## GATOR MEN'S OUTLOOK

## GATORS '08-'09

Capturing a 10-3 overall record (3-2 SEC) and an eighth-place NCAA finish, the Gator men return fueled for the 2008-09 season. Following a summer of valuable international experience at the 2008 Olympic Games and the 2008 U.S. Open, and with the depth of the incoming freshmen class, Florida looks to make a successful 2008-09 run. During the Gators' 2007-08 charge, Florida finished the season seventh in the CSCAA Poll after placing second at the 2008 SEC Championship meet.

At the NCAA Championship meet, the Florida men reeled in 38 All-America honors, while seven Gators were named to the All-SEC team. Despite losing nine athletes from last year's squad, the Gators return eight All-Americans among 25 returners. Additionally, the Gator coaching staff welcomes former UF All-American Leah Martindale-Stancil back to the Florida family as an assistant coach, serving capacities with both the men's and women's squads at UF.

The Florida men's squad welcomes 16 newcomers, including 14 freshmen and junior transfers Roberto Gomez and Raul Martinez, who both competed for Indian River Community College.

"We're really excited to see the production of our men's squad this year," head coach Gregg Troy said, previewing the 2008-09 season. "We have a great nucleus of scoring guys, but they will need some help from the younger swimmers and the incoming freshmen. There is a lot of talent, but it will be a matter of how quick we mature. We have a handful of freshmen men that we'll redshirt, but a couple others, like Brian Howell and Jeff Raymond, National Junior Team members, and Jose Crescimbeni, a 2008 Olympian for Peru, give us a good indication of their talent level- they just need to mature."

## FREESTYLE

In the freestyle realm, the Gators return loaded with the experience of key veterans and incoming talent. Key sprint and middle distance swimmer Shaune Fraser, both a SEC and NCAA scorer in the 200-yard free. Fraser reeled in a SEC title with his 1:34.23 swim in the 200-yard event, and turned around a 1:33.53 to place fifth at the 2008 NCAA Championships. Fraser's NCAA preliminary time (1:33.15) was the second-fastest 200-yard free swim by a Gator men's swimmer. Additionally, as a member of the 2008 Cayman Islands Olympic team, Fraser established a new national record for Cayman at the 2008 Olympic Games in the 200-meter free, swimming a 1:48.60 to place 26th overall, while also swimming the fastest 100-meter freestyle in UF history (49.56) in prelims of the event at the Olympic Games.

Combined with Fraser's extensive freestyle front, UF will look to junior Roland Rudolph, also a 2008 Olympian for Hungary, to be an impact player in the middle to long distance freestyle races during the 2008-09 season. Rudolph holds the fifth-fastest 500-yard free time (4:17.44). Senior Jos Smith looks to be a versatile freestyle swimmer for the Gators, providing speed in the 50 free, while also stepping it up in the distance events.

Junior college transfers Roberto Gomez and Raul Martinez look to make an instant impact in the sprint free realm and will be key in speed events and relays, while incoming freshmen Austin Detra and Jeff Raymond will provide strength in a variety of the different free distances.

In distance free action, Florida returns stacked for the 2008-09 season, with seasoned returners in Ryan Crete, Cody Kauffman, Joey Pedraza and Logan Storie. Storie ranks on the top-10 all-time list in the 400-meter freestyle with times established over the summer at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials, as well as the 2008 U.S. Open. Storie additionally medaled at the 2008 U.S. Open, earning a bronze medal for his 800-meter freestyle performance. Pedraza peaked this summer after swimming the 400 and 1,500-meter freestyle races at the U.S. Olympic Trials to increase his experience and development as a contributor in the distance free events. The UF coaching staff will look to Pedraza to step up throughout this season. Crete, Pedraza and Rudolph also boast accolades as scorers at the SEC Championship meet last year, looking to translate that success to the 2009 championship season.

