



Keeping Maryland Hunt Cup on course is no easy task



A fence-builder looked at Bruce Fenwick one day and said, "Well, nobody even makes a full round rail anymore."

Fenwick, in charge of maintenance on the most storied steeplechase course in North America, paused only briefly before replying, "Well, someday they're going to have to."

The Maryland Hunt Cup's traditional post-and-rail fences (some shading five feet tall) are made of stout chestnut rails that last 30 years or more. The rails get replaced as they

break during the four-mile, 22-jump test of stamina, guts, determination and bravery (human and Thoroughbred). And don't worry, Fenwick has plenty of inventory—for now. His father, former race secretary Charles C. (Cuppy) Fenwick, purchased a railroad car of them 20 years ago and the precious wood is stored in a nearby barn.

But one day—as Bruce Fenwick says—they're going to need new rails, because the 112-year-old race shows no signs of ending.

When the starter dispatches the field for the 2008 Hunt Cup on April 26, a tradition will extend to another year. And all will be right with the world—in the Worthington Valley, anyway.

All that history carries some responsibility, which property owner and 1972 Hunt Cup winner J.W.Y. (Duck) Martin Jr. carries around. In the mid-1930s, much of the land that comprises the current Hunt Cup Course was purchased by his father, and Martins have called it home ever since.

"We use the fields for horses—it gets grazed like any other field does, but it also gets maintained like a race course," said Martin, whose brother Peter and sister Carol Corrigan also own portions of the course. "It's just a known fact that there's a lot of history that comes with owning the land. The history is there all the time—there's a longevity connected to it. Most people probably just assume that on the last Saturday of April the race is going to be there, but a lot goes into it."

The Maryland Hunt Cup began in 1894 and moved to several locations before finding a permanent home in 1922 among the 200 acres of pastureland split by Tufton Avenue.

Of course, Tufton was simply a dirt road then, whereas now it handles thousands of vehicles a day. Most drivers are oblivious to the history in the fields, and certainly have no idea there are stones marking the precise locations of the start, finish line and turning beacons. The original course designers—property owner G. Bernard Fenwick (Bruce Fenwick's grandfather) and surveyor Thomas Disney-went that far. They also described the official height, position and construction of each of the 22 fences.

Bruce Fenwick, the Maryland Hunt Cup Association and the Martin family work to preserve that history while at the same time creating a safe, fair and modern race course. Okay, modern may be a stretch, considering the stone markers have been in place for 86 years and can be difficult to find at times. But rest assured that the course gets more care than your average broodmare turnout field (which part of it is).

Fenwick supervises yearround maintenance that includes seeding, fertilizing, aerating, rolling, chain-harrowing and mowing. He battles various nuisances such as weeds, geese, deer, water, drought and more. The Kentucky bluegrass gets lots of care, as much for its past as its future.

"In the old days the foxhunts came through here and you left the course alone because the horses in the race were foxhunters too," said Fenwick. "Whatever happened, happened. Now, you've got fancy \$100,000 horses and people rightly expect a little more from the race course. We're still at the mercy of mother nature a little bit, but we do what we can." Hay gets made from the infield grass, but not the race course itself.

"The big thing is mowing, repetitive mowing six times a year before the race," said Fenwick. "It's a steeplechase course that has another purpose and there aren't many like that anymore. It's one race, once a year for eight minutes, but it's an honor to do this work."

The Hunt Cup has survived two World Wars, 20 American presidents, natural disasters, inventions great and small. The first courses varied from year to year, but took place mainly in the Green Spring Valley area near what is now St. Paul's School. Other locations included the Hampton estate near Towson, Timonium, Cockeysville and Long Green Valley.

Eventually, organizers and participants wanted a permanent course with more form, less confusion. From 1915 to 1918, the race called G. Bernard Fenwick's farm (essentially the south side of Tufton Avenue at the present location) home, but moved again for the 1919, 1920 and 1921 races when crops were planted on the course.

Permanency came in 1922, with the creation of the cur-

rent course using both sides of the road and eliminating the various ditches, streams and banks that were part of the early courses.

"My father had been a race rider since he was a boy; he was never particularly good, but he loved horses," said Cuppy Fenwick recently, while looking out toward the famed third fence. "He rode in the Hunt Cup once [1909]. His age of people all had something to do with horses then. You either rode a horse, you drove a horse, something. After all, until 1900 there were not automobiles. They were looking for a course, a home for the race, and my father said that was fine and he built it right here."

The new course was—and is—a marvel of engineering. Bernie Fenwick set those stone markers, measured the distance to a precise four miles, built the fences and even cheated gravity by diverting several streams that once crossed the course.

The streams start in the woods along the backside, and follow the terrain toward the meadow. The course builders created ditches and drains to force the water underground, across the field, under Tufton Avenue and across much of

the next field before coming to the surface in a babbling brook near where many of the cars are parked for the Hunt Cup today.

