

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT, ENGLAND AND WALES
CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS**

(a) constitutes 8 new parishes in the District of New Forest, viz. the Parishes of Hordle, Lympington and Pennington, Milford-on-Sea and New Milton in the area of the former borough of Lympington and the Parishes of Brockenhurst, Ellingham, Harbridge and Ibsley, Hyde and Sandleheath;

(b) effects other transfers as between parishes.

The maps forming part of this Note (pages 10 and 11) show (a) the existing parishes, and (b) the 8 new parishes and the principal other transfers. This map also incorporates a grid identifying the maps referred to in the Order.

The approximate area, population and rateable value of the new parishes will be—

The New Forest (Parishes) Order 1979

Made - - - - - 14th February 1979

Coming into Operation—

Whereas the District Council of New Forest, under section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals in relation to parishes in the district;

And whereas the said Commission, under sections 47 and 51(1) of the said Act, made such proposals to the Secretary of State for the Environment:

Now therefore the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the New Forest (Parishes) Order 1979.

2.—(1) 1st March 1979 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purposes set out in regulation 4(1) (Coming into operation of order) of the Regulations as modified by paragraph (2).

For all other purposes this order shall come into operation on the appointed day.

(2) In the said regulation 4(1), item (e) shall not apply in relation to the constitution of any new parish council.

Interpretation

3. In this order—

“the appointed day” means 1st April 1979;
 “the county” means the County of Hampshire;
 “the district” means the District of New Forest, and “the district council” means the council of the district;
 “new parish” means a parish constituted by this order;

"new parish council" means a parish council established by this order;

"new parish ward" means a parish ward formed by this order;

"the Regulations" means the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(a) as amended by the Local Government Area Changes (Amendment) Regulations 1978(b); and

"Schedule 1" and "Schedule 2" mean Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 to this order.

The maps

4. In this order—

"the boundary maps" means the 22 maps printed for Her Majesty's Stationery Office by Ordnance Survey each such map being marked

"Map referred to in the New Forest (Parishes) Order 1979" and with the number of the map; and

any reference to a numbered boundary map is a reference to the map described and numbered as aforesaid.

Changes in areas

5.—(1) Eight new parishes to be known by the names specified in column (1) of Schedule 1 shall be constituted, such parishes consisting of the areas specified in respect thereof in column (2) and remaining or forming part of the electoral divisions of the county and wards of the district specified in respect thereof or of the wards thereof in columns (5) and (6) and of the Western coroner's district. The Parishes of Brockenhurst, Hordle, Lymington and Pennington, Milford-on-Sea and New Milton shall remain or form part of the Lymington, petty sessional division. The Parishes of Ellingham, Harbridge and Ibsley, Hyde and Sandleheath shall remain or form part of the Ringwood petty sessional division.

(2) The parts of parishes described in column (1) of Schedule 2 and marked on the boundary maps as specified in column (2) shall, in so far as parishes, wards thereof, electoral divisions of the county, wards of the district and petty sessional divisions are specified in respect thereof in columns (3) to (7), be transferred to or form part of such areas.

(3) The Brockenhurst and Rhinefield ward of the district shall be re-named and is in this order referred to as the Brockenhurst ward.

(4) In the changes effected by the preceding paragraphs the Parishes of Brockenhurst, Ellingham, Harbridge and Ibsley and Rhinefield shall cease to exist.

Parish authorities

6.—(1) The common parish councils of Brockenhurst with Rhinefield and Ellingham, Harbridge and Ibsley and the Parish Meetings and Parish Trustees of Brockenhurst, Ellingham, Harbridge and Ibsley and Rhinefield shall be dissolved.

(2) There shall be a parish council for each new parish.

(3) As from 7th May 1979—


(a) the new parishes of Brockenhurst, Lymington and Pennington and New Milton shall be divided into the parish wards named in respect of the areas transferred in column (3) of Schedule 1 such wards consisting of the areas

(d) the number of parish councillors for the Fordingbridge and Godshill ~~Parish~~ ^{area} of the Parish of Fordingbridge shall be 10 and 2 respectively.

(d) the number of parish councillors for the Fordingbridge and Godalming wards of the Parish of Fordingbridge shall be 10 and 2 respectively;

(4) The annual meeting of each new parish council for 1979 shall be convened by the Officer appointed for that purpose by the district council.

Councillors of new parishes

Commissioners of Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs
7.—(1) (a) Sub-paragraphs (b) and (c) shall have effect from the appointed day to 7th May 1979.

(b) Any person in office immediately before the appointed day in any office described in column (1) of the following table shall be a councillor of the new parish specified in respect thereof in column (2).

(c) The parish council for the Parish of Hordle, Hyde, Lymington and Pennington, Milford-on-Sea, New Milton or Sandiheath shall consist of the district councillors for the wards wholly or partly comprising the area of the parish.

(2) New parish councillors of the new parishes shall be elected on 3rd May 1979. The persons elected shall come into office on 7th May 1979 and shall on the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1983.


Parish meetings

8.—(1) The first assembly of the parish meeting for any new parish shall be convened by the officer appointed for that purpose by the district council.

(2) At any such first assembly held before the annual meeting of the parish council of the parish the parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair, and that person shall have, for the purposes of that meeting, the powers and authority of the chairman.

Residuary successors

9. In relation to any authority named in column (1) of the following table, for the purposes of any provision of the Regulations which refers to the residuary successor of a dissolved authority, the parish council specified in respect of the first-mentioned authority in column (2) is hereby specified as the residuary successor of that authority.

Charter trustees

10. In respect of the town of Lymington, the Parish Council of Lymington and Pennington is hereby specified in relation to paragraph (2) of regulation 12 (Dissolution of charter trustees) of the Regulations.

The said parish council shall at the request of the Parish Council of Hordle, Milford-on-Sea or New Milton consider with such parish council whether any property transferred by regulation 12 of the Regulations to the Parish Council of Lymington and Pennington, and liabilities incurred, contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments subsisting, notices given, actions and proceedings pending and causes of action or proceeding existing in relation thereto, should be transferred to such other parish council.

Parish books, etc.

11. The public books, writings and papers of the Parishes of Brockenhurst and Rhinefield (including any photographic copies thereof) and all documents directed by law to be kept therewith shall be deposited in the custody of the Parish Council of Brockenhurst.

Expenses of new parish councils

12. In the year beginning on the appointed day the district council shall levy rates in each new parish named in column (1) of the following table and make payments to the new parish council as if the new parish council had issued a precept to the district council requiring the payment of a sum equal to the product of a rate of the amount in the pound, calculated on the total rateable value as set out in the valuation list on the appointed day, specified in respect of the parish in column (2).

14. Any provision in relation to inhabitants or parishioners in force in respect of any cemetery maintained by the common parish council of Brockenhurst with Rhinefield shall apply to the inhabitants or parishioners of the Parish of Brockenhurst.
