

In the second quarter, Godfree recovered a fumble by Dorsey on the Vol 16 but Tennessee held and took over on her 18. Feathers kicked out and Alabama soon started from the Vol 48 yard line and drove to the Tennessee 6. The Vols held and, on fourth down, Holley made a place kick for three points.

In the third quarter, Tennessee stopped another drive by Alabama that carried to her own 30 yard line. Frequent punting by both teams continued.

With Tennessee trailing and the time getting short, Robinson returned a punt 12 yards. Alabama held and then came the kick that 20,000 rain soaked spectators will never forget. Feathers kicked one that carried in the air to the Alabama 5 yard line. The ball bounced high and settled on the one yard line. The pass from center to Cain in punt formation was low, striking him on the knee. Cain rushed his punt and it traveled only 12 yards.

Middleton made 5 in two plays. Feathers went off his own left tackle to score untouched. Wynn kicked goal.

For the rest of the game, Alabama tried passes in a desperate effort to score but the Vols were too alert and successfully defended against them.

The play of both teams was magnificent and many spectators were heard to express the opinion that it was too bad that the game hadn't ended in a tie.

OCTOBER 22: Alabama, already crippled and losing Captain Cain on the opening kickoff, played sluggish football but won over Ole Miss on the campus by the score of 24 to 13.

The first quarter was scoreless. Ole Miss held the Tide three times deep in her own territory, once on the one yard line.

In the second quarter, Leach recovered Gunter's fumble on the Ole Miss 25. An offside penalty and a line plunge by Hughes carried to the 7 yard line where Hughes scored.

In the third period, Alabama started on her own 40. Cain, who had just come back in the game, made 9 and then ran off tackle, cut back and scored after a run of 51 yards.

Later, two 15 yard penalties against Alabama, a pass from Casper to Swor, and some short gains advanced the ball to the Tide 12 yard line. Earl Hudson, a fullback of the old school, scored in four plays. Turnbow kicked goal. Alabama 12, Ole Miss 7.

Bubber Walker returned the kickoff to his own 43, a run of 27 yards. After Hughes made 4, Walker drove off tackle for 53 yards and a touchdown.

In the final period, Alabama blocked an Ole Miss punt and Huppke recovered on the latter's 15 yard line. Walker then ran to the one yard line where Hughes scored.

Later, Haynes of Ole Miss intercepted a pass by Seawell on the Tide's 36. Alabama was penalized 15 yards. Haynes passed to Montgomery and Hutson went through the line for the score.

Godfree, Hewes and Kirkland did not play at all for Alabama because of injuries. Red Houston, center, was the star lineman of the day while Earl Hutson was outstanding for Ole Miss.

OCTOBER 29: With Cain out of the game with injuries and with Frey going out in the second period with a dislocated shoulder and with Bubber Walker carried helpless off the field in the fourth quarter with injuries, Alabama scored in the last period to defeat Kentucky in Lexington by the score of 12 to 7.

Holley fumbled the kickoff and Kentucky recovered. The Tide held and took over on her own 19. Chappell made 12. Holley went around right end for 60 yards to the Wildcat 10 and scored two plays later. Holley missed goal.

Later, Chappell fumbled a punt, Kreuter recovering on the Tide 19. Johnson hit center four times for a first down and then circled Alabama's left end to score. Davidson kicked goal.

In the second period, Kentucky stopped two Alabama drives in midfield and the half ended Kentucky 7, Alabama 6.

In the third period, neither team could advance the ball consistently but exchanges of punts and a penalty carried the ball to Alabama's 24 in Kentucky's possession as the period ended.

Captain Davidson's attempted place kick was wide. Starting from the Tide 20, Walker made 12 and then 5 more. Kentucky held and Hughes punted 60 yards over the Wildcat goal. Alabama held and Kentucky punted to the Tide 48. Walker carried the ball through the Wildcat line five consecutive times to the Kentucky 12. Two plays later, Holley scored on an end run.

Huppke, Godfree and Leach were stars for Alabama in the line and Holley, Hughes and Walker in the backfield. Ellis Johnson and Captain Davidson were outstanding for Kentucky.

NOVEMBER 5: In celebrating Homecoming before a crowd of 10,000, Alabama defeated the Gobblers of V. P. I. by the score of 9 to 6. Alabama gained five times as much yardage as her opponents, who presented a fine defense when her goal was threatened and twice held Alabama for downs within her 5 yard line.

Captain Cain did not start the game and his absence was keenly felt. When he entered the game in the second half, the Tide began to function. Millard Howell gave a sparkling exhibition of running and punting and convinced the crowd that in him the Tide had a real star for the future.

In the second quarter, Growth, fullback, intercepted a pass thrown by Chappell on the V. P. I. 35 and returned to the Alabama 20 yard line. Three plays failed and Mills passed to Casey for a touchdown. Mills kicked goal.

In the third period with Cain in the game, Alabama drove 63 yards only to be stopped cold. Howell punted to the Gobbler's one yard line. Alabama got a safety and two points when Casey ran out of bounds behind the goal line.

