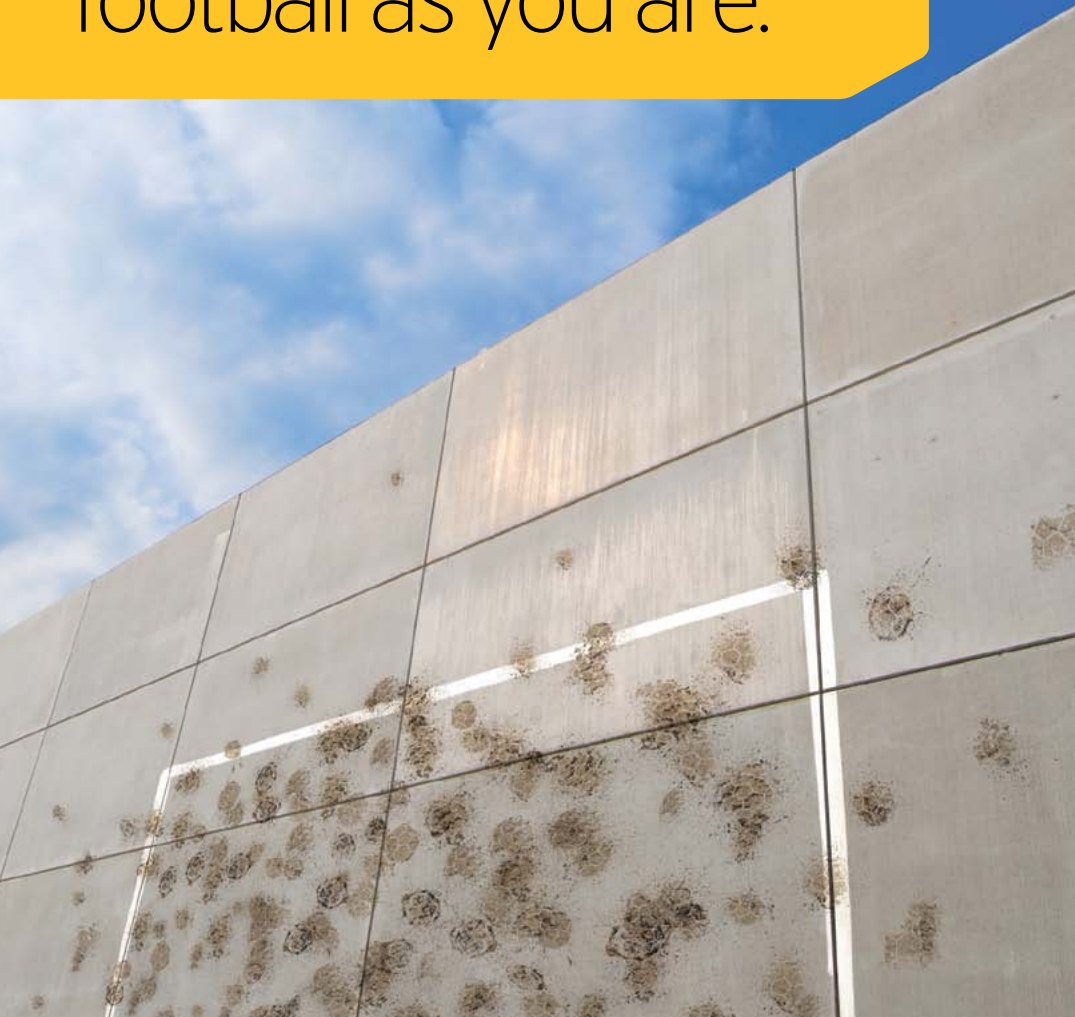

CEO'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the eighth season of the ASB Premiership, and the second with ASB as principle sponsor of the competition.

The ASB Premiership and its associated development competition, the ASB Youth League, continues to be a breeding ground for our national teams.

The likes of exciting age group players Andy Bevin, Tim Payne, Luke Adams, Nick Branch, Adam Thomas, Dakota Lucas, Sean Lovemore and Andrew Milne have come through the youth league to make their national league debuts in recent seasons and held their own internationally as part of New Zealand teams at the FIFA U-17 and U-20 World Cups earlier this year.

The security and stability afforded clubs has allowed teams to invest in youth and to the benefit of both themselves and New Zealand teams.

Established All Whites like Ivan Vicelich and David Mulligan continue to grace our competition among nine current or former New Zealand internationals and the cream of talent from our Oceanic neighbours.