## BREASTSTROKE

Returning strong in the breaststroke realm for Florida is SEC 200-yard breast champion and 100-yard breast third-place finisher, junior Clark Burckle, along with senior veteran Bradley Ally. Both Ally and Burckle will split the breaststroke chores, but will look to their teammates for added depth. Burckle returns as the UF all-time record holder in both the 100-yard (53.79), 100-meter (1:02.82) and 200-yard (1:55.02) and 200-meter (2:12.86) breast events. A 2009 U.S. World University Games Team selection, Burckle had a career-best summer at both the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials and 2008 U.S. Open, stepping it up for Florida in the breast realm at the SEC and NCAA Championship meets.

Ally, also a versatile individual medley swimmer, will look to use his strength in the breaststroke realm to split duties with Burckle. A 2008 Barbados Olympian, Ally commences his senior year coming off a successful run at the Olympic Games in Beijing, and will jump in with Burckle as an instant breaststroke contender.

"We are a little weak and lack depth in the breast events right now," Troy said. "We're going to need help along the way and we'll look to sophomores Mike Joyce and Joey Pedraza to step up and help fill that void."

## BUTTERFLY

Not only does veteran Shaune Fraser plan to make his presence felt in the freestyle once again, but Fraser stepped up as a key competitor in the butterfly events for the Gators last season and will be relied upon to provide an intricate role in winning fly events this season as well. Fraser, who holds the fifth-fastest 200-yard fly time in UF history (1:43.84), and the fourth-fastest 100-meter fly (54.08), will collaborate with sophomore returner Matt Norton as a team in the fly realm.

Additionally, junior Omar Pinzon, a key backstroke and IM competitor for UF, will be looked upon to utilize his

fly talent and experience to equate depth in fly specific events. Both Pinzon and Fraser were scorers for UF at the 2008 SEC Championship meet, while Fraser scored crucial points in the 200-yard fly at the 2008 NCAA Championships.

Troy and the Gator coaching staff will look to freshmen Jose Crescimbeni and Jeff Raymond to provide depth in the fly events. Crescimbeni was a 2008 Olympian for Peru, while Raymond was a 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials qualifier.

"Both Jose and Jeff hold strong butterfly credentials coming out of high school," Troy said. "We also have Clark Burckle and Bradley Ally returning, who are versatile and have the ability to help us out in the fly events."

## BACKSTROKE

The backstroke events could likely be one of the Gators' top strengths on the 2008-09 season. With three SEC scorers returning in Omar Pinzon, Roland Rudolph and Rex Tullius, Florida provides a dominating backstroke front after the success of the trio last season. Rudolph cruised to a third place NCAA finish, while Tullius placed fourth in the 100-meter (55.25) event at the 2008 U.S. Open to earn a spot on the 2009 U.S. World University Games Team.

Pinzon arrives back on campus with two Olympic experiences (2004 & 2008) under his belt, competing for his native country, Colombia, and will look to continue his Olympic success in the pool for Florida. Pinzon raced to a 26th-place finish in the 100-meter back in Beijing (55.11) to shatter the Colombia National Record in the event and will use that momentum to propel the Gator pack this season.

Among veteran returners, both junior Kyle Coan and sophomore Brett Fraser look to provide depth, while Florida will take advantage of the versatility of incoming freshman Brian Howell.

"We have a couple of versatile guys, one being Brian Howell, that are NCAA-caliber athletes that we can use lots of places," Troy said.

## INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

After having six top-eight finishers in the 400 IM and two in the 200 IM at the 2008 SEC Championship meet, it's hard to tell who will emerge as a leader on the 2008-09 season. With a wealth of returning depth and the addition of a seasoned IM freshman class, Florida should emerge strong on the individual medley force. Senior Bradley Ally and junior Clark Burckle are likely to step up as leaders of the IM pack, but the depth will remain stacked behind them with experience from veterans Shaune Fraser, Omar Pinzon, Rex Tullius. Ally and Burckle finished third and fourth, respectively, in the 400-yard IM at the 2008 NCAA Championship meet, while Burckle claimed the SEC title in the event.

