KU aspires to improve in absolute measures, such as retention and graduation rates, and relative to its peer universities, such as in the case of federal research expenditures. 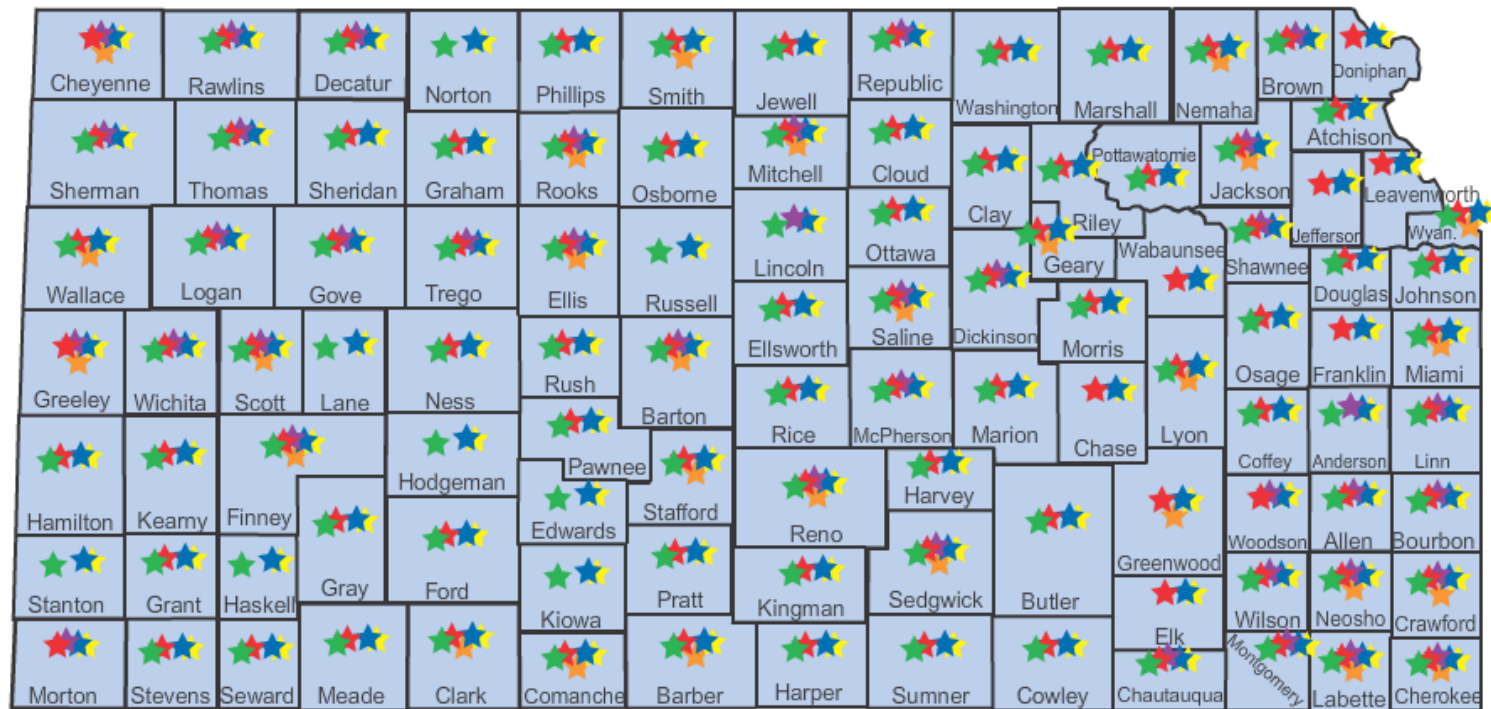

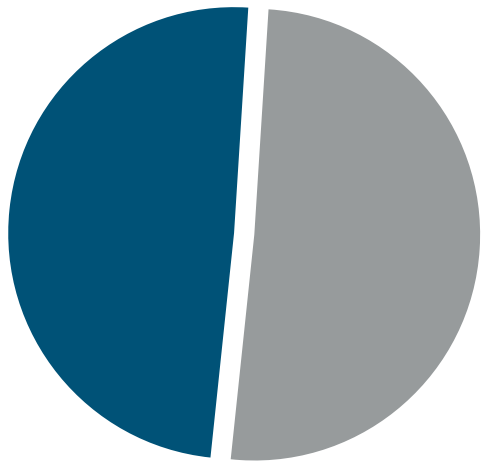