The league also continues to be a springboard to professional environments and who knows which team this season will produce the next Chris Wood, Marco Rojas or Jake Gleeson – all of whom played national league in the early part of their ascent to the white shirt.

The fact that the current format of the national league has reached its eighth season is significant given it is the most stable and consistent since the early nineties and is helping the league reclaim a tradition that began with eight teams starting New Zealand sport's first national league back in 1970.

A number of individual milestones have been passed in the last two seasons with nine players making 100 or more appearances and four prolific marksmen hitting 50 or more goals.

Both elite clubs should be joined by a few more few seasoned campaigners this season.

We pay a huge thanks to the league's principle partner, and the game's greatest supporter, ASB who have lent their backing to all national competitions, including the ASB Premiership. They have also thrown their weight in at the grassroots, supporting the Whole of Football plan along with our other valued commercial partners: Nike, Volkswagen, McDonalds and Persil and key community partners like SPARC.

This season saw the introduction of the ASB Charity Cup – a new piece of silverware contested by the two best teams from the previous season. Auckland laid down a marker to their rivals with a 3-2 win over defending Premiership champions Waitakere out at Whenuapai.

This year the game benefitted White Ribbon, a campaign that offers men the chance to be part of the solution to end domestic violence.

The game, and commitment to the cause by NZF and both participating clubs, signals a new thread of social responsibility that will be woven into our competition and indeed our sport. The ASB Premiership can be at the forefront of that movement by helping its players become better footballers and role-models and it is something that New Zealand Football will work with our clubs to achieve.

Qualification for the OFC Champions League: Under its current format, New Zealand has two representatives in the OFC Champions League.

If New Zealand retains two positions, the ASB Premiership champion and the minor premiers will represent New Zealand in the 2011 Oceania Champions League. If the same team wins both titles, then the league runners-up will claim New Zealand's second O-League berth.

Transfer Window: The ASB Premiership's sole transfer window opens on Monday 23rd of January and closes at 4pm on Friday 27th of January.

OVERVIEW

There is a solid look to the Waitakere United squad named for the ASB Premiership as they look to defend their title.

Last season's golden boot winner Allan Pearce will again spearhead the attack, and with over 100 appearances and 52 goals in his playing career to date another strong season in front of goal could see the pacey wide-man take the outright lead in the all time scoring charts.

The majority of Pearce's teammates return for the campaign and there is a nice combination of experience and youth in the mix with battle hardened players such as Jake Butler, Jason Rowley, Aaron Scott, Martin Bullock and Chris Bale all returning.

While 17-year-old Luke Adams, who forced his way into first team contention last season, leads a group of talented youth players including Young All Whites teammates James Debenham, Bill Tuiloma and Jordan Vale. There is much interest surrounding Tuiloma who most recently spent time with the LA Galaxy in the USA.

Tim Payne and Dakota Lucas are named despite there being some uncertainty over their involvement – Payne is trialling at Blackburn Rovers in England, while Lucas has a transfer request with Team Wellington pending.

Waitakere have made a couple of useful gains with Ross McKenzie making a return to ASB Premiership action. McKenzie has previously had stints with Auckland City, Waikato FC, Otago United and Team Wellington.

COACH - Neil Emblen

Emblen returns for his third season in charge of the West Auckland club and is determined to succeed on both the ASB Premiership and O-League fronts in 2011-12. Also looming large for the former Wolves, Walsall, Crystal Palace, Millwall, Norwich and New Zealand Knights player is a qualification campaign for the London Olympics as he has been recently named as head coach for the U-23 national side. Emblen has also recently acted as a technical assistant in the All Whites camp.

PLAYER TO WATCH – Gagame Feni

Solomon Islands livewire Gagame Feni makes a move north from Canterbury United. Emblen has an embarrassment of riches at the attacking end of the pitch adding Feni to the already potent forward mix of Pearce, Roy Krishna, Sean Lovemore and Ryan de Vries. In his debut

season Feni netted just two goals from 15 appearances but proved a constant threat to opposing sides with his speed and trickery. There are hopes that the Waitakere environment will help Feni add maturity to his game the same way it benefitted countryman Benjamin Totori during his stint with the West Auckland club.

OVERVIEW

Auckland City have lost a raft of experienced players over the past few seasons but in 2011-12 they welcome centurion Chad Coombes back into the ASB Premiership after a year away in semi-professional football with Fleet Town in England. The versatile 28-year-old will be a welcome addition back at Kiwitea Street and look to build on his sole appearance for the All Whites against Mexico in 2010.