At the 2008 U.S. Open, Burckle reeled in silver medals in both the 200 and 400-meter IM events to cap off a summer of success at the national level. Ally additionally experienced tremendous success at the international level, establishing a new Barbados national record in the 400-meter IM at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing (4:14.01), after he placed 10th overall.

Freshman Brian Howell will be looked up on to provide strength in the IM force as a Junior National Qualifier. Howell additionally claimed the 200 IM title at the Ohio High School State Meet in 2007. Alongside Howell, sophomore Matt Norton showed signs of being an IM contributor towards the end of the 2007-08 season, and will be looked upon to provide depth in the events this season.

## RELAYS

With the relays being the most important portion of a meet lineup, the UF coaching staff will experiment with different combinations in both the freestyle and medley relays throughout the fall portion of the swimming season. By championship season in the spring, the staff will use the best possible collaboration to punch points for the Gators at the SEC and NCAA meets.

With such strength in the IM, back, back, fly and free events, the Gators should have no problems organizing dominating medley relays, but it's all a matter of selecting the right combination of athletes for each, taking into account the competitive edge and experience of each swimmer. Troy will use the versatility of both Clark

Burckle and Bradley Ally on both the medley and free relay combinations.

Florida finished in the top four in every relay at the 2008 SEC Championship meet, while reeling in top eight finishes in the 800 free and 400 medley relays at the 2008 NCAA meet.

Junior transfers Roberto Gomez and Raul Martinez and seniors Rex Tullius and Jos Smith will be utilized to provide depth in the freestyle relays, while junior Shaune Fraser will additionally be a key asset to the free relays as such a dominating freestyle swimmer. Troy and the Florida staff will be looking for the best quartet possible in each situation to improve upon last year's finishes.

## DIVING

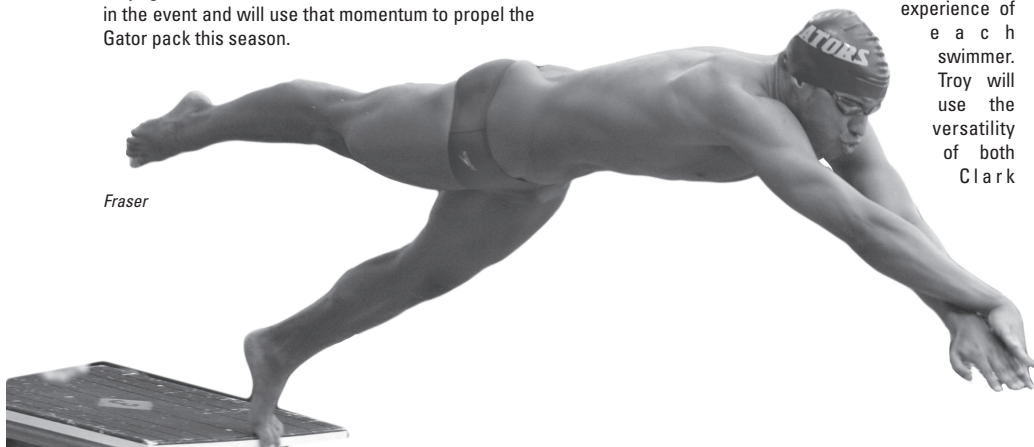
Veteran returning divers senior Aaron Leech and sophomore Grayson Patten will lead Florida on the diving boards this season, but freshman newcomer Anthony Lewark could contribute immediately as diving coach Donnie Craine builds upon the past success of the diving program.

Leech was a 2008 NCAA Zone Diving qualifier for the Gators, finishing 29th in the three-meter board preliminaries at the meet, while Patten stacked the talent and depth in dual meets last season as he made the transition from high school diving to the collegiate diving scene. Both look to improve upon last season and use their experience as a benefit entering the 2008-09 campaign.

Lewark, a Davie, Fla., native, and member of the Ft. Lauderdale Diving Club, joins the squad this season with plenty of diving experience that Craine hopes to develop as Lewark transitions to the SEC and NCAA diving competition.

