





# Corn and Black Bean Salad

# **Ingredients: (4-6 Servings)** Seasonings:

2 cups corn kernel

1 can (15oz) black bean

1 avocado

2 tomatoes

1 tbsp. cranberry sauce

1 pack corn tortilla

2 tbsp. lemon juice Some black pepper

1 tsp. salt 2 tsp. sesame oil

1 tsp. cloves

1 tsp. cumin

1 tbsp. fruit vinegar

1 tbsp. olive oil

# **Instructions:**

- 1. Boil the corn kernel until it's well done and set aside.
- 2. Boil the black beans in water for about 5 to 7 minutes then
- 3. Peel the avocado skins off and cut into big chunks. Dice the tomatoes into little cubes.
- 4. Prepare a large bowl or container to mix in all the ingredients and seasonings.

Stir the ingredients well and it's ready to be served as is or on a plate with corn tortilla.





Saving the world, one square foot at a time —

# Jo Ann Carey, square foot gardening expert

After reading Mel Bartholomew's book "All New Square Foot Gardening: Grow More in Less Space," Temple City resident and computer consultant Jo Ann Carey decided to expand on her passion for gardening and became an expert on square foot gardening.

She is involved in all this while also single-handedly raising her granddaughter, Louisianna, a junior at Temple City High School,

In a square-foot garden, seeds are planted in squares instead of rows, maximizing space. Using string or bamboo dowels, gardeners map out a planting grid in raised beds in any shape from four-by-four to two-by-six and so on. Square foot gardening uses only 20% of the land space of a conventional garden and saves both water and time. There is no tilling of the soil so anyone can do it.

Ms. Carey will teach students from beginners to practiced green thumbs on the benefits of square foot gardening, with lessons on setup, planting, watering, growing vertically, pest control and harvesting. This method is well-suited to seniors because the beds can be elevated to eliminate squatting.

"Even people in wheelchairs can do it," she says. "Just put it on a sawhorse and drill holes in the plywood base."

A year ago, Ms. Carey led a team of volunteers in building a vegetable garden on the roof of the Union Rescue Mission in Downtown LA. Thirty-two raised boxes were built, all in one day, and one year later it is thriving, producing healthy, organic vegetables for the URM kitchen.

Carey said gardening is a positive way for people to take charge of their lives.

She said she is "always encouraging people to be more involved in life." Her Web site is www.squareftgardens4u.com and she is working on a second Web site about better living which she expects to have operational by this time next month.

In addition to her one-on-one or private garden consultations, Carey teaches regular Square Foot Gardening classes at the Los Angeles County Arboretum & Botanical Garden (301 N. Baldwin Ave., Arcadia.) The next class is 10 a.m. - 1 p.m. Saturday, July 21, in the Arboretum's Garden For All Seasons. The cost is \$25 for members and \$28 nonmembers. For more information, phone 626-821-4623.

# Jossing With Jamie

Three months ago I introduced two one-mile routes to help readers start jogging. Now that you've gotten in the running groove, here is a longer route, roughly five miles past five schools. Keep in mind

that it will require crossing streets, though all major intersections mentioned have lights and crosswalks. Be careful and wear bright clothing.

- 1. Beginning at the cul-de-sac behind the high school, run a "schooler," a one-mile loop that takes you around the high school. Start from the cul-de-sac behind the school on Oak Avenue and run clockwise. The dirt track is softer than concrete and easier on the joints. Instead of finishing the loop, turn left at Oak Avenue.
- 2. Continue down Oak Avenue, past Longden Elementary and past the post office, until you reach Las Tunas Drive.
- 3. Take a left on Las Tunas and enjoy the storefronts until you reach Temple City Park and Golden

- 4. Turn right and continue south on Golden West Avenue, a pleasant street to run on because it has sidewalks and less traffic.
- 5. When you reach Olive Street, turn right and continue down across Temple City Boulevard until you reach Cloverly Avenue.
- 6. Turn right and continue north on Cloverly, past Cloverly Elementary and St. Luke's School.
- 7. When you reach Las Tunas, turn left and at Oak Avenue, turn right. Continue north until you are back where you started.