Another new face is free-scoring Argentinean Emiliano Tade who has been added from Team Wellington, following the same path that Luis Corrales took a year earlier. The Spanish influence continues at the club, with the resigning of Angel Berlanga, Manuel Exposito and Albert Riera and the addition of midfielder Andreu Guerao from Polish club Polonia Warsaw.

The 27 man squad named has a settled look, but new head coach Ramon Tribulietx will "keep the door open" for any last minute surprises, as they will fight on three fronts in 2011-12 season, contesting the ASB Premiership, O-League and FIFA Club World Cup.

New Zealand's most capped international Ivan Vichelich will lead Auckland, joined by fellow All White David Mulligan. Fringe All Whites Jacob Spoonley and James Pritchett are back again while David Koprivic will look to build on the form that saw him named as the O-League golden ball winner for best player.

Amongst the squad are Ian Hogg, Sam Campbell, Andrew Milne, Adam McGeorge and Alex Feneridis all still eligible for the Olympic side. U-17 hat-trick hero Stephen Carmichael has been named as one of five academy players along with national teammates Liam Anderson and Reece Lambert. Defender Simon Arms and promising forward Halili Nagime round out the young players nominated.

Stu Kelly, Adam Thomas and Riki van Steeden are the only notable losses from last year.

COACH – Ramon Tribulietx

Last season's successful co-coaching duo of Aaron McFarland and Ramon Tribulietx will have slightly different roles this season, with McFarland taking a Director of Football role and Tribulietx assuming the mantle as head coach. The pair will continue to work closely together in the reshuffle with Young All Whites coach McFarland ensuring there is a strong link between the first team and academy squads.

PLAYER TO WATCH – Manuel Exposito

Famed for making his Barcelona debut in the same match as Lionel Messi, Exposito burst onto the scene in the second half of the 2010-11 season after completing a transfer window move in the new year. Five goals in six matches confirmed his quality and there will be much expectation on the shoulders of the 29-year-old playmaker.

OVERVIEW

Waikato FC head coach Declan Edge has named a new look homegrown squad for the ASB Premiership with a dash of experience to settle youthful exuberance. In 2010-11 the bulk of the playing roster was made up of Auckland-based players, but the board is keen to promote local talent in the showpiece domestic competition.

Only Matteo Ballan, Jason Hicks and Mark Jones return from last season's campaign, while Waikato's most capped player David Samson returns from injury.

The core of the squad is made up of a talented crop of youngsters. Adam Thomas, who made his name with Auckland City is a major signing and was selected for the U-20 side that travelled to Colombia for the world cup. Similarly, Jesse Edge played in all of New Zealand's U-17 world cup matches in Mexico. Defenders Tyler Lisette and Jessie Smith return to the region after both were involved with Team Wellington last year. While Bay of Plenty product Mikey Kramer was also part of the U-20 set-up with Thomas and has impressed with Melville over the winter season.

Daniel Frischknect, Raymond How and Max Tommy are all rewarded for strong seasons for Hamilton Wanderers, and there is a strong Melville flavour to rest of the playing roster where all five academy players listed are products of Edge's own youth team at the club.

Edge has succeeded in securing the signature of 34-year-old Waikato stalwart Matt Williams in a move that will add sought-after steel to the young side. The former Auckland City player has joined Waikato for the upcoming ASB Premiership season, giving a young side a boost in experience and physicality.

Also returning is goalkeeper Mark Fulcher, the All Whites doctor was a member of the inaugural 2004-05 squad that made the playoffs the same year, Waikato's sole appearance to date. Meanwhile assistant coach Neil Moucher is also listed in the playing squad as cover for fellow custodians Fulcher and Tommy.

COACH – Declan Edge

Declan Edge had signed on as the youth team coach for the 2011-12 season, but after Dave Edmondson received an offer to coach in the W-League in Australia, he was promoted to

head coach and quickly started building a youthful squad to contest the ASB Premiership. Edge surprised many by guiding a largely no-name Waikato FC into the playoffs, together with co-coach with James Pamment, in the inaugural season.

PLAYER TO WATCH – Adam Thomas

After a breakout season with Auckland City in which he appeared in all but one match, much of Waikato's success will ride on the shoulders of Thomas. Edge has already handed the 20-year-old the captain's armband and versatility is also a hallmark of Thomas' game as he is able to fill in defence or attack, or anywhere in his favoured midfield role.