The ditches were made of rock, tile, even old newspaper—anything to keep them from filling in. As deep as nine feet below the surface turf, the ditches might escape a visitor's attention if not pointed out. Hidden or not, the underground streams are keys to much of the course's existence

"They've been modernized somewhat now but it's still fairly similar," said Bruce Fenwick. "The streams were put underground along the woods and a stream was moved completely by the fifth fence. In case I get hit by a bus

or something, I tell everyone that the most important thing the course guy can do is keep the openings in the woods healthy. If they get backed up or something, and we get a lot of rain, we've got a river running across the course."

Fenwick marvels at his grandfather's ingenuity and credits the man's diary as the reason anyone knows the streams are there at all. A phrase in the book says simply: "It will be necessary to take the water elsewhere." It was necessary; the water was moved (in several places) and the race course lives on.

Other than water, important course issues center primarily on the turf and the fences. Most simply take planning. Wire mesh covers the tops of

the fences where horses are turned out (prevents chewing). Lively goose hunts are held in-season to try to minimize the population and discourage long-term residents. The groundhog family that lives under the ninth fence mayor may not-have moved out, but Fenwick makes sure the holes are filled in just before race day (any earlier and the groundhogs simply dig new ones). The 20th (a board fence) and the 21st (the water jump) were rebuilt in 2007. The second fence received a complete new panel—using up several of those precious rails-during this off-season, though a new coat of black paint has yet to be applied.

And there are various specifications to think about.

The height and construction (post-and-rail or board) of each fence is listed on early diagrams. The first fence is 18 panels wide to accommodate early traffic, and the other jumps are six or eight panels wide.

Later in the spring, the turn-outs will come in and finishing touches will be put on the turf and the fences. By the last week of April, the beacons will be set on those stones, the fences will be flagged, the tanbark will be ready for the road crossings, the gates will be opened, the horses will be ready, the spectators will arrive.

And Bruce Fenwick will be another year closer to calling that fence-builder.

Maryland Hunt Cup courses

- **1894**—First running, May 26. Start on Dr. William Lee's property near Stevenson Station, Green Spring Valley, at 4 p.m. The course was in an easterly direction finishing near George Brown's race track at Brooklandwood. Distance 4 miles. Time not taken.
- **1895**—Second running, May 4. Start from Hampton Gate on the Dulaney Valley Turnpike, one mile beyond Towson. Circular course, distance of about 4½ miles. Time not taken.
- **1896**—Third running, April 25. Start at George Brown's country place at Brooklandwood in the Green Spring Valley. Distance a little less than 5 miles. Time not taken.
- **1897**—Fourth running, April 24. Start in field directly north of Brooklandville Station, east side of Falls Road. Time and distance not reported.
- **1898**—Fifth running, May 3. Start and finish at Gerar, the country seat of E. Gittings Merryman, near Cockeysville. Time and distance not reported.
- **1899**—Sixth running, April 29. Start and finish at "Long Green," the country seat of W.S.G. Williams. Distance 4 miles. Time 12:31.
- **1900**—Seventh running, April 28. Start at G.W. Ewing's and finish at Thomas Deford Jr.'s in the Green Spring Valley. Distance 4½ miles. Time 12:00.
- 1901—Eighth running, April 27. Start at Brooklandwood and finish at J.A. Ulman's in Green Spring Valley. Distance 41/8 miles. Time 11:55.
- 1902—Ninth running, April 26. Start and finish at R.M. Dennison's farm Salona in Timonium. Distance 4 miles. Time 11:12.
- 1903—Tenth running, April 18. Start $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north of Towson, directly east of York Road and finish in Hampton. Distance 4 miles. Time 10:24%.
- **1904**—Eleventh running, April 30. Start at H.C. Brown's Brooklandwood and finish at Thomas Deford's Oakdene in Green Spring Valley. Distance 4 miles. Time not taken.
- 1905—Twelfth running, May 6. Start at Dr. N.R. Smith's in Brooklandville and finish at J.A. Ulman's Helmore in Green Spring Valley. Distance 4 miles. Time 11:02.
- **1906**—Thirteenth running, May 5. Start and finish at Brooklandwood. Distance 4 miles. Time not taken.
- 1907—Fourteenth running, May 11. Start and finish at Thomas Deford's Oakdene in Green Spring Valley. Distance 4 miles. Time not taken
- 1908—Fifteenth running, May 16. Start at Dr. N.R. Smith's and finish at J.A. Ulman's. Distance 4 miles. Time not taken.
- 1909—Sixteenth running, May 15. Start and finish near Dr. N.R. Smith's. Distance 4 miles. Time not taken.
- 1910—Seventeenth running, May 14. Start in field south of Brooklandwood barn, the course running in circle through properties of Messrs. Brown, Ulman and Deford, thence through Mr. Sloan's and Mrs. George Brown's, finishing in front of Brooklandwood House. Distance 4 miles. Time 11:061/s.
- **1911**—Eighteenth running, April 22. Start in field west of entrance road to Brooklandwood, running through properties of Mrs. George Brown Jr., Messrs. Sloan, Deford, Ulman and H. Carroll Brown, back to a point near the start. Distance 4 miles. Time 12:00.
- **1912**—Nineteenth running, April 20. Start in field on Thomas Deford's property just south of Green Spring Valley Road, running thence through the properties of Messrs. Deford, Ulman and Brown, making two circles and finishing near the start. Distance 4 miles. Time 10:38.
- 1913—Twentieth running, April 26. Start in field on Thomas Deford's property near his stable, running thence through the properties of Messrs. Deford, Ulman and Brown, making two circles and finishing near the start. Distance 4 miles. Time not taken.