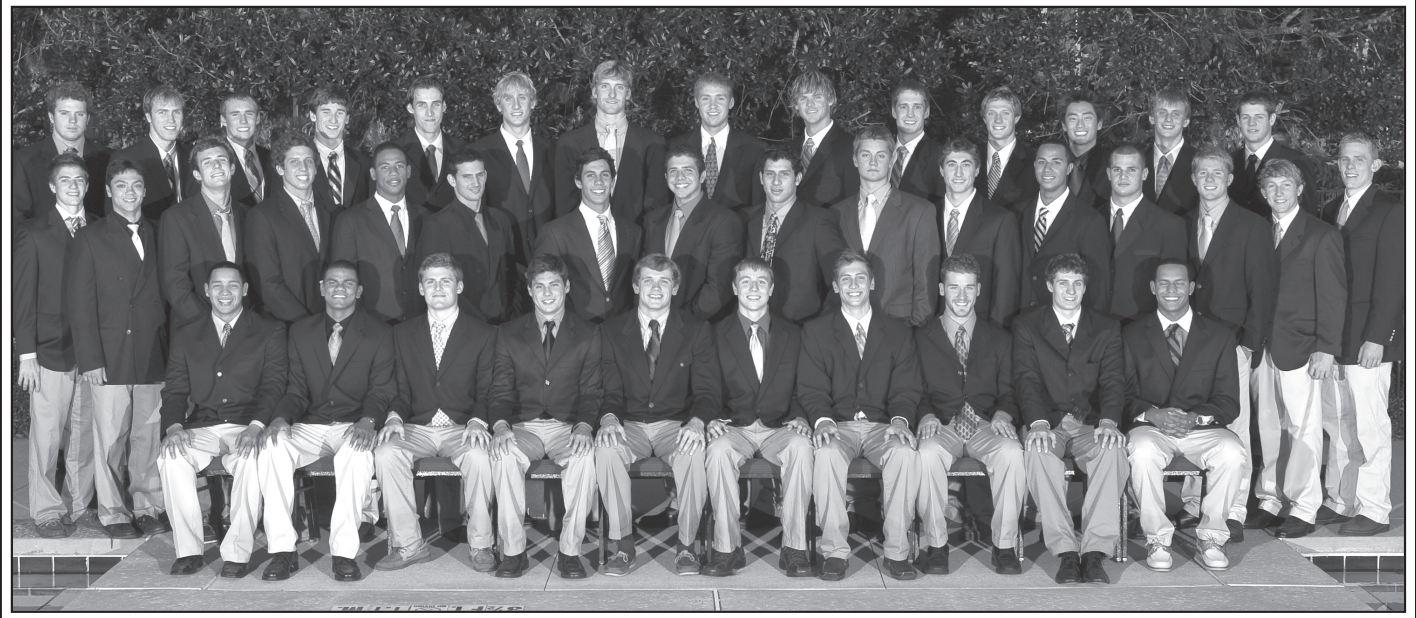

## 2008 SEC Championships Recap

February 20-23  
Alabama Aquatic Pavilion | Tuscaloosa, Ala.

### DAY ONE

The University of Florida men completed the first day of SEC action in sixth place, with 66 points. The sixth-ranked Gator men swam to the seventh-best time in school history, touching third in the 200 medley relay with a time of 1:26.80. Omar Pinzon, Clark Burckle, Shaune Fraser and Jos Smith collaborated for the NCAA provisional mark.

The UF men also swam to a second-place finish in the 800-yard free with a time of 6:22.84. The Gators came back from a third place turn heading into the final leg of the race. Florida used a strong fourth leg from Roland Rudolph as the anchor, pulling the Orange and Blue back to second. Tennessee touched in with a time of 6:19.18 for first.

### DAY TWO

The Gators started day two of the SEC Championships aggressive, picking up a one-two finish from Bradley Ally and Fraser in the men's 200-yard IM, bringing the men from the day one sixth-place spot up to second place. Ally's 1:44.45 victory gave him the Alabama Aquatic Center record and the third SEC individual title of his career. Both Ally and Fraser automatically qualified for the NCAA Championship meet with their finishes in the IM.

In 500 free distance action, Grant Johnson raced to third place, while Rudolph, Tobias Work and Ryan Crete placed fourth, fifth and sixth. In sprint freestyle action, Dan Penniman and Smith represented the Orange and Blue in the 50-yard free, Penniman placing sixth (19.95), while Smith finished 13th (20.26) overall.

The Gators wrapped up day two competition with a fourth-place finish in the men's 200-yard free relay, comprised of Penniman, Ally, Tim Hughes and Smith, after recording a NCAA provisional time of 1:19.22.

### DAY THREE

Florida opened the second-to-last day of SEC competition with two more SEC titles, one each from Fraser and Burckle. Burckle took his position on the awards stand following a stellar 3:44.86 400-yard IM swim, the first individual SEC title of his career. Burckle followed his 400 IM performance with a third place 100-yard breast finish. Fraser was crowned the defending

200-yard free champion, claiming an Alabama Aquatic Center pool record after racing to his second-consecutive title in the event.

The Gators stacked the depth in the 400-yard IM behind Burckle's first-place finish, as Ally claimed third (3:46.00), Pinzon clocked in fourth (3:47.38), Work came in fifth (3:47.47) and Dustin McLarty (3:48.13) and Kevin Nead (3:50.42) rounded out the top-eight finishers in seventh and eighth, respectively. Pedraza, Storie and Crete additionally swam the consolation final of the 400 IM for the Gators.

In other day three consolation action, Hughes and Penniman represented UF in the 100-yard fly, while Matthew Norton and Rudolph swam consolations of the men's 200-yard free.

Closing out the third day of SEC competition, the Florida men's 400 medley relay team, composed of Pinzon, Burckle, Fraser and Penniman, finished third (3:10.86) with the fifth-fastest time in the event in Florida swimming history.

### DAY FOUR

Wrapping up the final day of SEC competition, Pinzon recorded stellar performances in two events, tapping in with the 200-yard backstroke title, clocking the third-fastest time in the nation up to that point, while following up with a fourth place 200-yard butterfly finish (1:44.43).

Joining Pinzon in the backstroke, Tullius, Rudolph and Nead placed second, third and seventh, respectively, to rally for a complete sweep of the men's 200 back showdown. Fraser teamed up with Pinzon in the 200-meter fly for a third-place finish, while Hughes and Norton finished eighth and tenth, respectively in the 200 fly finals.

Burckle and Ally led Florida in the 200-yard breast realm, Burckle clocking in first (1:56.00) and Ally tapping in shortly behind in fourth with a time of 1:57.20.

In sprint free action, Penniman and Smith both competed in the consolation final of the 100-yard free, Penniman finishing first (43.49), Smith finishing fifth (44.49). On the flip side in distance free racing, Crete touched third in the men's 1,650-yard free event with a time of 15:00.14.

The Florida men finished the 2008 SEC Championship run with a total of five SEC titles and tallied 712 points to place second behind Auburn (806). The second-place finish marked the seventh year in head coach Gregg Troy's tenure that the Florida men have placed second.

## 2008 NCAA Championships Recap

March 27-29  
King County Aquatic Center  
Federal Way, Wash.

### DAY ONE

Junior Bradley Ally opened up Florida's 2008 NCAA Championship run at the King County Aquatic Center in Federal Way, Wash., with a first-place finish in the consolation final of the 200 individual medley. Ally was joined by Shaune Fraser who swam to a time of 1:45.56 to place second and Omar Pinzon placed fourth with his time of 1:45.74.

Florida's relay teams rallied to turn in two top-16 finishes on day one as well, placing eighth in the 400 medley relay and 15th in the 200 freestyle relay. Florida placed 12th in the 200 free relay to lead off the evening's competition. The foursome of Daniel Penniman, Grant Johnson, Tim Hughes and Jos Smith combined for a time of 1:19.44 to finish seventh in the consolation final. The 400 MR team of Pinzon, Clark Burckle, Fraser and Penniman combined to go 3:09.77 for an eighth place finish and 11 points for their team.