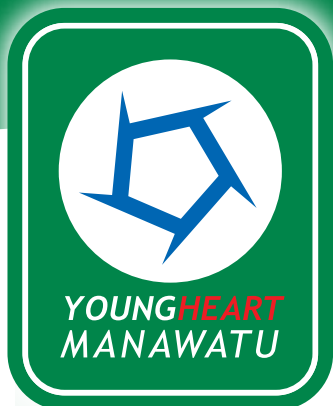

OVERVIEW

YoungHeart Manawatu hold the unenviable record of the recording the worst season in history with a miserable return of just four points in 2010-11. .

The key to success appears to be the rare talent of Vanuatu international Seule Soromon. The prolific marksman makes a welcome return to the ASB Premiership after a season out. However, his prominence on the domestic scene has not gone unnoticed after turning in star performances for Wairarapa United this year.

A raft of ASB Chatham Cup winning stars from Wairarapa join Soromon on the roster including goalkeeper Matt Borren, an ever-present for Manawatu in last season's campaign, Nathan Cooksley, Pablo Moya, Nobu Ishi and newcomer at this level, Fijian flyer Pita Rabo.

Also returning to action is Cory Chettleburgh who had a stint in Holland and more recently trialed with the Wellington Phoenix. Giant goalkeeper Rhys Keane is another who had A-League in his sights this season, the Australian-born former Junior All White has spent all his life in Australia and caught the eyes of both Melbourne clubs in the pre-season but was unsuccessful in securing a contract.

Adam Cowan's move to Hawke's Bay United means his experience will be difficult to replace having amassed 121 appearances at ASB Premiership level. Added to the playing losses are the evergreen Jason Hayne and Michael White, the pair contributed 10 goals between them last season.

COACH – Stu Jacobs

The only way is up for new coach Stu Jacobs who will no doubt try to bring the same sort of stability and consistency he enjoyed at Team Wellington where the team had its most successful period under his leadership. A raft of players with ASB Premiership experience return to Manawatu and together with Jacobs' nous they could be a dark horse to return to the playoff puzzle.

PLAYER TO WATCH – Seule Soromon

Last seen at ASB Premiership level in 2009-10 when he finished the season as golden boot winner with 11 goals for Manawatu. Soromon turned down a call-up to the Vanuatu national team to assist Wairarapa United in the ASB Chatham Cup, a decision which paid off with success in the final. A player of rare talent, he will no doubt light up the league again in 2011-12.

OVERVIEW

OVERVIEW

Canterbury United coach Keith Braithwaite took the unique step of placing an advertisement in a leading English non-league newspaper to source potential players for the ASB Premiership.

OVERVIEW

New Otago United coach Richard Murray has confirmed 20 players in his squad with a further five places to be filled. More than 35 players had been trialling and training for places in the squad over the past three weeks, some from as far afield as Christchurch, and Murray was pleased with the turnout.

There is a solid local look to the squad named by Murray with a core of Caversham and Dunedin Technical players who were again part of another long run by southern sides in this year's ASB Chatham Cup.

Former New Zealand youth international Michael Cunningham returns to the domestic mix after a successful time in the US College system, while former Canterbury United midfielder Darren Overton, together with home grown talents Tristan Prattley and Seamus Ryder will look to force themselves into contention for the Olympic squad with strong performances in the ASB Premiership.

Murray noted there were still some players returning from injuries that have not been considered at this stage, but they will come into the mix once they regain fitness. The rookie coach also acknowledged that Otago was playing catch-up given that most other ASB Premiership sides had already been training and playing pre-season matches.

COACH – Richard Murray

36-year-old schoolteacher Richard Murray replaces former coach Malcolm Fleming at the helm of Otago United for the 2011-12 ASB Premiership season. It has been a rapid rise through the ranks for Murray who earlier this year guided Caversham to the semi finals of the ASB Chatham Cup in his rookie season. Murray has coached junior representative teams and led the Otago youth team for the last two seasons.

PLAYER TO WATCH – Tristan Prattley

Left-sided defender Prattley rose to prominence in 2010 after earning a Yellow Fever Scholarship to train with the Wellington Phoenix in the lead-up to the 2010-11 season. Unfortunately he did not follow in the footsteps of All White Marco Rojas who famously secured a two-year contract with the A-League side after his trial a year earlier. However,

Prattley is still a consistent performer and permanent fixture in Otago United's ASB Premiership side since debuting in 2006. During this time he has amassed 45 appearances and looms as a possible member of the Olympic side.
