Voted into Classic FM's 2005 Hall of Fame, saxophonist Christian Forshaw presents a haunting sound-world of voices, church organ, saxophone and percussion. This concert marks the third performance of his 2006 UK Tour of churches and cathedrals and will feature his best-selling debut album **Sanctuary** and preview his forthcoming new release **Renouncement** on SONY BMG.

Alongside powerful choral settings of the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis, Forshaw collaborates with the spine-tingling purity of soprano Grace Davidson's (The Sixteen) voice in arrangements of JS Bach, John Ireland, John Dowland, and Vaughan Williams. Regularly heard on Classic FM, the performances also feature his critically acclaimed setting of Mortal Flesh, short-listed for the 2005 Classical Brits.

This performance celebrates three London premières from Forshaw's new release 'Renouncement' on Sony BMG including Patrick Hawes 'Cantate Domino', Gary Carpenter's 'Songs of Sadness and Piety' and Forshaw's own 'Renouncement'.

Concerts take place on Tuesdays and every Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 7.30pm and include Early and Baroque Music, chamber and world music, song and piano recitals. - CHRISTIAN FORSHAW graduated from the Guildhall School of Music & Drama in 1995 and immediately began working with some of the world's finest ensembles including the London Sinfonietta, the Chamber Orchestra of Europe and the Philharmonia Orchestra. He has toured extensively with smaller ensembles including the Michael Nyman Band, Icebreaker, the Delta Saxophone Quartet, the Composers Ensemble, and Peter Wiegold's Note Inégale. As a soloist Christian has appeared with the (BT) Scottish Ensemble giving several critically acclaimed performances of Richard Rodney Bennett's Concerto for Alto Saxophone and Strings. He was also featured as soloist with the London Sinfonietta in 2002 performing Pedro Rebello's Aquas Liberas at the Queen Elizabeth Hall. This year Sanctuary reached number 1 in the Amazon Classical Music Charts and National Radio of New Zealand. As an organist and harpsichordist, Ben has performed at The Proms; Lichfield, Bath and Aldeburgh Festivals; the Lincoln Center in New York and Winchester Cathedral. Ben is an active continuo player, performing with The Sixteen, The King's Consort, His Majesties Sagbutts & Cornetts, Ex Cathedra, Northern Sinfonia, Polyphony, Canzona, LSO and The CBSO