^{**—}in 1923 Oracle II, owned by Mrs. M.M. Maddux and ridden by Raymond Belmont, finished first but was disqualified for cutting a flag.

^{***—}in 1948 Carolina, owned by Henry Cadwalader and ridden by E.H. Bennett, was disqualified for jumping the wrong fence the second turn of the course.

1914—Twenty-first running, April 25. Start in field near Brooklandville Station, running thence through the properties of Messrs. Brown, Ulman and Deford, making two circles and finishing near the start. Distance 4 miles. Time 11:10.

1915—Twenty-second running, April 24. Start and finish at Marberne Manor Farm, the estate of G. Bernard Fenwick, in the Worthington Valley. Distance 4 miles. Time 9:33%.

1916, 1917 and 1918 renewals were run over Mr. G. Bernard Fenwick's property, the course being virtually the same as the 1915 running. Of this course, Stuart Rose states: "The Fenwick farm in 1915 was fenced entirely with wire and it was necessary for the Committee to build panels in order to run the race . . . In 1919 the Committee again found itself up against the problem of 1914: the landowners would not keep the course in grass." So once more the site for the Maryland Hunt Cup was moved.

1919—Twenty-sixth running, April 26. Start and finish at Hampton, the estate of Captain John Ridgeley in Dulaney Valley. Distance 4 miles. Time 10:451/5.

1920—Twenty-seventh running, April 24. Start and finish at Hampton, the estate of Captain John Ridgeley in Dulaney Valley. Distance 4 miles. Time 10:44.

1921—Twenty-eighth running, April 30. Start and finish on Stuart Olivier's Five Farms. Distance 4 miles. Time 12:53.

1922—Twenty-ninth running, April 29. Start and finish on Charles L.A. Heiser's estate in Worthington Valley. Distance 4 miles. Time not taken.

Since 1922, the course has remained fixed. Only the names of the property owners have changed. Mr. and Mrs. J.W.Y. Martin Jr. are the present owners, Mr. Martin having inherited the estate from his mother who died in 1977. Mrs. Martin Sr. and her late husband had purchased the property from Mr. Heiser.

Maryland-bred is sales-topper among colts at OBSC sale

A Maryland-bred son of Speightstown sold for \$475,000—the top price among colts—at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's February Selected 2-year-olds in training sale, held February 12 in Ocala, Fla.

Bred by the Alan S. Kline Revocable Trust, the chestnut colt out of the Unbridled mare Unbridled Lady was bought back by Kline for \$145,000 at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale.

"He developed into what we hoped he would be," said Kline of the colt, who was consigned to the OBS sale in the name of G.W. Parrish's Parrish Farms, agent.

Kline sent the colt to Parrish's farm in Ocala immediately after the Kentucky sale.

"You never know about these youngsters," Kline said. "They can look awkward as yearlings, and then change completely."

Bloodstock agent John Mc-Cormack signed the sales ticket for Kline's colt, reportedly on behalf of a Middle Eastern client.

It was the biggest score to date at a juvenile auction for Kline, who has long ranked among Maryland's most successful commercial breeders at his Honey Acres Farm in Boyds.

The colt's dam, Unbridled Lady, won or placed in six stakes, including a victory in the 2000 Geisha Handicap against Maryland-breds, earning \$196,400 for Kline. She was trained throughout her career by Robin Graham.

Unbridled Lady was in utero when Kline purchased her dam, Assert Lady (a 1988 daughter of Assert), for \$57,000 at the 1996 Keeneland January sale.

Unfortunately, Assert Lady produced only two foals for Kline before dying of foaling-related colic in 1998.

Unbridled Lady has produced a foal each year since 2003. Her three older offspring, all fillies, sold at Keeneland

Maryland horse owners urged to vaccinate against rabies

The Maryland Horse Industry Board's Health Advisory Committee is urging all horse owners in Maryland to vaccinate their horses against rabies.

Rabies is a deadly disease that affects both humans and horses. Most often, the disease is spread by the saliva from the bite of an infected animal, including wildlife. Because horses can transmit the disease to humans, any human exposed to an infected horse must go through post-exposure treatment that can cost several thousand dollars for a single treatment.

Horse owners can reduce the risk of rabies to themselves and their horses by:

- Establishing a routine yearly rabies vaccination program for all horses, livestock and pets on the farm
- Not handling, feeding or unintentionally attracting wild animals
- Being on the lookout for wildlife that exhibit abnormal behavior.

If you suspect that a pet or farm animal has rabies, contact your veterinarian and/or your local health department immediately. To report a suspected case of rabies, contact the Maryland Department of Agriculture's Animal Health Division at (410) 841-5810. For more information on rabies, visit www.CDC.gov/rabies.