Casey then punted from his 20 yard line to the Tide 25. V. P. I. drew a 15 yard penalty. The Gobblers held as Porterfield stopped everything that Alabama had to offer. Howell again punted to Holley who returned to the Gobbler's 21. Walker and Howell made a first down. Howell ran to his right, cut back over tackle and scored. Holley kicked goal. Alabama 9, V. P. I. 7.

Porterfield at center for V. P. I. was one of the best centers ever to play on Denny Field while Grinus, tackle, also starred.



NOVEMBER 12: Alabama lost to Georgia Tech in Atlanta by the score of 6 to 0, when Galloway ran 75 yards for a touchdown.

For Alabama, it was a game of wasted opportunities as drive after drive failed. Alabama made 17 first downs to two for Tech but couldn't cross the last white line.

Dean fumbled the kickoff, Leach recovering for the Tide on the Tech 24. Line plays advanced the ball to Tech's 11. Three plays made 5 yards and Chappell's pass over the goal to Hughes was too high. Dean then punted to Tech's 43 and the Tide started again. Line plays and a pass, Chappell to Huston, carried to Tech's 20. Cain, hobbling from injuries, replaced Hughes. Chappell circled end for 11 yards but Alabama was penalized 25 yards. Cain kicked over the goal. A moment later, Galloway made his sensational run for 75 yards.

Alabama returned the kickoff to Tech's 45 and drove to Tech's 14 as the quarter ended.

Alabama drove to Tech's 8 only to lose the ball on downs. Dean punted to midfield and Alabama marched to Tech's 35 where they were penalized 15 yards for holding.

In the third period, Alabama marched 45 yards deep into Tech territory but a pass from Howell to Cain was knocked down. The Tide threatened all during the quarter, which ended with the ball in Alabama's possession on Tech's 44 yard line.

In the early part of the fourth period, Alabama drove to Tech's 7 yard line. The chain was brought in for measurements. Three times these measurements were made and three times the officials decided that Alabama had made a first down. On the fourth measurement, one of the Tech players called the attention of one of the officials to the way the head lineman was holding the chain. On this fourth measurement, Tech was given the ball.

The game ended a few minutes later after Dean punted to midfield.

NOVEMBER 24: Vanderbilt came to Birmingham with the hope and expectation of winning and ending her first undefeated football season in 10 years. They had just tied the great Tennessee team, which had beaten Alabama. The Tide had just been beaten by Georgia Tech and John Cain was in bad shape.

But Vanderbilt was disappointed as 18,000 saw Alabama dominate the play as a hard charging line throttled every Vandy effort. The Tide won by the score of 20 to 0.

Vandy returned the kickoff to her 38. A run from a fake punt formation gained 28 yards. Howell, playing defensive left halfback, intercepted Henderson's pass and returned to the Tide 24. Alabama then gained on punt exchanges as Howell kicked brilliantly. Running plays advanced the ball to the Vandy 17 where Alabama lost the ball on downs.

In the second period, with the ball on his own 46, Howell lost 14 yards as he tried to find a pass receiver open. He then punted to Vandy's 19. On the next play, Fortune fumbled and Dildy recovered for Alabama on the 16 yard line. On an offside penalty against Vandy and a series of plays, Cain scored and Holley converted.

Later, Holley intercepted a pass and returned to Vandy's 40. Howell passed to Leach for 15 yards. Cain made 7 and Howell 8. Howell passed to Gandy over the goal for a touchdown. Goal was missed.

In the third period, Moseley of Alabama fumbled and Vandy recovered on the Tide 12. Alabama held and the ball went over when Moseley batted down a pass in the end zone.

In the fourth period, Holley fumbled and Vandy recovered on the Tide 30. Roberts threw a pass which Howell intercepted and ran 80 yards for a touchdown. Holley kicked goal.

Cain and Howell were the backfield stars for Alabama. Ralph Gandy was the star end of the day. He stopped Roberts, who had averaged over 100 yards per game for the season, time and again on his runs around end from punt formation. Lee, tackle, was also outstanding.

Captain Beasley was the star for Vanderbilt.

DECEMBER 3: Captain John Cain, playing only a part of the game because of injuries, ended his football career at Alabama by scoring the only touchdown of the game to defeat St. Mary's Gaels in San Francisco by the score of 6 to 0.

The fans had hardly settled in their seats before the winning score was made. It was Alabama's ball on her own 19 yard line. Cain went off right tackle, cut to his left, shaking off three Gael tacklers. Two other tacklers dived at him but he dodged them and ran across for a touchdown. Moseley's try for point was wide.

The Gaels had the better of the argument in the second period as they drove to the Tide 18 yard line on a sustained attack following Brovelli's interception of a pass thrown by Howell. But Baird of the Gaels fumbled on the 9 yard line and Alabama recovered.

The last half was hard fought and played on about even terms. Near the end of the game, the Gaels, trying desperately to score, fumbled and Alabama recovered.

Ralph Gandy sustained a fractured cheek and was taken to the hospital.
