RAGNAR NURKSE'S EARLY YEARS

5 OCTOBER 1907: BORN IN KÄRU (RAPLA COUNTY TODAY)

1917: LEFT KÄRU FOR TALLINN

1918–26: WENT TO THE GERMAN DOM-SCHOOL IN TALLINN ("In der Schule geht es mir immer gut." – from his letter to mother from 9 December 1918)

1926–29: STUDENT AT THE TARTU UNIVERSITY

1928: LEFT FOR UK, TO EDINBURGH (WORKED FOR HONORARY CONSUL OF ESTONIA ADOLPH ELLINGSEN IN LEITH)

1929–32: STUDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF EDINBURGH, HE TOOK A FIRST CLASS DEGREE IN ECONOMICS UNDER THE PROFESSOR F. W. OGILVIE

1934–45: LEAGUE OF NATIONS (FINANCIAL SECTION AND ECONOMIC INTELLIGENCE SERVICE)

ALEXANDER LOVEDAY (22 June 1935):

"... Nurkse is, in my opinion, a real discovery and likely to prove of very real value to the League, once we are placed in a position to be able to give him contract. He has what is, in fact, unexpectedly rare, exactly the quality of mind which is suited to our Intelligence work here, as well as exceptional knowledge of languages and the first-class education. He has proved himself quite unusually useful to me as, on account of his ability and training and also his quickness, I can turn him from one subject to another as pressure of work demands in a manner for which nobody else working in the Section is really fully adapted."

THE WORLD WAR II

- 17 JULY 2 AUGUST 1939: THE LAST VISIT TO ESTONIA
- 17 JUNE 1940: SOWIET UNION OCCUPIED ESTONIA FOR RAGNAR NURKSE THERE WAS NO WAY BACK TO ESTONIA, HE LOST HIS HOMELAND
- SINCE 1940 IN PRINCETON (13 SEPTEMBER 1940 ARRIVAL INTO USA)

MEMORIAL MINUTE BY PROF. J. W. ANGELL

(COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY, MAY 1960)

"Few academic men of his age were as widely and favorably known. But it was Nurkse's personal qualities that particularly endeared him to his hosts of friends in all parts of the world, and for which he will be especially remembered. He was lucid, patient and encouraging to his students; generously helpful with his colleagues; modest and almost apologetic about his own achievements and honors. A gentle man and a lover of beauty, it was not unfitting that he should fall in a sunny field of flowers, walking upward toward a favourite grove of trees."

"Professor Nurkse was not just highly-rated by his students but also an economist of outstanding international renown. 
