(11) Asher Yatzar needs to be recited for each time one uses the washroom. Washing each hand three times alternating between the right hand and the left is only necessary the first time one washes after sleeping or when washing after Alos Hashachar.

Key: Rosh – Main reason to wash one's hands after sleeping at night is because one's hands generally touch unclean parts of the body when sleeping. Therefore, one prepares for Krias Shema or Tefilla (Shemoneh Esrei) by cleansing the hands through washing. Rashba - Main reason to wash one's hands after sleeping at night is because one awakes refreshed like a new person. Therefore, one washes in preparation for serving Hashem like a Kohen who washes from the Laver (Kiyor) before he serves in the Beis Hamikdash. Even one who didn't sleep that night is required to wash and recite Al Netillas Yadayim. If one recites Al Netillas Yadayim with Birchos Hashachar then it doesn't have to be immediately after washing. "Using washroom" is either after defecating or passing water and wiping oneself whereby hands come into contact with unclean things. According to Shulchan Aruch Harav, touching unclean parts of one's body will itself necessitate one to wash for Krias Shema and Tefilla according to the Rosh.
