES POLICY FOR CLIENT GROUPS

On-site emergency medical services will be provided free of charge to all accredited Client Groups and spectators at medical facilities set up at the Innsbruck 2012 venues. Furthermore, in cooperation with the official YOG Partner Hospitals, IYOGOC will provide hospital care free of charge to designated eligible accredited Client Groups (i.e. NOCs, the IOC and IFs).

This hospital care will include:

- free transport from an Innsbruck 2012 venue to a dedicated YOG Partner Hospital;
- free emergency and outpatient treatment/services in a YOG Partner Hospital, equivalent to the treatment/services a patient would receive in a public hospital;
- free medication during the hospital stay, equivalent to the medication a patient would receive in a public hospital.

Mountain rescue, including helicopter transport to the YOG Partner Hospital, will be covered for all accredited Client Groups during competition and official training.

### REPATRIATION

IYOGOC will provide repatriation free of charge for eligible accredited Client Groups (i.e. NOCs, the IOC and IFs). In the event that a member of an eligible Client Group requires medical repatriation, free transport with the necessary accompanying medical personnel will be provided. In the event of death, the repatriation process will cover the cost of transporting the body to the home country. All arrangements in this respect will be handled by IYOGOC.

### PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

Food, air and water quality will be monitored at all times during the Games. Any issue which may lead to a public health concern will be dealt with immediately by the local authorities. Water and air quality in Tyrol is generally excellent and is monitored on a regular basis by the provincial government.

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### 11 DOPING CONTROL

There will be two (2) types of doping controls at the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games: pre-competition testing (randomly chosen or targeted athletes will be tested in the Medical Service Centre in the Youth Olympic Village); and post-competition testing (based on the result of the competition). All doping controls will follow the rules of in-competition testing and take place in accordance with the Test Distribution Plan.

The official testing laboratory for the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games will be Seibersdorf Laboratories GmbH.

In order to ensure that doping controls are processed in a secure, fast and efficient way, the following Doping Control Stations will operate during the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games and must be indicated as such:

- Olympiaworld Innsbruck,
- Patscherkofel,
- Olympic Sliding Centre Innsbruck,
- Kühtai,
- Seefeld,
- Youth Olympic Village (part of the Medical Service Centre).

The Main Doping Control Station will be at the Olympiaworld Innsbruck venue. All competitions taking place at Olympiaworld Innsbruck must use the Main Doping Control Station.

Should an athlete not be able to provide a test sample within two (2) hours after the start of the doping control procedure, the athlete will be taken to the Doping Control Station in the YOV, accompanied at all times by a Chaperone.

To guarantee that the Innsbruck 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games run smoothly, and to avoid placing the focus on potential negative doping test results, no test results whatsoever will be communicated during Games-time. Instead, the results of the doping controls carried out during the Games will be communicated no more than two (2) weeks after the Closing Ceremony. Seibersdorf Laboratories GmbH will directly communicate all test results to the IOC Medical Commission Chairman or his representative. At the same time, the test results will also be communicated to the respective IFs and the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).

### 12 WEATHER SERVICES

The Games-time weather service will feature a fully operational weather forecasting system including individual forecasts for individual venues, On-Venue Results (OVR) reports and web pages as well as real-time data delivery and the provision of weather information to athletes and officials, competition management, the Main Operations Centre and Venue Information Booth. Weather information will also be available at the Sport Information Desk in the Event Information Centre at the Youth Olympic Village.

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### 13 VICTORY CEREMONIES

The Innsbruck 2012 Victory Ceremonies will be held in accordance with the protocol determined by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to honour the individual and team achievements of the athletes.

Victory Ceremonies are composed of two (2) types of ceremonies: Mascot Ceremonies and Victory Ceremonies. The Mascot Ceremonies will take place at the Competition Venues following each medal event. Then, at a later point in time, medallists will be invited onto the podium at Medals Plaza to receive their medals as part of the Victory Ceremony. Due to the Closing Ceremony, all Victory Ceremonies taking place on 22 January 2012 will be held at the respective Competition Venue.

Medals will be presented in the following order: bronze, silver, gold. The national flags of the medallists' NOCs will be raised as the national anthem of the gold medallist's nation is played. For Mixed-NOC Team Events, instead of the usual NOC flags and anthems, the Olympic Flag will be raised for each medal-winning team and the Olympic Hymn will be played.




