- 1. A pre-war Regular Army division, which at the outbreak of war was stationed in the U.K. On 21st September 1939, the division arrived in France and Belgium as part of the B.E.F. Following its evacuation on 1st June 1940, it reformed in the U.K. On 15th April 1942, the division sailed from the U.K. arriving in India on 7th June 1942. It came under command of Southern Army. The 6th Brigade was detached for the 1st Arakan campaign between the 31st October 1942 and 1st June 1943. The division transferred to the command of G.H.Q. India on the 1st May 1943. The formation joined XXXIII Indian Corps on the 1st November 1943. When the Japanese launched their offensive to destroy the allied armies in the Imphal plain, called U-Go, the division was sent by air to Kohima on 27th March 1944. It fought throughout the campaign of 1944 and 1945 under XXXIII Corps, being withdrawn to India on 12th April 1945. The division transferred to the command of H.Q. Allied Land Forces South East Asia on that date, moving back to the Southern Army on the 7th June 1945. The 5th Brigade left the division in October 1945 (following reorganisation) to become part of the Brinjap Division within the Allied Occupation Force of Japan. The 6th Brigade (again reorganised) sailed to Singapore in December 1945. The division was disbanded in India in October 1946.
- 2. This unit was the divisional machine gun battalion.
- 3. The regiment was formed in December 1943 by the combination of some batteries from the following two regiments:
