NL MANAGER OF THE YEAR:

- ◆ Is the all-time winningest manager in Arizona history after compiling 325 wins in four seasons as the D-backs skipper...earned his 304th win as manager on Aug. 14, 2008 at Colorado to surpass Bob Brenly as the all-time winningest manager in franchise history...the D-backs' 325 wins since 2005 are tied with the Atlanta Braves and Los Angeles Dodgers for the seventh-most in the National League during that span.
- ◆ Led the D-backs to an 82-80 mark and second-place finish in the NL West in 2008... finished 2 games behind the Los Angeles Dodgers in the standings.
- ◆ Had the D-backs in first place for a franchise-best 136 games from April 6-Sept. 6, 2008...the days spent atop the division were the third-most of any team in the Majors in 2008, behind only the Angels (154 games) and Cubs (151 games)...the D-backs have spent 212 days in first place since the beginning of the 2007 season, leading the National League, tying for second in the Majors with the Red Sox behind only the Angels (307 days)...since July 31, 2007, the D-backs have spent all but 27 games in first place in the NL West (190 of 217).
- ◆ Led the D-backs to a 48-33 record at Chase Field in 2008, giving the team a 98-64 mark at home over the last two seasons...the 98 home wins are third in the NL during that span behind the Brewers (100) and Cubs (99).
- ◆ Used 136 different lineups in 2008 (position players) compared to 146 in 2007.
- ◆ Was ejected from a game on two occasions; June 9 at Pittsburgh and Aug. 29 vs. Los Angeles-NL...he has now been ejected 15 times in his managerial career.
- ◆ After leading the D-backs to a league-best 90-72 record in 2007, was voted the NL Manager of the Year by the Baseball Writers Association of America, becoming the first D-backs manager to garner the honor...also won the NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award.
- ◆ Led the club to a 77-85 mark and second-place finish to finish 5 games behind the San Diego Padres in 2005 after being named manager of the D-backs on Nov. 5, 2004... the win total was a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004.
- ◆ Posted a 156-168 record in two seasons as the manager of the Seattle Mariners from 2003-04...led the Mariners to a 93-69 ledger during his rookie managerial campaign in 2003, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager and eclipsing Lou Piniella's 1993 mark of 82-80...his 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history.
- ◆ Served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001.
- ◆ Spent a pair of seasons as manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers...while with the Brewers, managed the team's Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999.
- ◆ Spent the 1996 season as a scout for the Brewers and then as a roving instructor in 1997 before becoming the assistant to general manager Sal Bando in 1998.
- ◆ Is one of 10 current managers who played catcher during their playing days, including Bruce Bochy (Giants), Bob Geren (A's), Fredi Gonzalez (Marlins), Mike Scioscia (Angels), Joe Torre (Dodgers) and Eric Wedge (Indians)...Clint Hurdle (Rockies) caught in 22 games during his playing career...two other managers, Jim Leyland (Tigers) and Joe Maddon (Rays) were minor league catchers.
- ◆ Spent 10 seasons in the Major Leagues as a catcher from 1985-94 with the Tigers, Giants, Orioles, Royals, Red Sox, Yankees and White Sox...after a trade to San Francisco before the 1986 season, spent 3 seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit his first big league home run on June 19, 1986 off San Diego's Mark Thurmond.
- ◆ His home run off Orel Hershiser on Aug. 14, 1988 at Dodger Stadium was the the last homer surrendered by the Cy Young Award winner before ending the season with 131.2 consecutive homerless innings.

- ◆ Lives in Cave Creek with his wife, Kelley, and daughter, Alexi.
- ◆ Graduated in 1979 from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif., lettering in baseball, basketball and golf.
- ◆ Attended the University of California at Berkeley.
- ◆ Originally drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the third round of the 1979 June draft, but did not sign, then joined the Tigers as their first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft.
- ◆ Very active with the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation with his family.
- ◆ Along with his daughter, had the honor of attending one of Hollywood's biggest events in January, 2006, the Golden Globe Awards in Beverly Hills, Calif..
- ◆ Daughter, Alexi, is a student at the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.

- ◆ Completed his second season as the bench coach with D-backs in 2008 after having served in the same position for the Detroit Tigers from 2003-05...was also a color analyst with the Tigers from 1998-2002.
- ◆ Played an integral role on two World Championship teams and batted .268 with 255 home runs, 870 RBI and 284 stolen bases during a distinguished 17-year playing career with the Tigers (1979-87, 1993-95), Los Angeles Dodgers (1988-90), Kansas City Royals (1991) and Pittsburgh Pirates (1992).
- ◆ Earned ALCS MVP honors after the Tigers swept the Royals in the 1984 ALCS and then hit 2 home runs in Game 5 of the World Series, including an eighth-inning, 3-run homer off the Padres' Goose Gossage that iced the game and the series for the Tigers.
- ◆ Hit a pinch-hit, game-winning 2-run homer off the A's Dennis Eckersley in Game 1 of the 1988 World Series that set the tone for the Dodgers to win the series in 5 games.
- ◆ Earned National League MVP honors in 1988 after batting .290 with 25 home runs and 76 RBI for the Dodgers.
- ◆ Was a teammate with Bob Melvin in 1985 with the Tigers...also was a Tigers broadcaster when Melvin was the Tigers bench coach in 2000.

- ◆ Married to Joanne with four children, Colleen, Kirk, Kevin and Cameron.
- ◆ Attended Michigan State, playing baseball and football, where he was an All-American wide receiver and outfielder in both sports.

- ◆ Entering his first season as the D-backs' first base coach.
- ◆ Spent the past two seasons managing the Pacific Coast League's Las Vegas 51s, the Los Angeles Dodgers' AAA affiliate...led the 51s to a 74-69 record and second-place finish in the PCL's Pacific South Division in 2008.
- ◆ Worked in the D-backs' organization for four years (2003-06) as hitting coach for the El Paso Diablos (AA) in 2003 and the Tucson Sidewinders (AAA) from 2004-06... helped lead the Sidewinders to PCL and AAA Championships in 2006, guiding squad to a league-leading .289 batting average and 844 runs scored.
- ◆ Served as the D-backs' interim bench coach for the second half of the 2004 season.
- ◆ Has also been on Major League coach staffs with the Florida Marlins (1998) and Colorado Rockies (1999).
- ◆ Has served as a minor league manager for eight seasons, also managing in the Mexican Winter League, where he was twice named Manager of the Year...led team to championship and Carribean World Series this past season...is the first manager to win championships with three different teams.

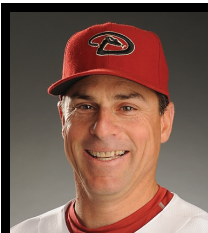

- ◆ Has been the third base coach for the past two seasons after compiling a 392-305 record (.562) in six seasons as a minor league manager in the D-backs organization.
- ◆ Was the manager at Tucson (AAA) from 2004-06 and led club to the Pacific Coast League and AAA Championships in 2006 with a franchise-best 91-53 record...his 220 wins and .542 winning percentage as a manager for Tucson were tops for the club.
- ◆ Spent first month of the 2006 season as third base coach for D-backs when Carlos Tosca recovered from a broken foot.
- ◆ Managed El Paso (AA) to a league-best 76-62 record in 2002 and also led Missoula (Rookie) to league's best overall record (44-32) in 2000 and to the Northern Division's second half championship in 2001.
- ◆ Honored as the Pioneer League and *Baseball America's* Rookie-level Manager of the Year in 2001.
- ◆ Served as an auxiliary coach with USA Baseball in Tucson in 1999 and worked with both the national team and the Intercontinental Cup teams.
- ◆ Spent portions of seven seasons in the Majors from 1989-97 with the Minnesota Twins and Los Angeles Dodgers...batted .289 (52-for-180) as a pinch hitter and played six different defensive positions, as well as designated hitter, during his career.

- ◆ Resides in Tucson, Ariz., with wife, Judith, and three children, Jack, Edward and Sabrina.
- ◆ Graduated in 1983 from Campolindo High School in Maraga, Calif.

- ◆ Set the Wildcats career marks for most hits and walks while batting .345 and helping lead Arizona to the 1986 NCAA Championship at the College World Series.
- ◆ Drafted by the Minnesota Twins in the 17th round of the 1987 draft.

- ◆ Completed his first full season in his second stint as D-backs' hitting coach after taking over on July 11, 2007...also was the D-backs hitting coach in 2004.
- ◆ Has served 11 years in the organization, including time as the minor league hitting coordinator in 2003 and 2005-07 and as a minor league coach with four affiliates from 1998-2001.
- ◆ Batted .246 with 41 home runs and 134 RBI in 580 games during a nine-year Major League career from 1984-96 with the Philadelphia Phillies, Baltimore Orioles, Detroit Tigers, California Angels and Montreal Expos.
- ◆ Signed as a non-drafted free agent with the Phillies in 1980 and eventually took over third base duties when Hall of Famer Mike Schmidt moved across the diamond to first base in 1985...also set a Phillies' record and tied a Major League mark with 7 at bats in a June 11 game vs. the Mets, collecting 4 hits.
- ◆ Logged a pair of seasons with the Nippon Ham Fighters in Japan from 1993-94 before returning to the states, where he played for Oklahoma City in 1995 and Ottawa in 1996, including a one-game stint with the Expos.
- ◆ Resides in El Dorado Hills, Calif., with his wife, Keri, son, Jake, and daughter, Easton.
