Dear Alumni, Parents, and Friends,

The cover of this issue of *The Lions' Pride* demonstrates the value of our new Performing Arts Center with its state-of-the art Cotsakos Family Theater. St. John's now has a facility that few can match in enabling us to meet the needs of our students, while also hosting major events for the international community. For the first time ever, we were able to host the Honor Band and Honor Choir workshops and concert. More than 300 students and teachers from throughout the world gathered in Brussels and Waterloo for four days in March. The culminating concert included a capacity audience of 400 in addition to 250 musicians and singers on stage.

Two weeks earlier in March, we hosted the European Council of International Schools' Early Childhood Conference. More than 400 educators from as far as China and Korea were on campus for three days of workshops, seminars, and meetings with all of the general sessions taking place in the theater. In each instance, there was glowing praise for our wonderful facilities and generous hospitality.

Our primary mission is the education of our students. In addition, we are now able to play a major role in professional development and in promoting the performing arts. This was a role that was impossible to play before our new buildings were finished.

Among the many other interesting articles in this issue is a recap of the winter sports season. Ironically and unfortunately, we are celebrating the end of a winning streak that will almost surely never be broken. The St. John's boys' basketball team won three consecutive ISST championships and 87 consecutive games from 2003 to 2006 before finally losing a game to the host school at this year's championships in Paris.





### has come into being, thanks to culinary executive Jimmy Karl '02 and his multinational team.

Situated in the southeast corner of the resort island of Phuket, which was ravaged by the Dec'04 tsunami, Sri panwa was built after the storm had passed, and recovery on the island had begun. At the time, Jimmy was in London working at Nobu's, and received a call from a Thai classmate who had also attended the same Swiss culinary school as Jimmy. Would he be willing to leave London, to join three other culinary school classmates (friends) with varied areas of expertise, and to organize a restaurant to serve the clients, guests, and tourists who would be visiting and possibly purchasing or renting the pool villas being constructed on Cape Panwa overlooking the Bay of the same name? The answer was "Yes!"

And so the adventure began. Months and months of planning, hard work, adjustments, discussions, and differences of opinion, eventually led to the creation of the restaurant and, at present, 11 pool villas operating as a hotel, with more to be built. Along the way, the team learned to accommodate the realities of hiring and training young people from the Thai towns and to shop on the local economy for the items needed for their menu. consultant, and had the financial backing of a Thai businessman and investor, who had confidence in their abilities.

Other challenges certainly abounded, but if our evening is typical of what one can expect, they are to be congratulated for the outstanding way they treat their guests. The food, wine, ambience, service, and setting combine to create a unique dining experi-






see 'Timbertops,' the Early Childhood center built on the campus in 1998 and 1999. The teachers and architect worked together to design a facility suitable for educating small children.

## St. John's Economics Team finishes 2nd in international forum

In Feb., high school Economics teacher Ms. Victoire d'Agostino accompanied four of her students to Spain to compete in the European High

School Economics Forum, organized by the Univ. of Navarra. They competed with 20 other European high school teams on the case study of Turkey's accession to the European Union. The students presented, using Power Point, for 30 minutes, and fielded questions from an academic jury for about 20 minutes.

St. John's made the short list of the top three teams. They each had to re-present to about 150 people in the finals, which were decided by a popular vote—rather than an academic jury. Unofficially the St. John's team was advised it had the best presentation, but the popular vote carried the day for the Spanish team, with SJ coming in 2nd; ISB fielded two teams, with one coming in 3rd place.

The St. John's 'lions' of economics, like so many teams we field, was international, with representatives from Russia, Bulgaria, Trinidad-Tobago, and Lebanon.

We congratulate them and their teacher for representing the school so well in a challenging, intellectual environment.

## **St. John's teacher** authors a book on an African narrative tradition.

Dr. Alexis B. Tengan, a high school religion teacher at St. John's, has published this spring a book he wrote entitled *Mythical Narratives in Ritual: Dagara Black Bagr.* 

In the words of one reviewer, "the author presents a version of Africa's longest oral recitation of myth of origination, the *black bagr* myth found among the Dagara of Northern Ghana and Southern Burkina Faso, and discusses in detail its historical and

literary significance for the society." The book includes "a unique bilingual (Dagara and English) presentation of the *black bagr* narration recorded and viewed live from within a secret rite of initiation. The narration... lasted up to three hours and was performed without interruption by one speaker. The narrative shows to what extent the rites achieve the double purpose of teaching the initiates culture knowledge and giving them new individual identities that will equip them for different social positions in life."

Dr. Tengan earned his Ph.D. in Social and Cultural Anthropology from the Catholic University of Louvain. He is also associated with Lumen Vitae Institute in Brussels, where he teaches a course on Rites of Initiation in Traditional and Modern Societies. His current research interests include mythology, initiation rituals, religion and society, ritual literature, and cultural and development studies.

## Winter Sports Wrap-up

In Vienna, the girls' varsity basketball team achieved a 2nd place in their division, but lost a heart-breaker to Cairo, 37—32. They eventually established themselves in 7th place by defeating Hillingdon.

The **Junior Swim Team** kicked and stroked its way to another 1st place trophy this year, while the varsity Sea Lions, competing in the ISSTs in Brussels (BSB) and Leuven, tied overall for 8th place with Zurich. The 'Under-15' girls also had an 8th place finish out of 12 teams.

St. John's also hosted the Middle School 'round robin,' basketball tournament with our boys' team coming in 2nd place, following a close game against Frankfurt, 60-56. The SJ girls 'turned the tables' on Frankfurt, though, and defeated their girls, 32-30, to earn 1st place honors. This bodes well for the future. \*