Roland Rudolf was the lone Gator to swim in the 500 freestyle finals, but went on to pick up the first six points for Florida, placing third in the consolation final (4:18.48). Rudolf was joined in the 500 free preliminaries by Cody Kauffman, Logan Storie, Ryan Crete, Joey Pedraza, Tobias Work and Johnson. Aside from Rudolf, Work picked up the Gators best time of the morning with a swim of 4:21.88 to finish sixth in the fifth heat.

To go along with his relay swim on the opening day of NAAs, Burckle also swam a then career-best time of 1:46.57 in the 200 individual medley preliminaries. Dustin McLarty joined Burckle in heat four, touching in eighth (1:49.68).

The Gators ended the first day of competition in Washington in ninth place, with 55 points.

### DAY TWO

The Gators used three top-eight finishes from Ally, Burckle and Fraser to climb from ninth to eighth place on the second day of the 2008 NCAA showdown. Ally led the trio with a third place finish in the 400 individual medley (3:43.59), bettering his preliminary time by 2.75 seconds, while Burckle was just off Ally's touch with a time of 3:43.68 to place fourth. Fraser returned to place fifth in the championship final with a time of 1:33.53. Burckle swam the fastest qualifying time of the morning with a swim of 3:42.82, while.

Pinzon turned in a 13th-place finish of 47.33 in the 100 back, after placing fifth in the consolation final. For Pinzon, it was his second consolation final of the night as he swam the first leg of the 200 medley relay team that finished fourth in the consolation with a time of 1:27.53 for a 12th place overall finish. Pedraza earned the first All-American honors of his career as the breaststroke leg of the medley relay, and was followed by Hughes in the butterfly and Penniman anchoring with free.

The 800 free relay quartet of Johnson, Fraser, Ally and Rudolf notched a sixth-place finish (6:24.03) as UF rounded out day two competition to improve to eighth place going into the final day of the Championships.

### DAY THREE

The sixth-ranked Florida men's swimming and diving team finished the 2008 NCAA Championship campaign in eighth place, completing the meet with a total of 210 points.

**The eighth place finish by the Gators marks the ninth straight year that head coach Gregg Troy has led his team to a top-10 finish at the NCAA Championships.**

Rudolph led the Gators in the water with a third-place finish in the 200 backstroke, touching the wall with a new career best and the fourth-fastest time in UF history at 1:41.49. Rudolf's swim was not the only record-setting performance of the day as Burckle broke the school record in the 200 breaststroke to place fourth in the championship final (1:55.02).

Fraser rounded out Florida's championship finalists with a fifth-place finish in the 200 butterfly with a time (1:44.06). Fraser also finished fifth in the same event last year.

Also on the final day of competition, the Gators sent seven swimmers to the timed finals of the 1,650 freestyle and turned in seven top-25 finishes. Work swam the best time by a Gator, touching the wall sixth in the third heat with a time of 15:05.11 to place 15th overall. Storie, competing in his first NCAA Championships, placed 17th overall with a time of 15:08.70. Pedraza touched in eighth in the third heat (15:15.88), for a 21st place finish, while Johnson touched the wall third (15:17.98) to place 22nd. Crete and McLarty rounded out the Gators finishers in the mile, placing 24th and 25th overall with times of 15:21.04 and 15:22.97 respectively.

Florida swimming was featured five times over the course of the consolation finals on the final day of NCAA action. Pinzon and junior Rex Tullius both swam in the consolation final of the 200 back, turning in the 12th and 15th fastest times of the final round. Pinzon placed 12th (1:43.00), while Tullius was 15th (1:46.13). Hughes was Florida's second-best finisher in the 200 fly (1:45.25), placing 14th, while Ally reeled in 14th overall in the 200 breast (1:57.30).

The Gators finished 12th in the 400 freestyle relay to close out the 2008 NCAA Championship season. Penniman led the Gators off with a split of 43.85, followed by Ally, Johnson and Rudolf to combine for a time of 2:55.40 in the final event.
